

## **MILESTONE MAN**

Knights halfback Mitchell Pearce feeling the love ahead of game 300, writes PAUL JOBBER

ITCHELL Pearce has felt the love this week ahead of his 300th first grade game.

But he also hasn't thought too much about becoming only the 42nd player in NRL history to achieve the feat when the Knights host the Wests Tigers on Sunday.

Instead, he is grateful the sport has allowed him to do what he loves for so long.

"It's a nice feeling to come in this week and feel the love that everyone gives you when you reach these sorts of milestones," he told The Front Row.

"More than anything I'm just grateful to have been able to do what I love for so long and physically be on the field as much as I have been and be able to push myself and my teammates.

"That's what I love to do."

The 31-year-old was hopeful of playing forever and conceded his longevity and resilience in the game could be attributed to his parents.

"Mum and dad have definitely been my biggest supporters ever since I was a kid and rugby league gave my family so much growing up through what dad did with the game," he said.

"I've been able to get so much out of rugby league as well so I'll be forever grateful."

Pearce has signed a one-year-contract extension keeping him at the Knights until the end of 2022 and he hasn't ruled out chasing Cameron Smith's record for the most games ever.

But he is well aware his form on the field will have a significant impact on how much longer he can continue playing.

"I love it just as much and I'm just as motivated and want to train just as much as I ever have," he said.

"As long as I can keep playing good footy for my teammates I'll be playing for as long as I can as long as I'm getting contracts.

"I'll focus on this year first and if I can get a good season in you never know."

The Knights halfback will hope history repeats from a previous milestone match against the Tigers – a club father Wayne spent his entire career at.

In game 150, a younger Pearce helped orchestrate a 56-14 demolition while at the Roosters.

"It's funny ... there might be something in that," he said.

"My 150th was against the Tigers and now my 300th so it's all a bit too coincidental to be normal and there might be something a bit deeper in it.

"It should be a special day for everyone."

Pearce and the Knights will look to claim their first triple-win start to a season for the first time since 2015 on Sunday.

"We've started the year well and it was a really gritty win last week and a good all round performance in round one in the wet," Pearce said.

"It will be nice to have a dry track too but if it's not to be we know how to handle that as well and I'm looking forward to running out in front of a home crowd alongside my teammates again."

Now in his 15th season in the NRL, Pearce said his best advice for teenage prodigies such as Joseph Suaalii was to keep learning.

"Enjoy the moment, because it goes pretty quick," he said.

"It's a real rollercoaster; every player will tell you that so you've got to enjoy the rollercoaster and all the highs and lows.

"It's all part of it."



## RAIN, HAIL OR SHINE.

It's more than a game, writes The Inner Sanctum's VICTORIA GARRY

ew South Wales has recorded record-breaking rain levels across the week seeing homes evacuated and roads flooded however, rugby league stops for nothing.

Round 2 of the NRL Telstra Premiership saw five games take place in Sydney suffering a terrible downpour of rain which saw little stoppage across the four days.

Thursday night footy kicked off with the Parramatta Eels taking on the Melbourne Storm at Bankwest Stadium in Parramatta.

Saturday afternoon consisted of the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs and Penrith Panthers also at Bankwest and Manly Sea Eagles and South Sydney Rabbitohs going head to head at Lottoland.

Sunday afternoon footy was widespread across Sydney with the Wests Tigers hosting the Sydney Roosters at Campbelltown Stadium and the Cronulla Sharks battling the Canberra Raiders at Netsrata Jubilee Stadium.

Overall, in the terrible conditions, 27,948 fans battled through the torrential rain across the 5 stadiums to watch their teams go head to head out on the field.

This is no surprise though. For some fans, they didn't even hesitate.

Ella Kasmar, one of the diehard Manly Sea Eagles faithful, threw on her gumboots and raincoat to watch her team from the mudslide that the hill had become.

"Not going didn't even cross my mind, really." She said.

Kasmar, who has been a fan since birth and sat through many poor conditioned games, couldn't help but find the comedy in the situation.

"It was a pretty funny experience. The hill, as you'd imagine, was so muddy so no one could even sit down. I saw a couple of people bring plastic shopping bags to sit on though. The amount of people I saw slip in the mud down the hill became comical," she said.

"But with COVID protocols, we weren't allowed to leave the hill and access the grandstands so when it poured no one was allowed to seek shelter – we just had to cop it!"

Rugby league fans have been bearing the brunt of bad weather for as long as the game can recall.

Cast your mind back to the infamous "Sharknado" game of 2015. Fans showed up wearing full snorkeling gear while the players appeared to be swimming across the field.

It's in the blood of a rugby league fan. If their team is playing in the rain, they're cheering in the rain.

The 2020 season scared many fans of the game. For the first time, we saw what it was like to lose the game and lose the chance to watch live footy.

Some fans were lucky enough to still attend most games once the crowds were allowed to return however, some only attended one or two and some weren't able to attend any.

Subconsciously, the 2020 season will affect how rugby league fans view the game for years to come now.

"I think I took having the ability to choose to go for granted and now I've been to a game every week, and look on track to stay that way for a while," Kasmar concluded.

Matty Bowerman, a St George Illawarra die-hard, copped the downpour in Parramatta on Thursday night with mates James "Baz" Bosnich and Alex Ward - two Bulldogs and Rabbitohs fans - because they could.

"It was an occasion for us. We bonded as mates over footy and couldn't wait to catch up and have a laugh, regardless of the game on," he said.

"Thursday night at Bankwest was great. It made it all the more enjoyable to be out in the wet, having a laugh with the boys."

Elliott Richardson and his dad Sean also watched on in the wet on Thursday night, as they have many times before.

"It's not the first time I've been in the rain, and it won't be the last," he said.

"I don't plan on missing a game because of the weather. Literally, the only things that have stopped me in the past four seasons from going to games have been a global pandemic, my honeymoon, and the birth of my son." Richardson said

"Part of being a fan is turning up rain, hail or shine."

No fan is a "better" fan just because they opted to attend the game rather than staying home but rather, it's an indication of what this game means to the fans.

The phrase "it's just a game" doesn't fly for fans sitting in the sopping wet with soggy socks and dripping hair.

For so many rugby league fans, this game provides happiness, comfortability, excitement, even a sense of community and belonging.

There is no way to explain that feeling of watching the team you love play.

Sure, there can be moments of frustration and disappointment too but nothing can beat the feeling of leaving the stands after your team wins.

That's why rugby league fans will continue to travel long distances for games. They will continue to cancel plans to attend games. They will continue to suffer through sitting in the rain.

After all, as Cronulla Sharks diehard Anthony Kaltsas simply put it:

"It's only water."



## **Match Preview**

#### with Tim Costello

Grand Final re-match highlights contrasting fortunes

While there might conjecture in the mind of former Panthers boss Phil Gould about who won the 2020 decider at Stadium Australia five months ago, there's no doubt that the Melbourne Storm have the Provan-Summons Trophy firmly in their cabinet at AAMI Park.

Similarly, there's little doubt Penrith are full of passion and commitment to go one better in 2021 and wrestle that title away from their Victorian rivals.

And that's where Thursday's big Grand Final re-match comes in. Two rounds into the new season and the Panthers are unbeaten from both starts - although admittedly they've only faced lowly North Queensland and Canterbury. Still - an impressive fortnight of performances means they're yet to concede a single point through their inpenetrable defensive line.

By contrast Melbourne had a fast start against South Sydney in Round 1, before their opponents came back with fervour. They held on to win - but weren't as lucky a week later when Parramatta overcame them with a late try.

For all Penrith's defending, they need to find more points. 24-0 and 28-0 are solid results and not worth scoffing at, but coach Ivan Cleary will probably be wanting a little more with ball-in-hand from the Mountain Men this week.

Melbourne's issue is clearly closing out a contest and playing the full 80 minutes. Granted, they're still missing some key forwards and their bench depth is looking paper-thin at the moment, but they've also had formidable opponents to contest with.

In team news the Panthers are unchanged after losing Api Koroisau the day of their contest with Canterbury - he was replaced at hooker by Mitch Kenny on the day, and it is Kenny who'll don the 9 this week. On Wednesday morning the club then confirmed halfback Nathan Cleary would miss the match as a precaution following concussion concerns in Saturday's win over Canterbury.

Melbourne have had some forced changes. Felise Kaufusi's suspension for dangerous contact in last week's loss to the Eels means Tom Eisenhuth earns promotion to the starting back row, while Tyson Smoothy drops off the bench, allowing Nicho Hynes to come in. Aaron Pene is also named on the interchange. On Wednesday afternoon the club also confirmed the omission of Ryan Papenhuyzen, which will present challenges at the back for the visitors.

Who to watch: Penrith centre **Stephen Crichton** was a tryscoring revelation in his breakout season last year, but so far in two rounds is yet to trouble the goalline with ball in hand. He'll be hungry not only for a four-pointer (or two), but to exact revenge on the Storm for last year's Grand Final loss.

His opposite number **Justin Olam** has had no such trouble, bagging four-pointers in each of the Storm's matches so far. Superb on inside balls and an imposing figure on Melbourne's right edge, Olam should keep Penrith's edge defence very busy - but they'll also need to watch him coming back toward the centre of the field too.

Favourite: Despite the home-ground advantage and 2-0 start, the Panthers losing Nathan Cleary 36 hours from kickoff means Melbourne go in as favourites, although the omission of Ryan Papenhuyzen means the Storm are only favoured by a slim margin.

My tip: With key players missing from both sides, I'm leaning toward the Storm. They'll be fired up after being pipped late by Parramatta last week, and should be able to better account for their missing star. It'll be bloody close though. Melbourne by 2.

Halfback battle the key as Dragons and Sea Eagles face off

For the time being though the Dragons are riding on a high and Griffin has named the same 17 to take on a desperate Manly outfit.

Daly Cherry-Evans has always been the leader at Manly but now he is facing increasing scrutiny after a poor performance last week. The Sea Eagles lacked direction and intent inside the South Sydney red zone and needed their experienced halfback to lead from the front. It is not all on DCE but his kicking options, admittedly in the wet, were not his best.

With a weakened forward pack, Manly will need Cherry-Evans to better dictate terms with his long-range kicking game.

2020 battlers face off in crucial clash

It may only be Round 3 but Saturday's match up between the Brisbane Broncos and the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs already shapes as a must-win for both teams.

Losing their opening two fixtures, facing a difficult run of upcoming matches, and boasting new coaches desperate to put numbers on the board, the respective teams will need to rise above their lowly standings in order to remain in finals contention.

Sitting in 12th position with a -20 differential, the Brisbane Broncos will be desperate to break through for their first win since July last year - incidentally against the Bulldogs at Suncorp Stadium.

Currently in the midst of a 13 match losing streak, where they have finished within four points on just a single occasion, the reigning wooden spooners will be determined to make amends for a disappointing performance in last week's 28-16 loss to the Titans.

Suffering from an inability to play for 80 minutes, coach Kevin Walters has retained the same squad in a show of faith towards under fire playmakers Anthony Milford and Brodie Croft.

Languishing in 14th place after conceding 60 points in their first two matches, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be aiming to put aside a dismal showing in the wet during last Saturday's 28-0 shutout to the Panthers.

Holding a dreadful record at Suncorp Stadium with two wins from 13 visits over the past decade, coach Trent Barrett will be stressing the importance of execution with and without the ball following 36 missed tackles and 11 errors on average over the first two rounds.

Set to be without try-scoring forward Raymond Faitala-Mariner for an indefinite period, former Storm back rower Joe Stimson will make his return from shoulder surgery, while Tui Katoa comes into the backline in place of suspended flyer Dallin Watene-Zelezniak.

Who to watch: Showing plenty of attacking promise over the opening fortnight of the season, young centre Tesi Niu will be hoping to record only his second win in first grade. Handed a brutal initiation to the NRL during last year's record loss to the Roosters, the 19-year-old has been earmarked for big things after representing Tonga two years ago at the behest of the senior playing group. Averaging over 120 metres with the ball in hand, Niu can expect plenty of traffic in defence, following five missed tackles against the Titans, but will be sure to bring plenty of energy as part of a youthful right side attack.

As the only current Bulldogs player to taste victory over the Broncos at Suncorp Stadium, Josh Jackson will be drawing upon his experience to guide the new-look blue and white's to victory. Entering his tenth season in the top grade as an undisputed club stalwart, the 30-year-old second-rower has made a strong start to life as a lock forward with 55 tackles on average to start the season. Encapsulating the celebrated Canterbury spirit with a remarkable try-saving tackle in the corresponding fixture two years ago, expect Jackson to play with a similar intensity on Saturday evening.

Favourite: While clashes between the two sides have been closely-fought with five wins apiece since 2015, the home ground advantage has the Broncos favoured to emerge with the two points.

My tip: Picking a winner out of two teams with success rates under 14 per cent since the start of last season is a difficult task. If Brisbane can recapture the attacking form displayed in the first half against Parramatta they should get the job done - whether they can is an entirely different story. **Broncos by 6**.

Giant killing Eels host luckless Sharks

Not satisfied with the biggest scalp in the competition, Eels coach Brad Arthur said his side must repeat the dose every week if it is to challenge for titles like the Melbourne Storm.

It's a big ask after only two rounds, and one that should stir the Sharks. With only a 45 per cent share of possession, not many sides would have got close to Melbourne last week, let alone pinch it from under their nose like Maika Sivo did.

In a weekend of contrasting fortunes, everything Clint Gutherson touched kept Melbourne at bay, while at Kogarah, a touch of luck off the tee would have seen Cronulla upset the Raiders. For the middle of the road Sharks, it was another case of letting the big boys off the hook.

Still burned by the stigma of sneaking into last season's finals without a top-8 scalp, John Morris knows his side isn't far away. The Sharks commitment in defence against the Raiders was undone by 18 handling errors, but with Sydney's big wet expected to ease, the best of Matt Moylan and the likes of William Kennedy might not be far away.

In team news, Parramatta's Marata Niukore retains his place at centre in the absence of the injured Waga Blake, while hard running back-rower Isaiah Papali'i will start for Ryan Matterson who failed last week's HIA.

And set for his first appearance of the season, Ray Stone has been named on the

For the Sharks, Connor Tracey has been chosen in place of centre Mawene Hiroti, while utility forward Teig Wilton will suit up in the No.14.

In recent seasons, Parramatta has held the upper hand winning six of the past eight including last year's slog in the wettest match of the season. In what will be their first clash at Bankwest, Cronulla fans have every right to feel confident given their side has defeated the Eels in two of the last four clashes.

Who to watch: Junior Paulo's thundering charges are hard to miss but from close range, the 123kg beast is proving even harder to stop. Opening the season with just 9 tries from 154 appearances, the wrecking-ball has fired out of the blocks scoring two from two - the first time he's troubled the scorers twice in a season since 2016.

Now running off the rapidly improving Reed Mahoney, the mere presence of Paulo alone is bound to have the Sharks' goal line defence sweating bullets.

Cronulla's answer to Paulo is Braden Hamlin-Uele. Although eight kilograms lighter than the Eels prop, the Sharks big man still bends the line and with six tries last season is just as dangerous from close range. Averaging 72m in the opening two rounds, the Kiwi's output is almost 30m down on the past two seasons. So in what promises to be a clash of the demolition men, look for Hamlin-Uele to raise the bar.

Favourite: On home turf, Parramatta are strongly favoured to extend their perfect start to three wins.

My tip: Parramatta are the obvious tip in this one, but the physical and mental toll of the Storm clash shouldn't be underestimated. Records show that following each of their past five matches with Melbourne, the Eels have backed up the next week with a loss.

That said, Cronulla's recent record against the better sides in the competition is poor and they'll need to improve their handling to stand a chance. In a high scoring affair, look for the home side to edge clear just before the final bell sounds. Eels by 4.

Contrasting fortunes meet in Pearce's 300th

The Newcastle Knights will be looking to continue their unbeaten start to the season when they host the winless Wests Tigers at McDonald Jones Stadium.

Sitting in 4th position following two promising wins to open the season, the Newcastle Knights will have plenty to play for as halfback Mitchell Pearce brings up 300 appearances in the NRL.

Coming from behind to snatch a 20-16 victory over the Warriors last week, coach Adam O'Brien will be hoping his side can open a season with three straight wins for only the sixth time in history.

Starting the year with strong results in set completions (88%), offloads (24) and line breaks (10), the Knights have been especially disciplined conceding just four penalties and missing the fewest number of tackles (35).

Regaining the services of Kurt Mann at five-eighth after recovering from bone bruising sustained in the opening round, forward Brodie Jones has retained his place on the interchange despite failing to see any game time last week.

Backing up a disappointing opening round showing with an embarrassing performance at home last week, the Wests Tigers will be approaching Sunday afternoon as a win-at-all-costs fixture.

Outclassed in every facet of the game during last week's 40-6 loss to the Roosters, coach Michael Maguire will be demanding greater accountability and execution from his players as they stare down the prospect of starting a year with three straight losses for only the second time in history.

Holding a strong record a McDonald Jones Stadium in recent years with three wins from their past four visits, the joint venture will need to drastically improve in both areas of the game after missing 69 tackles and scoring the equal fewest number of tries.

Who to watch: Set to become the 42nd member of the 300 club on Sunday afternoon, Newcastle halfback Mitchell Pearce will be looking to mark his milestone match with a win. Debuting for the Roosters at age 17 in 2007, the 31-year-old has enjoyed a storied career littered with the highs of premiership glory and the lows of multiple off-field indiscretions. Beginning the season in fine form with two try-assists and a forced restart, Pearce has revelled against the Tigers throughout his career winning 16 out of 22 clashes.

## **Match Preview**

Queensland Derby II: Electric Boogaloo kicks off in Townsville on Sunday night. The sparkling Gold Coast Titans travel to face the downtrodden North Queensland Cowboys, aiming to repent and take down the big spenders.

After their big sparkling entrance which ended up damper than Billy Idol at the 2003 Grand Final, the Gold Coast Titans got their first win of the new era against the embattled Brisbane Broncos. It was a showcase for former Bronco, David Fifita, who scored twice and gave a glimpse of the season ahead for the Titans.

Both Fifita and Tino Fa'asuamaleaui were tops in their win and will bring consistent effort but the Titans scored all their points through their forward and interchange players last Friday night. Time for the backline to get involved including cult hero Anthony Don who was their top try-scorer in 2020.

Fullback AJ Brimson is a livewire who is always likely to cut open the defense and might run riot against a Cowboys defense that has leaked 49 points in their two losses. Gold Coast Titans will also want to strengthen their claim as Queensland's top team by taking down their northern neighbours to round out Round 3.

The rugby league crisis wheel has spun out to Townsville. Two weeks in the Todd Payten era, there is plenty of riddles for the coach to answer. He questioned Jason Taumalolo who then got injured and post Round 2 said his side "let them off the hook" and need to play with a smile. Key to that is engaging his major playmakers.

It was telling that most of the Cowboys points last weekend came through individual brilliance (Holmes and Granville) and an early leap from Coen Hess. The Cowboys have been in the muck since the retirement of Johnathan Thurston in their search for their next halves. Michael Morgan has been injured and out of form compounded with Scott Drinkwater and Jake Clifford not performing.

Payten will need to rouse a performance similar to those he drew from the Warriors late in 2020 despite their challenges to motivate this Cowboys side. Starting 0 from 3 will make it tough for them to challenge for the top eight and make them prime contenders for the spoon.

So the Queensland derby which always has a bit of spice, might have a whole second serving piled on with the conditions facing both sides if they were unable to fashion a win on the weekend. It would be fatal for the Cowboys and a regression to the mean for the tuned up Titans.

Who to watch: It is more three players to watch for North Queensland. Scott Drinkwater, Jake Clifford and Michael Morgan all did their best impression of Casper in the second half against St George Illawarra. All three will be challenged by coach Todd Payten to grab the game by the scruff of the neck and produce more than 20 points.

Morgan especially as the senior member of the spine needs to stamp his authority on the contest and bring back his form which helped them to the 2017 Grand Final. Drinkwater showed in the back end of 2020 he has the talent but hasn't lived up to his expectations so another dud performance will hear the calls for Val Holmes to take his spot grow louder.

For the Gold Coast Titans, with the possible absence of Ash Taylor, a lot of the playmaking will fall on the shoulders of **Jamal Fogarty** with Tanah Boyd alongside him in the #6. Fogarty had a breakthrough 2020 season and now needs to take the next step for the Titans to leap into the top eight. He will take a lot of the kicking duties and look to pin back the Cowboys back three then turn maestro in attack.

Favourite: Coming off their first local derby result of the season, the Titans will be full of energy and ready to heap more misery on the Cowboys.

My tip: The Titans looked much more settled against the Broncos. Their pack should dominate which allows their playmakers to score enough points. **Titans by 12**.

#### Eels weather the Storm at home

Gaining the ascendancy with a style of play bellying the conditions, a flat pass from Reed Mahoney sent Junior Paulo (67th minute) crashing over to break the deadlock.

Taking advantage of an ill-fated intercept attempt from Blake Ferguson, the Storm responded with Ryan Papenhuyzen's ricochet kick allowing Justin Olam (73rd minute) to crash over for his second try of 2021.

With the match seemingly headed for golden point after Papenhuyzen locked the scores up at 12-all, an inspired piece of play saw Sivo (77th minute) leap above George Jennings to seal the result with his second of the night.

While the final result, Kaufusi's tackle and a potential sternum injury to Asofa-Solomona will leave the visitors with much to lament, the match also marked a milestone for Melbourne captain Jesse Bromwich who played his 250th NRL game, becoming only the sixth Storm player to achieve the milestone.

#### Fifita's double delight as Titans devastate Broncos

The first instalment of the South East Queensland Derby between the Gold Coast Titans and Brisbane Broncos for 2021 has ended with 'little brother' the Titans getting the spoils winning 28-16 at CBUS Stadium tonight.

Former Bronco turned Titan David Fifita was almost predictably the star scoring two trademark tries to give the home side the ascendency, which provided his side with their first win in 2021. Despite some stand out performances by a number of Titans players, the Gold Coast will still need to improve their completion rate if they are to compete with the top sides this season.

The Broncos were in the match early but simply fell apart in devastating fashion ten minutes before halftime, where last year's Wooden Spooners let in three successive tries. Despite a huge effort from Broncos firebrand Tevita Pangai to try and get his side back in the contest, the amount of unforced handling errors at crucial times would be alarming for Kevin Walters and his coaching staff moving forward.

All the pre-match talk revolved around big money Titans signing Fifita coming up against his former club, however it was former Bronco Jarrod Wallace who flipped the script when he crashed over for the first try following a neat short pass from Mitch Rein at dummy half. Jamal Fogarty converted and the home side led 6-0 after 20 minutes.

Brisbane to their credit hit back almost immediately, when halfback Brodie Croft kicked high for his wingman in Xavier Coates who leapt high and offloaded in the one motion to find Tesi Niu, who did amazingly well to plant the ball over the stripe despite the attention of Titans winger Corey Thompson. Jamayne Isaako failed to convert from out wide and the Titans lead was narrowed to 6-4.

Crucial back-to-back handling errors from both Coates and Isaako then cost the Broncos big time, when David Fifita crashed over for his first try. After managing to get a good run on the back of a scrum, the giant 20-year-old swatted away former teammates Anthony Milford and Tesi Niu to score and extend the lead to 10-4.

The Broncos ghosts of the season past then returned as they simply capitulated prior to halftime following the Fifita try, letting in back-to-back tries firstly to Titans utility Erin Clark which was swiftly followed by prop Jaimin Jolliffe who scored his first try in the NRL off a neat pass from dummy half off Clark and all of the sudden it was 22-4 at the break.

David Fifita continued his dream run against the Broncos when play resumed, with the giant backrower again running straight through Milford and Niu's corridor down the left-hand side to crash over for his second try. Fogarty converted and it was 28-4.

Brisbane then tried to claw their way back into the match, when Tesi Niu looked to all but certain to score after making a break to the corner post but the ball was then stripped by AJ Brimson. Fortunately for the Broncos the ball was ruled to have gone back by the Bunker and Xavier Coates grounded the ball for a try. Isaako's conversion narrowed the score to 28-10 with less than 20 minutes remaining.

While the comeback never gained momentum, Broncos prop Tevita Pangai managed to crash over late for a consolation try late to narrow the defeat to 28-16 for the visitors in what was ultimately another disappointing night for Brisbane fans.

The Titans now make the trip north to Townsville next weekend for another Queensland derby when they face the Cowboys next Sunday.

Brisbane now return to Suncorp Stadium where they will face the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs as they look to register their first win of the season in front of their home fans.

The Penrith Panthers have improved to 2-0 after easily accounting for an average Bulldogs side by 28 points at a very wet Bankwest Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The game started with both sides looking relatively competitive, with Penrith scoring a try in the opening 5 minutes through Kikau, however a dry spell followed as a stalemate ensued for the next 35 minutes. The Bulldogs looked to have gotten on the board courtesy of an exciting passage of play that started in Watene-Zelezniak retrieving a midfield bomb and ended with a pinpoint kick from Nick Cotric to find Corey Allan, however further inspection from the bunker revealed a knock on at the very start of the play.

Canterbury's defence did well to hold strong for most of the first half, however Penrith crossed the line with about 2 minutes to go. Jarome Luai scampered around the field before realising that he was out of options and put in a superb grubber to find Tyrone May. The Panthers went into the sheds with a 10 point lead.

The opening stages of the second half played out much the same as the bulk of the first,

with both sides failing to capitalise on ample opportunity and the Bulldogs defence bending but never breaking. However, Kikau eventually got over in the 59th minute, a try which didn't open the floodgates, but they definitely started leaking. Mitch Kenny put aside a period in which he made 2 simple errors in about 5 minutes to execute a dummy from dummy half which was bought by the Bulldogs and allowed Kenny to put Kikau over for his second.

The Bulldogs finally got their first penalty of 2021 in the 70th minute of their second game, however were unable to capitalise on the field position as Kyle Flanagan's grubber went straight to Nathan Cleary, who sprinted 50 metres downfield before a high shot from Dallin Watene-Zelezniak landed Cleary in the HIA ward and DWZ in the sin bin.

Penrith took full advantage of the opportunity to attack against 12 men. Tyrone May grubbered and Nick Cotric made a rare mistake at the back, failing to take possession and Momirovski was there to score his first try as a Panther. 5 minutes later, it was Momirovski scoring again, this time through a solo effort that involved him beating 4 or 5 Bulldogs defenders.

The win for Penrith means they are the first side to ever not concede a point in the first two weeks of the season.
