



# ROLES TO PLAY

WHY THE "VOICE FOR MINING ROUND" IS IMPORTANT TO THE KNIGHTS

IF Danny Buderus was going down a mine shaft, he'd want Kurt Gidley there right alongside him.

They now have different roles, but they are well aware of the importance of this Sunday's Voice for Mining round clash with St George Illawarra.

Gidley led the Knights out in their inaugural mining round clash in 2014.

Buderus is the club's general manager of football, while Gidley is now the business development manager at labour hire firm ProTech.

But Gidley is still more than aware of who the team are representing whenever they pull on their hi-vis jerseys. "You're representing more than just the Newcastle Knights supporters, you're representing everyone who wears their hi-vis to work every day," Gidley said.

His father Geoff drove coal trains between Narrabri and the Port of Newcastle for almost 30 years while his brother Adam also worked in rail for a decade.

The connection to those hi-vis colours during his playing days was strong.

"My dad worked in the industry and I had a lot of mates and former teammates who worked within mining," he said.

"I always wanted to play tough and be resilient like those people who work within the industry.





Current players such as five-eighth Blake Green – who will make his return from a knee reconstruction in Sunday's clash – also know of the underlying meaning of the fixture.

"I've had a few friends who once they finished playing footy had been a little bit lost at times and it's been the mining industry that's put their hand out to help them and give them some direction in life," he said.

"They've been so grateful for it; it's given them a big boost and provided them with a career."

Not only will the clash with the Dragons be the club's annual Voice For Mining round fixture, it will be for the Alex McKinnon Cup. Buderus admitted the team were looking forward to a much-improved effort after last Sunday's error-riddled loss to Wests Tigers.

"It was disappointing at the weekend there's no doubt after the big occasion and 300 games for Mitchell, but that's rugby league," he said.

"You learn your lessons and move on pretty quickly and prepare for the next game.

"Being a footy player you sometimes don't reach the heights you expect as a team and individually you're keen to get back out there.

"It's no different for our boys."

# REFLECTING ON ARIVALRY

THERE'S NOTHING QUITE LIKE THE RABBITOHS AND ROOSTERS RIVALRY

Rugby League's oldest and fiercest rivalry is in the midst of one of its most dynamic eras in generations.

Formed just a week apart, the South Sydney Rabbitohs and Sydney Roosters are the only two remaining clubs playing at the Rugby League's top level in Australia and the rivalry remains as strong as it did in 1908 when the Rabbitohs claimed a two-point victory over their rivals in the Grand Final.

The infamous Book of Feuds commissioned by Russell Crowe in 2008 details the Rabbitohs' rivalries between all clubs, is often thrown down like a gauntlet in the modern era to emphasise the importance of a match to the club, and there is no match up that carries the same weight as a game against the Roosters.

The Inner Sanctum spoke to long time Roosters supporter Dean Kelly on his perspective of the rivalry, and how hard it is to describe to outsiders.

"There's something different from this rivalry, it's hard to describe it. Maybe it's because everyone is neighbours so to speak, there's just that day to day interaction and these matches mean a hell of a lot.

"There's nothing like it in League, I know there are big rivalries like Canterbury and Parramatta for example but with all due respect to those guys, they don't have the heritage that these two clubs here do.

"From a Roosters perspective they do mean a hell of a lot and maybe they mean more than we show on the outside because I can speak for myself on the inside, I get a kick out of seeing Souths lose."

The two clubs have fought against one another but remained together throughout Rugby League's history in Australia. Both clubs decided to remain in the ARL rather than moving over to the Super League in 1997.

When it was looking like South Sydney would be removed from the NRL, Kelly recalled that despite the two clubs' disdain for one another Roosters fans got behind the petitions and rallies for the Rabbitohs.

"I remember Souths fans at Roosters home games in '98 and '99 asking for signatures on their petitions about the NRL criteria and I know personally, Roosters fans who marched with South Sydney fans when South Sydney were expelled from the competition.

"Even though we crack wise, and make no mistake I genuinely dislike Souths, there is still human decency involved"

Over the years the Rabbitohs and Roosters have had several players switch between the two clubs, the most notable faces in recent years has been Souths Fullback Latrell Mitchell and Sydney halfback Luke Keary.

With fans often lamenting about players transferring to their main rival rather than going to another club with the

capital to pay for the contract many of these players' skill demands.

Because of this attention will be on Mitchell and Keary's performances every time they face their former clubs to cement the fact that they are the best in the league in their respective positions.

It wasn't until 2005, three years after South Sydney returned to the competition that the Rabbitohs managed to beat the Roosters 17-16, a match burned into the memories of Souths and Roosters fans alike.

It was a loss that eventually had to come, but Kelly remembers it as a turning point that turned the rivalry into an even contest once more.

"We had taken Souths for granted presuming you guys would always be there, we'll always be here. That was taken away, so it was definitely fun when you came back.

"But 2005 was really important. It was deflating, it felt embarrassing.

"A different sense of embarrassment to the final round defeat last year, but we've also put some scores on you guys as well it's not a good feeling.

"It was a real turning point because I think that really stimulated South Sydney, far beyond just the night. "From memory, it was a wet night, towards the end of the season, so Souths weren't going to make the finals. It hurt us we didn't make the finals that year. So I think that was the turning point about 'okay so Souths are slowly getting their act together... interesting.'

"So I think it was the turning point because it went from you're an easy two wins each year, to they're getting their act together, we've got to get ours together."

Since 2008 the rivalry has morphed into a genuine contest between the two clubs with South Sydney winning nine and the Roosters winning 12 of the 21 games the clubs have played against one another.

In premiership years both clubs have been hurdles for one another during the finals series and it is only a matter of time before the Roosters and Rabbitohs play one another in a Grand Final for the first time since 1935. In 1937 South Sydney were the runners up to Sydney's premiership, however, there was no Grand Final.

Both teams are well within the premiership window and hungry to take the top prize in 2021 and nothing would be sweeter to down their old foe in a Grand Final for the ages.

# **Match Preview**

Complete mismatch looms between ladder leaders and cellar dwellers.

Fresh off an embarrassing 38-12 loss to the Dragons, the Sea Eagles will be desperate to turn their fortunes around – but with the table-topping Panthers in town their misery only looks set to drag on.

It has become a painful weekly chore for Manly fans – going onto the club website at 4pm on Tuesday afternoons only to find they have wasted their time. Another heavy defeat and once again Des Hasler has refused to ring in the changes or at least make any real effort to set standards. The Dylan Walker fullback experiment will stubbornly extend into its fourth week but fortunately for Sea Eagles fans this looks like the final instalment, at least for the time being.

They say that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over again while expecting different results – but I don't think that is how Hasler got his reputation as the NRL's mad scientist. But with little resilience in defence and complete ineptitude in attack without Tom Trbojevic, Manly fans will be hoping for some sort of a miracle on Thursday night.

The last time the Panthers came to Brookvale Charlie Staines ran in a first-half double as Penrith stormed to a 42-12 win. Dylan Edwards was missing on that night too – he will be sidelined for at least the next month with a broken hand. Former Sea Eagles hooker Apisai Koroisau was running around then though, reminding Manly just what they had been missing but he won't be there this time around so at least that is one less source of pain for the Lottoland faithful.

Stephen Crichton moves to fullback to cover for Edwards while Matt Burton shifts to the centres. It should not have too much of a bearing on Thursday's result though given Penrith were able to score a last-gasp win over the defending premiers last week all while playing the entire second half with just one member of their first-choice spine. In any case, the opportunity for Crichton to shine in a new position and Burton to get more first-grade experience should add a much-needed injection of energy to this Panthers line-up. After all, having exacted revenge on Melbourne last week there is bound to be a drop-off in intensity this time around. But with Nathan Cleary back to steer the team around it should not be too noticeable.

Who to watch: While injuries are never ideal, the silver lining from Manly's thinning options in the back row is the emergence of **Josh Schuster**. While he has a background in the halves, Schuster impressed last week on the edge with 133 running metres, three tackle busts and a try assist. Manly have lacked any real potency out wide but with Schuster there, who both runs a strong line and has a slick passing game, he could open up new opportunities in attack.

Meanwhile, Manly are the exact kind of team that **Viliame Kikau** could single-handedly tear apart. The Sea Eagles have looked vulnerable all over the park in defence and Kikau is already hard enough to defend as is. But both Nathan Cleary and Jarome Luai have come up with new ways to get the most out of their destructive second rower, giving him early ball or playing it back on an angle. It adds a degree of unpredictability to Penrith's use of Kikau and will make him a handful for an already fragile defensive team like Manly.

Favourite: No surprise here - it is the Panthers comfortably.

My tip: Don't be surprised if Manly are within one or two tries of Penrith by halftime before falling away late. Look for the Panthers to do this comfortably without exiting second gear. **Penrith by 20**.

# **Match Preview**

Broncos look to cause Good Friday miracle against Storm

The Storm and the Broncos have both started the year with 1 win and 2 losses, with Brisbane actually sitting above Melbourne on the NRL ladder courtesy of a 2-point superiority in for and against.

While the teams may be close on the table, they are worlds apart in expectation, regarding both the outcome of Friday night's game as well as premiership aspirations later this year.

Last week, the Storm looked to have done enough to cause a repeat of the 2020 Grand Final result against the Penrith Panthers, having led for pretty much the whole match, before allowing Kurt Capewell to burst through and score the matchwinner. It means that they are facing the prospect of losing 3 of their first 4 matches, something not experienced by the Storm since 2008.

In stark contrast to the Storm game, which many considered to be an early contender for game of the year, the Broncos outlasted fellow battlers the Bulldogs to eventually run away with a 24-0 victory. In an error riddled first half, the Broncos led 2-0 at the break, before the deadlock was finally broken by Jamayne Isaako in the 58th minute.

The unfortunate resurgence on COVID-19 in Brisbane has overshadowed this match, with relocation from Melbourne still a slim possibility at the time of writing. It has to be said the Broncos would gain whatever advantage came from such a move, boasting a dismal recent record 2 wins and 8 losses at Aami Park since 2011.

In team news, the Storm will be bolstered by the return of star fullback Ryan Papenhuyzen. His inclusion forces Nicholas Hynes out of the 17, while Christian Welch will line up for his 100th NRL appearance.

For the Broncos, they are unchanged in the backline and halves, however, receive a huge boost up front with the return of Payne Haas, who missed the first 3 games of the year with suspension. His return means Tom Flegler will move back to the bench, while Matt Lodge has also been named to return from injury and has forced Pangai Junior to the interchange. Ethan Bullemor and Tom Dearden have been left out of the 17 as a result.

Who to watch: It's been intriguing watching Brandon Smith play in his preferred position of hooker throughout the opening rounds this year with Harry Grant sidelined with an injury. Smith has been the subject of much speculation regarding his contract and has made it no secret he would like to be the starting hooker for a team. He started off well against the Rabbitohs, however didn't have his best game against the Eels in Round 2. He rebounded well last week, making a line break, 4 tackle breaks and scoring a try of his own as well as making 34 tackles (3 missed). Smith will also want to work towards playing a full 80 minutes at hooker, something he is yet to achieve in 2021.

Broncos' fullback Jamayne Isaako reminded the Rugby League world what he's capable of last week, making 18 runs for 202 metres as well as 2-line breaks, 4 tackle breaks, a line break assist, try assist while also scoring a try of his own. Isaako, much like the rest of the Broncos team, was subject to much instability last year, failing to nail down the position of fullback and at times finding himself out of the starting side. He will be keen to further solidify his place as the Broncos starting fullback and can do so with another strong performance against Melbourne on Friday night.

Favourite: The Storm are favoured by a whopping total of 20 points over the Broncos for the one.

My tip: While it was good to see the Broncos finally play some respectable footy after clicking into gear late last week, the Storm are about 4 or 5 steps up from the Bulldogs and will do the job comfortably on Good Friday. Melbourne by 22.

Sharks kick off Easter double header against Cowboys

The Cronulla Sharks and the North Queensland Cowboys will be looking to put aside difficult starts to 2021 when they face off at Netstrata Jubilee Stadium on Saturday evening.

Coming off an unprecedented performance which saw the side play the entire second half without any replacements, the Cronulla Sharks will be looking to bounce back at 'home'.

Going down to the Eels 28-4 last Saturday in a result that failed to represent the closeness of the match, coach John Morris will be hoping the latest COVID-19 outbreak in Queensland galvanises his side back to an equal win-loss record.

Winning 9 of their past 11 matches against North Queensland, including both fixtures contested last season, Saturday's fixture has been shifted from Sunshine Coast Stadium to Kogarah as part of a double-header featuring the Titans and Raiders on the second half of the twin bill.

Fielding several new faces with Sione Katoa (knee) and Briton Nikora (suspension) unavailable, Mawene Hiroti earns a recall in the backline while Teig Wilton will start in the second row for the first time in his career. Braydon Trindall is the new man on the bench with Andrew Fifita once again relegated to the extended squad.

Producing a diabolical performance on home soil last Sunday to remain winless after three rounds, the North Queensland Cowboys will be desperate to silence their critics with a strong showing on the field.

Conceding seven tries in a 44-8 thumping at the hands of the Titans, coach Todd Payten has responded by making a number of changes throughout the playing ranks in a show of making his players accountable for their performances.

Dropping Jake Clifford and Esan Marsters for form and losing Mitchell Dunn and Reuben Cotter with injury, Ben Hampton, Connelly Lemuelu, Shane Wright and Ben Condon will all make their first appearances of the season.

Coen Hess will become the 29th player to reach 100 appearances in first grade for North Oueensland.

Who to watch: Marking two years since debuting in first grade for the Sharks, fullback Will Kennedy has gone from strength-to-strength under the coaching of John Morris. Named to play despite being one of three players ruled out with concussion last week, the 23-year-old Bathurst junior has been in dynamic touch with three tries, three forced drop-outs and a try-assist over the opening three rounds. Developing his skills as a ball player since making the number one jersey his own midway through 2020, look for Kennedy to be especially potent in the event the Sharks pack down for a scrum in attacking range.

Taking aim at the Cowboys' soft underbelly' in the aftermath of last week's demoralising loss, veteran forward **Josh McGuire** will be looking to back up his words by leading from the front. Accusing the side of lacking resilience and effort in the face of adversity, the 31-year-old Australian and Queensland representative has averaged a little over 100 metres and 27 tackles per game this season. Known for his aggressive style of play that has been known to cross the line in the past, the Cowboys will need McGuire to play a leading role if they hope to avoid starting a season with four straight losses for the first time since 2002.

Favourite: Winning every match against the Cowboys during John Morris' coaching tenure, the Sharks are expected to extend that trend on Saturday evening.

My tip: While results may have gone against the Sharks over the past fortnight, the resilience shown by the men in black, white and blue should be too much for the Cowboys to overcome. **Cronulla by 18**.

Titanic test awaits as Raiders come to town\* (in Sydney)

The Gold Coast Titans will put their credentials to the test on Saturday evening when they 'host' the Canberra Raiders at Netstrata Jubilee Stadium.

Coming into the season with high expectations following an impressive recruitment drive and two wins over the first three rounds, the Gold Coast Titans will be looking to gauge their standing in the NRL hierarchy against one of the premiership heavyweights.

Piling on plenty of points during last Sunday's 44-8 demolition of the Cowboys, coach Justin Holbrook will be hoping his side can break a run of four straight losses against the Raiders where they have been outscored by a combined 40.113

Forced to temporarily relocate to Sydney following a COVID-19 outbreak in Queensland, the Titans will feature on the second half of Saturday's twin bill featuring the Sharks and Cowboys earlier in the evening.

Retaining the same squad that thrived in Townsville six days earlier, Tyrone Peachey has been named to start ahead of Moeaki Fotuaika as was the case last week.

Showing tremendous resilience only to be dealt the cruellest of defeats last week, the Canberra Raiders will be out to rebound by continuing a dominant run of form over their opponents.

Winning six of their past seven clashes against the Titans, coach Ricky Stuart will be hoping for greater luck with injuries after being forced to play with a one-man bench for much of last Saturday's 34-31 loss to the Warriors.

Forced into changes after Joseph Tapine (ankle) and Curtis Scott (ribs) sustained injuries during play, Hudson Young and Dunamis Lui return after being late omissions last week, while Seb Kris and former Titans captain Ryan James will need to pass concussion protocols in order to take the field.

Who to watch: Having been headhunted by the Titans on one of the largest contracts ever offered by the club, marquee second rower David Fifita will need to deliver on his price tag on Saturday evening. Bouncing back from a quiet debut with dominant showings against the lowly Broncos and Cowboys, the 21-year-old Queenslander will face fiercer opposition when the highly regarded Raiders come to town (in Sydney). Capable of destroying teams with his athleticism and strength, Fifita will be vitally important in the Titans' bid to claim the scalp of a premiership contender.

Beginning his first grade career with the Titans while still a teenager in 2008, Raiders wingman Jordan Rapana will be hoping to overcome a lean run of tries in recent times. Gaining a reputation as a try-scoring specialist after being handed a first grade lifeline by Ricky Stuart, the 31-year-old New Zealand and Cook Islands international has crossed the stripe only four times since the start of last season. Coming agonisingly close to scoring the winning four-pointer last week, only to be denied by Roger Tuivasa-Sheck's heroic tackle, Rapana will have his sights set on making amends and earning a new deal in the process.

Favourite: Having developed a formidable reputation over the past two seasons, the Raiders have been preferred ahead of the league's new improvers.

My tip: The Gold Coast are a team on the rise; but coming up against a side like Canberra is a big step up from the likes of Brisbane and North Queensland. Canberra by 10.

Stuttering Knights host surging Dragons

The Knights were heavily backed to roll the Tigers last Sunday and join the premiership pacesetters at the top of the table with three consecutive victories. In Mitchell Pearce's 300th everything pointed towards an extended celebration until woeful hands forced Newcastle to chase their tail. A late rally had the locals on edge, but in the end with 18 errors and a 67 per cent completion rate, the Knights got what they deserved.

The loss of Bradman Best until at least round 5 knocked Newcastle off its axis. In the Origin hopeful's absence the Knights' re-positioned edges resembled a bumbling comedy where between them, Dominic Young and Gehamat Shibasaki combined for six errors, the last proving to be the final nail in the coffin.

Back on home turf for the third time in four starts, even with the composed Blake Green named on the bench, Newcastle can ill afford to turn up with their hands in their pockets. # **Match Preview**

A Sunday night contest could become the focus of the Rugby League world as two future stars potentially debut for an injury depleted Sydney Roosters side as they host the New Zealand Warriors at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

Dominant during the opening two rounds of the competition after wins over Manly the Wests Tigers, the Roosters were quite a step below South Sydney last Friday, even before injuries struck late in the match. An opening half of errors and ill-discipline hurt the Tricolours significantly, costing them field position and meaning they were having to defend a South Sydney side that looked red-hot. The Bunnies were able to run out to a 24-0 lead just after the half-time break before they put the cue in the rack for the night, which allowed the Roosters to add some respectability to the scoreboard. Although, the margin of defeat for the Roosters was only 10 points, it flattered them, given that they were only able to able to score late in the match with two tries in the final seven minutes to bring the score back to 26-16.

Despite the poor performance, three major injuries would have caused the most headaches for coach Trent Robinson - a serious concussion to Lindsay Collins as well as series knee injury to Lachlan Lam and a season-ending ACL rupture for Luke Keary. Potential superstar Sam Walker has been named to make his NRL debut at halfback in Lam's place, whilst Drew Hutchinson moves from the interchange to the starting line-up at five-eighth for Keary. In better news, the home side are boosted by the return of Victor Radley at lock. A potential debut for boom rookie Joseph Suaalii could have to wait, with a contract issue set to sideline the 17-year-old for at least another week.

The Warriors fortunes could not have been more different, having pulled off one the biggest comebacks in recent years when they came from 31-10 down to score a remarkable and controversial 34-31 victory over Canberra in the Australian capital last weekend. Dominated throughout the first half, the Warriors opened the scoring early in the contest before the Raiders started to take control and the visiting side were a step below the 'Green Machine' in the contest, their defence easily split by some strong Raiders attack. A fast start for the Warriors in the second half gave them an outside hope of making a comeback, however when the Raiders hit back just five minutes later, it looked to have extinguished any hopes of the comeback. However, a mounting injury toll came to haunt the Raiders after losing three players during the half, meaning that there was just one player on the bench and fatigue began to set in. The Warriors had half an hour to overturn a 21-point margin and they were able to do just that. The win wasn't without controversy, with a forward pass missed by officials in the lead up to a Ben Murdoch-Masila try. The Warriors took the lead back in the 78th minute and had a nervous wait in the 80th minute as the bunker reviewed a Canberra error which upheld a no-try live decision.

# **Match Preview**

#### with Lachy MacCorquodale

The unbeaten Eels look to extend their unbeaten start to the season as they host the Wests Tigers on Easter Monday.

After a convincing win over the Cronulla Sutherland Sharks, the Parramatta Eels are expecting to their fourth successive game to start the season. Currently in second place, the Eels will have the luxury of a returning Ryan Matterson who will face his former club on Easter Monday. Matterson missed the last game with a concussion, but it hardly mattered as the Eels romped the Sharks by 24-points.

It was a dominant performance from the Eels as they held possession for 61 per cent off the time as the accumulated an incredible 2,398 run metres, an incredible 965 more than their opposition. Seven of the Eels forwards surpassed 100 run metres as did all five of their outside backs which included Clint Gutherson running for an incredible 284 run metres.

This has been something that the Eels have excelled in during the first three rounds this season, averaging 1,948 run metres per game, 100 metres higher than the next best Panthers. Matterson's return is another boost for his side's metreage who tallied 117 metres during their Round one clash with Brisbane. As a result, PapaliI moves back to the interchange despite his impressive start to the season with Keegan Hipgrave dropping out of the 17. Mitchell Moses will be on watch during the week after leaving the field with concussion on Saturday night.

Meanwhile, their opponents, the Wests Tigers recorded their first win on Sunday afternoon with a four-point victory of the previously unbeaten Newcastle Knights. It was a great response after their two lacklustre performances over the course of the first two rounds which included a 34-point loss to the Sydney Roosters in Round two. It was surprisingly the first time since 2007 that the club had lost it's opening two games and Michael Maguire will be relieved that the losing streak didn't continue as they face the Eels this week and the South Sydney Rabbitohs in two weeks' time.

The Tigers' two halves, Adam Doueihi and Luke Brooks put in their best performances of the season, both recording a try assist and tallying three and two votes in the Dally M's respectively. More of the same will need to come from these two if they are to come away with any points on Monday afternoon. A big stat for the Tigers was just their eight errors, which came after a combined 24 errors in their opening two games. If they can manage to limit their errors and get their forwards such as Luciano Leilua and Stefano Utoikamanu some space, they could be in for a sniff.

After their morale-boosting weekend, Michael Maguire has named an unchanged line up for the Easter Monday clash.

Who to watch: It's another interesting battle between the two fullbacks this Monday with the New South Wales Origin representative Clint Gutherson lining up against the 21-year-old Daine Laurie. Gutherson has been ever-so reliable to start the 2021 season and has been influential in their three victories. A try, try assist and 196 run metres per game is what he brings to the table from a numbers point of view, but it is the try saving efforts such as the efforts against Melbourne that really showcase his worth. One of the hardest working fullbacks in the game could have a field day against this inexperienced Tigers outfit.

**Daine Laurie**, just six games into his NRL career, has been one of the few highlights of the Tigers 2021 season so far. The rookie has averaged 146 run metres whilst breaking an impressive 18 tackles in just three matches. He has yet to cross the try line in his NRL career but did provide his side with a try assist in their hard-fought victory on Sunday afternoon. He's got a tough task ahead of him, organising the Tigers' defence against a rampant Eels forward park but the youngster won't shy away from the challenge.

Favourite: The Eels enter this match as the favourites after their impressive start to the season. Also working in their favour is their recent history against the Tigers, which has them winning seven of the last eight encounters against the joint venture. This exact fixture in 2018 is the last time the Tigers came away with the two-points against the Eels.

My tip: The Tigers are going to have a tough afternoon trying to contain this rampant Eels side. If they manage to play similarly to the way they did on Sunday, they could compete with the Eels for parts of the game. But it's their lack of ability when it comes to competition for the full 80 minutes that will most likely cost them on Monday as it did against the Raiders. The Eels should be too strong to stop.
