



## FEAR FACTOR

### CAPEWELL SAYS RUTHLESS PANTHERS CAN STILL IMPROVE THEIR DEFENCE

PENRITH are focused on creating a defensive line to be feared.

That's enough to send shivers down the spine of most of the Telstra Premiership as the Panthers prepare to face the Raiders on Friday night. "If you can have good defence it can slow things up for you and it's going well at the moment."

Quietly-spoken fullback Stephen Crichton will have an important role to play in organising the defensive line on Friday night.

Ivan Cleary's men have only leaked 16 points in four games – but they're certainly not content with averaging a measly four points per game.

They know defence wins premierships and secondrower Kurt Capewell admitted during the week that opponents would soon think twice about taking them on.

That's if they weren't already taking notice of the Panthers' lofty perch on top of the ladder.

"Having blokes like 'Fish' (James Fisher-Harris) coming out of the line at you, they hit with a bit of force." he said.

"We just want to be really reliable and consistent in our defence and I think what we're doing so far is working well so we'll continue with that."

The Queensland State of Origin representative couldn't attribute their steely resolve without the football to anything specific in the pre-season.

"The more you do it the better you're going to get and with the rule changes, everything is a lot faster," he said.

Despite the absence of Dylan Edwards, Capewell was confident his replacement was up to the job after an impressive performance last week.

"It's a pretty big role in a footy team these days (because) fullbacks organise a lot of the defence and then they've got to be on in attack," the second-rower said.

"I think he handled the pressure really well last week."

While the Panthers respected the fifth-placed Raiders they were not overly focused on what Ricky Stuart's men would bring to BlueBet Stadium.

"They've got some really good players and have some good runners of the ball so our defence will have to be on," Capewell said.

"We prepare ourselves to play the best we can every week no matter who the opposition is.

"Part of being ruthless is that it doesn't matter who you play, you've got to play to your standards and we'll prepare to do that this weekend."



## THE BIRTH OF GLEBE

WITH THE 'DIRTY REDS' BACK IN MODERN NSWRL AND STANDING ALONE THIS YEAR, RUGBY LEAGUE HISTORIAN ANDREW FERGUSON LOOKS BACK AT HOW THE CLUB WAS BORN...

On January 9, 1908, a meeting at the Glebe Town Hall containing the Metropolitan Rugby Union's best side, Glebe, their officials and board members, politician Henry Hoyle and businessman James Giltinan lead to the iconic club deciding to switch codes and join the breakaway Rugby League for the upcoming season.

The club's decision to switch codes was the catalyst for Balmain, South Sydney, Eastern Suburbs, Newtown, North Sydney and Western Suburbs to also abandon the MRU and join the Rugby League. It was just as integral to Rugby League's birth as the procurement of star player Dally Messenger.

The story behind Glebe's decision is very closely and heavily linked to the rise of professional Rugby in Australia.

In 1899, Glebe board member Lewis Abrams was made President of the MRU for its debut season in 1900. Abrams was an Alderman for the Glebe Council from 1893 til 1898. He was also Secretary of the Glebe Cricket Club from 1892-1900, President of the Glebe Bicycle Club and Secretary of the Glebe Free Trade & Liberal Association.

Abrams was largely responsible for the introduction of what was called 'electoral cricket', which was essentially the residential rule which would later be used in Rugby Union and Rugby League for many decades. Abrams was also a key man involved in the creation of the MRU in 1900.

In 1900, the MRU announced that clubs from Sydney University, Eastern Suburbs, North Sydney, Glebe, Newtown, Western Suburbs, South Sydney and Balmain would field teams in all three grades of competition. Glebe was one of the first teams entered into the competition as it was seen as "a stronghold of sport."

Glebe's side in the new MRU saw them change their jersey colours from Blue, Black and Yellow, to their iconic maroon (or Dirty Red as they would later be referred to). Abrams accepted the role of Glebe Club Secretary. The club patron was Sydney Mayor, Sir Matthew Harris, who was a very valuable man to have on board as he was also President of the Wentworth Park trust, a ground which had never had a game of football played on it, but would become Glebe's home ground for the 1900 season. Harris was also Vice President of the Royal Agricultural Society, whose ground was a marquee venue at the time.

Glebe's dominance over the competition combined with an area full of talented and gifted athletes was proven when in the MRU's debut season, Glebe won all three grades.

On July 23, 1904, Australia played Great Britain in a test at Brisbane's Exhibition Ground. Glebe's talented forward Alex Burdon, playing in his third consecutive test

for the Wallabies, scored the opening try that gave the Wallabies a 3-0 lead. During the second half, he suffered a very heavy knock to his shoulder which forced him from the field. In typical Burdon style, he returned to the field 17 minutes later. Great Britain went on to win the game 17-3.

For Burdon though, it was the start of an extended lay off from playing and from work. He would return for the following season. His injury, like in sport today, was just an unfortunate risk every player took when they ran out onto the field.


However, Rugby Union was strictly amateur which meant players were not paid to play. Nor were they financially supported if their Rugby Union injury prevented them from working.

On July 14, 1906, Glebe hosted Auckland City at the Sydney Cricket Ground. In a hard-fought match, Glebe trailed 11-8 with 10 minutes remaining when Glebe's George Riddell and Auckland's George Little collided heavily when they both attempted to kick a loose ball. The collision saw both players suffer an horrific broken leg each. The sight of the injuries was so severe that the referee and players agreed to call the game off early and the injured players were sent to St.Vincents Hospital. Coincidentally, the same two players collided with each other in a game just 12 months prior which resulted in both of them suffering broken collarbones.

The Glebe club decided to hold a benefit concert to raise funds for both players. Glebe officials asked the NSWRU to support their campaign; however the request was declined because the Union would not support any activity that gave players money for their involvement in Rugby Union. Glebe went ahead with the fundraising and managed to raise £45 for each player (approximately 3 months wages).

Former Glebe Rugby Union board member Joe McGraw publicly criticised the NSWRU for their not helping Burdon in 1904 or Riddell in 1906. The NSWRU shortly after agreed to provide extra financial assistance to Riddell and Little.

In 1907, the MRU abolished its insurance cover for players, leaving the matter up to the clubs to deal with. On May 4, Sydney played South Sydney at the Sydney Cricket Ground. It was towards the end of this game when Burdon infamously broke his arm. With no insurance to cover him while he was injured and unable to work, Burdon's feeling of anger towards the Rugby Union for twice failing to help him reached its peak. Burdon began attending meetings at Test Cricketer Victor Trumper's sports store. The meetings were frequently attended by James Giltinan, Trumper, Henry Hoyle and a number of players who were regular attendees including Trumper's friend Peter Moir (Glebe), Arthur Hennessy (South Sydney), Bob Graves (Balmain) and Jim Moir (Glebe).



Two weeks after Burdon's injury, Peter Moir received a telegram from George Smith in New Zealand, who was asking if a team of players in Sydney could be assembled to play against a professional Rugby team from New Zealand that would be visiting Australia en-route to England, where they would be partaking in a tour against the professional Northern Union clubs.

Moir took the telegram to Trumper's shop where a brief meeting was held and the request by Smith was accepted.

Professional Rugby started to become a reality and a great attraction for many disgruntled players. Glebe RU board members who were delegates on the MRU committee, supported the Rugby League movement and made it clear that they felt a player revolt towards professionalism was the fault of the Rugby Union for treating players with such contempt and insincerity.

On August 17, 1907, New Zealand played against New South Wales in a game under Rugby Union rules, but where all players were paid in what was considered the first game of Professional Rugby in Australia. A huge crowd of 20,000 turned out for the match, which was won by the visitors 12-8. Two more games were played in the following 6 days, with New Zealand winning both. Glebe fullback Charlie Hedley and forward Peter Moir represented NSW in all three games.

The MRU held a meeting shortly after the series finished. Lewis Abrams proposed that the Rugby Union should give its players the same entitlements that Rugby

League planned to, as it would ensure that the players would not leave for the new code. The committee ruled his comments out of order and he was forced to deny that his intentions were to turn Rugby Union professional. The committee then ruled that all players who participated in the games against the New Zealand professionals would be disqualified.

And so on January 9, 1908, Glebe agreed to become a Rugby League club. Many of their board members supported this decision, including the most important of them all, Sir Matthew Harris.

Harris' switch of allegiance saw the Rugby League gain exclusive use of both Wentworth Park and the Royal Agricultural Showground.

At Glebe's landmark meeting, Tom McCabe was made a member of the management committee and future Prime Minister Billy Hughes was appointed as club patron.

Alderman Percy Lucas was elected as the clubs first President.

On April 11, Glebe played their first game as a Rugby League Club, losing a trial against Western Suburbs 10-9.

On Easter Monday, April 20 at 3.15pm, Glebe kicked off their first official game against Newcastle in front of 3,000 fans at Wentworth Park. Glebe won the match 8-5 despite playing quite poorly.

Opposites Collide in Thursday Night Footy

Two sides with opposite expectations this season come together in a clash on Thursday night at Stadium Australia. South Sydney will face the Brisbane Broncos, as Souths look to continue their climb up the table, with Brisbane looking to avoid sliding further down the ladder and into the dangerous territory of the bottom four.

Souths are coming off a big 38-0 win last round against the Bulldogs in their traditional Good Friday clash. Most pleasing to coach Wayne Bennett would undoubtedly be that his side was able to keep their opponents scoreless. They will need to again focus on the defensive side of their game and not get too far ahead of themselves, after coach Bennett admitted they may have bought into their own off-season press following their round one loss to Melbourne. If they are unable to contain themselves, a desperate Brisbane side could prove to be a danger game for Souths.

Brisbane were almost completely the opposite to South Sydney last week, going down 40-6 to Melbourne. Their defence will have to be a lot better this week against another side who can also attack very strongly. Brisbane will need to avoid allowing Souths to get on a big attacking role, or else the score line could turn out ugly for the men from Red Hill.

In team news, the only changes to the Rabbitohs side comes through a suspension to five-eighth Cody Walker. Benji Marshall has been promoted to the starting side in his place and Dean Hawkins comes onto the bench in what will be his NRL debut.

Herbie Farnworth is out this week for Brisbane after being one of their few early season highlights. Richie Kennar comes into the side at centre to replace him. Patrick Carrigan is also out this week. Tevita Pangai-Junior has been promoted to the starting side at lock in his place. John Asiata will return this week from the bench in a boost for Brisbane as well. Coach Kevin Walters has opted to stick with the starting halves pairing of Anthony Milford and Tom Dearden this week, with Brodie Croft coming off the bench.

Who to watch: Adam Reynolds will be very important for the Rabbitohs this week in taking their attacking opportunities, especially with regular halves partner Cody Walker out due to suspension. Reynolds will also be looking to prove to the club why they should consider signing him on a longer-term deal, so look for a big game from the former State of Origin halfback.

We didn't get to see much of Brisbane recruit **John Asiata** in round one after he was taken from the field with an injury. There should be a better chance to see what the former Cowboy can do this week, albeit off the bench. His creativity in the middle of the field could be what worries the Souths defence if anything at all. Look for Asiata to add a bit of spark to the Broncos when he comes onto the field

Favourite: Souths are the definite favourites to take out this game.

My tip: It's hard to see the Broncos improving too much out of sight from last week. They've also lost one of their better players so far this season in Herbie Farnworth and they have also lost Pat Carrigan who does a lot of work to help tie up the Brisbane defence in the middle of the field. Despite the loss of Cody Walker, they have a fantastic back up in Benji Marshall, so it shouldn't affect Souths too much. It will be very difficult for Brisbane to halt the South Sydney attack once they get into a groove in this game, so the Rabbitohs should win. South Sydney by 26.

Warriors get a boost ahead of battle with bottom-placed side

While the tangible benefits are still a couple of months away, the announcement of a New Zealand-Australia travel bubble which is set to commence in the coming weeks gives the Warriors something to look forward to later this year, as they focus their sights this week on the last-placed Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles.

Forced into hosting matches in Australia since the COVID-19 pandemic began impacting the game in May last year, the Warriors will call Central Coast Stadium home until June this year, with the aim of heading home after the representative round to host the Dragons at Mt Smart Stadium.

For now though, it's all about ensuring the NRL's most nomadic team of recent years are well-placed by the time they can make that trek back over the Tasman. This week's test looks easy on paper - overcome a Manly team who are yet to lay down a serious challenge to any of their four opponents thus far in 2021.

With the Warriors - we know they try. Even in a 20-point loss to the Roosters on Sunday, they looked confident and willing to try their hand, and were arguably in the contest well into the second half. Playing a full 80 is probably the Auckland side's biggest issue so far this year, but it's jagged them a couple of wins and should arguably do so again here.

Manly are just in all sorts, if we're being totally honest. Hampered by injury - star fullback Tom Trbojevic headlining a host of unavailable players which also includes Jorge Taufua, Curtis Sironen and now centre Moses Suli - the Sea Eagles are becoming increasingly reliant on their star halves pairing of Kieran Foran and Daly Cherry-Evans. The pair formed the premiership-winning combination in 2011 at the same club but since Foran's return to Brookvale, they haven't been able to dictate terms for a side which is sorely lacking in troops and facing a massive test of depth.

Team news this week is pretty significant for both sides. The Warriors have shuffled their pack on the back of a knee injury to ex-Manly prop Addin Fonua-Blake, while Bayley Sironen is out with a shoulder concern and Bunty Afoa will miss this game through suspension. Tohu Harris moves to the front row with Jack Murchie joining the second row in his place. Three new faces come onto the bench - Tom Ale, former Eel Kane Evans, and Josh Curran.

Manly's changes are only forced ones - Morgan Harper replaces Suli at centre, while Jack Gosiewski is back into the starting pack to cover Morgan Boyle who is both suspended and injured. Toafofoa Sipley is the new face on the interchange

Who to watch: The impact play of two bench stars will be worth watching this Friday. For the Warriors, new signing **Ben Murdoch-Masila** has put in some solid shifts since returning to the NRL after a stint in the Super League with perennial bridesmaids Warrington.

The Sea Eagles nabbed the signature of former Tiger **Josh Aloiai** not long before the season started and so far he's yet to have the impact Des Hasler would've wanted in the Manly forward line. Overlooked for the starting prop role in favour of Taniela Paseka, he needs some strong form to regain his spot starting up front

Favourite: Warriors. Nobody's picking Manly.

My tip: It's genuinely hard to see where Manly improve enough to overcome the Warriors, even allowing for the fact the 'home' side here have an injury crisis of their own. The superstar presence of Roger Tuivasa-Sheck alone should see the hosts across the line at Gosford, and dig the ditch deeper for a Manly side already wondering whether re-signing coach Des Hasler was the right call. Warriors by 36.

The Panthers just seem to have forgotten how to lose at the moment.

Ivan Cleary's men cruised to a big 46-6 win over Manly last week despite being without their first-choice fullback and hooker.

They will be without Dylan Edwards and Apisai Koroisau once again this round with Stephen Crichton and Mitch Kenny to fill the void.

Crichton was shaky early, caught out of position in the opening half on a few occasions while he was also thoroughly tested under the high ball.

Getting some early catches out of the way will be key to settling any pre-match nerves on Friday night so he can focus more of his energy on injecting himself into the attack.

Interestingly Charlie Staines switched to fullback at points last week, providing the final pass for a Paul Momirovski try late in the second half and that ploy could be used again by Cleary on Friday.

The bigger test for Penrith this week will be containing a dominant Raiders forward pack.

The Panthers have four forwards averaging over 100 running metres this season and while Canberra only have two, they come in the form of starting props Josh Papalii and Ryan Sutton.

If the pair can lay a strong platform early it could rattle Penrith, who have grown so used to dominating from the opening whistle.

Looking at the two teams, Canberra also look like they are more than capable of matching the Panthers' lethal bench.

Spencer Leniu and Liam Martin provide much-needed punch while Matt Eisenhuth is a more dependable workhorse.

Then there is Tyrone May, whose versatility and varied skillset makes him a perfect super substitute.

Canberra though have plenty of impact in the form of Siliva Havili and Tom Starling while Ryan James has been much-improved since making the move to the nation's capital.

The experienced workhorse Sia Soliola then rounds out the bench.

Who to watch: Given the strength of Canberra's forward pack, it will only be more important than ever that the Panthers get support off the bench from Spencer Leniu. The youngster is taking on added responsibility without James Tamou and Zane Tetevano. He is averaging almost four more runs per game along with 26 more metres this season. Papalii and Sutton will prove a tough pair to shut down in the first half but if Penrith do that they will be confident in Leniu using both his size and leg speed to get the Panthers on the front foot.

Canberra's clear advantage in this game is at hooker, with Josh Hodgson posing a far greater attacking threat than the far more understated Mitch Kenny. Leading the league for hookers when it comes to try assists and linebreak assists, Hodgson has a habit of sending big props crashing over close to the line and will be the key to tiring out a relentless Penrith defence.

Favourite: Penrith are unsurprisingly favourites given their 4-0 start to the season.

My tip: The Raiders have a forward pack capable of match Penrith's and a halves pairing that could test the still developing Crichton at fullback. Canberra were resolute in victory last week against the Gold Coast. Look for another lowscoring win here. Canberra by 6.

Two sides desperate to turn around losses come together as Saturday afternoon football heads to the Gold Coast as the Titans play host to the Newcastle Knights.

Last weekend, the Titans struggled to break through an ironclad Canberra Raiders defensive line as they fell to a 20-4 defeat at Kogarah last weekend. Despite holding most of the possession last weekend, the Titans attack struggled to crack the Raiders defence along with a mounting injury toll.

The points that Gold Coast conceded would have disappointed coach Justin Holbrook given that the Raiders tries came through defensive lapses across the park. The Titans conceded two tries from close range when the Raiders big men were able to barge their way over through weak defence. The injury toll mounted for the Titans with halfback Jamal Fogarty suffering a leg injury and Anthony Don suffering a hip injury hurting the Gold Coast.

Despite coming from the field last weekend, Jamal Fogarty has been named in the halfback position for the Gold Coast potentially meaning Fogarty's injury is not a serious as thought. The Titans though are without Anthony Don through his hip injury with Phillip Sami moving back to the Wing as Brian Kelly returns to the centres. A possible boost for the Titans could be on the way with Ash Taylor potentially set to make his return after being named in the 21-man squad.

Injuries took a toll yet again for the Newcastle Knights during their 22-13 man defeat which saw a number of key players suffer injuries including captain Mitchell Pearce who suffered a serious pec injury. The Knights started off well but as well as the injuries, errors played a part as they struggled to hold off a confident Dragons side.

The Knights opened the scoring last weekend and were able to lead by seven points during the early stages of the second half but the mounting injury toll plus ill-discipline and errors mounted up against Newcastle as the Dragons took the victory in the contest 22-13.

Although a mounting injury toll has forced Newcastle coach Adam O'Brien into some drastic changes, the Knights have been boosted significantly with Kalyn Ponga named at fullback for the first time this season. The Knights will be without Mitchell Pearce as mentioned as well as Tex Hoy and Kurt Mann following a hamstring injury and heavy concussion respectively. The changes have meant that both Blake Green and Connor Watson move from the interchange bench to the halves. Forward Jacob Saifiti will also miss this weekend's contest after being suspended for a shoulder charge.

Who to watch: After being one of the best players on the park last weekend for either side, the work of Tino Faasuamaleaui will be very important for the Titans as they look to get past the Knights. Faasuamaleaui ran for over 200m in last weekend's defeat to the Raiders and was arguably the most dangerous player on the field for the Gold Coast. If the Knights cannot keep the big man down, it could be a long afternoon.

It's not hard to work out for the Knights that Kalyn Ponga is their player to watch, the star fullback won't be able to ease his way back into NRL action following his shoulder injury. The Knights attack in recent weeks has lacked a sense of flair and with a new halves partnership, Ponga will be expected to play a role for Newcastle should they want to turn around their losing streak.

Favourite: The Titans are heavy favourites given the injury toll for Newcastle as well as the game returning to the Gold Coast.

My tip: It's hard not to see this becoming another blowout score line this weekend, the Titans have been good and a potential return of Ash Taylor could help their attack significantly. There are too many question marks on the Knights with out of form players having to fill gaps and a new halves pairing potentially making things awkward. **Gold Coast by 14**.

Patched up Roosters and Sharks chase back-to-back victories

With three time premiership winner Luke Keary sitting in the stand alongside halves partner Lachlan Lam, an air of uncertainty hovered over the Roosters heading into last week's clash with the Warriors. It didn't take debutant Sam Walker long to settle the nerves, and a clever ball to set up a Nat Butcher try only added to the hype surrounding the prodigious teenager.

While Walker received plenty of wraps after the comfortable victory, it was anything but one way traffic. Once again James Tedesco and the Morris twins had their fingerprints all over the scorecard, but the turning point owed itself to resolute defence. Having kept the Warriors at bay for three consecutive sets when the game was in the balance, the Roosters rebounded quickly then raced away for their third win of the season.

This week Trent Robinson has named the same 17 as the club shoots for its sixth straight victory over Cronulla. And with a blockbuster against Melbourne to follow, a win this week will ensure the Roosters remain in touch with the competition pacesetters.

Desperation days for former grand final foes

Sunday afternoon looms as a must-win clash for the Wests Tigers and the North Queensland Cowboys as the 2005 grand final combatants face off at Leichardt

Sitting in 13th position with one win over the first four rounds, the Wests Tigers have struggled for consistency and cohesion following an active recruitment spree over the off-season.

Rallying late before going down 36-22 to the Eels on Easter Monday, coach Michael Maguire will be looking to address a worrying trend that has seen the side concede tries either side of halftime in all their losses.

Returning to Leichardt Oval for the first time this season, the Tigers have struggled to rise to the occasion of playing at the historic venue losing three of their past four appearances.

Resisting the temptation to make widespread changes following another loss. Michael Chee-Kam comes into the squad in place of Asu Kepaoa as part of a backline reshuffle that sees Moses Mbve start in the centres and Tommy Talua push out to the wing.

Languishing in 14th position with a -105 differential after just a month of football, the North Queensland Cowboys will be hoping to avoid starting a season with five consecutive losses for the first time since 1999.

Producing a defensively inept performance during last Saturday's 48-10 defeat at the hands of the Sharks, coach Todd Payten will be challenging his players to become only the second North Queensland team to win at Leichardt Oval.

Losing 10 out of 11 visits to the traditional home of Balmain, the Cowboys' lone victory at the venue came in 2000 - prior to current first-graders Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow and Ben Condon being born.

Gaining a huge inclusion with Jason Taumalolo recovering from a broken hand, speedster Kyle Feldt returns from suspension at the expense of Justin O'Neill in the backline.

Who to watch: Making a big impression in the number one jersey after securing an early release to join the Tigers before the start of the season, Daine Laurie will be eagerly anticipating his first taste of Leichardt Oval in the NRL. Scoring a powerful double against the Sea Eagles during a pre-season trial at the hallowed venue, the 21-year-old has been one of the joint venture's best performers over the opening month with 142 running metres on average and . 19 tackle breaks. Proving his worth as more than a back-up outside back for the Panthers, expect Laurie to be heavily involved with the ball in hand for the home

Afforded a rare opportunity to start in the halves having been used predominantly as an interchange utility, Ben Hampton will be looking to seize upon an opportunity that has proved elusive for much of his career. Coming through the junior ranks as a playmaker at Melbourne, the 29-year-old has played every position in the backline since moving to North Queensland four years ago. Running for over 100 metres with the ball in hand last week, look for Hampton to act as a steadying influence in the Cowboys' bid to break through for their first win of 2021.

Favourite: Winning six of their past seven clashes against their weekend opponents, the Tigers are favoured to build on the encouraging signs shown over the past fortnight.

My tip: The Cowboys have the ability to post an upset given what is known about the Tigers at their worst. The Tigers are capable of piling on the points as was the case when the two sides met last year. I don't have a lot of confidence in the home team, but I have even less in the visitors. Wests Tigers by 12.

Parramatta Eels to face surprise packet Dragons

Prior to the season, there were plenty questioning the credentials of both these sides, with the Eels late season fade-out last year accounting for pundits writing them off for premiership contention and the Dragons earmarked as wooden spoon favourites by many.

The Eels announced themselves as a premiership threat with a gritty win over the Storm in Round 2 and are still yet to taste defeat in 2021, while the Dragons have shown a newfound resilience under veteran coach Anthony Griffin and have won 3 games and lost just the 1 so far this year.

All of this means that when the two clubs meet at Bankwest Stadium on Sunday evening, it will be looked on with more intrigue by Rugby League viewers than earlier thought.

Last week, the Dragons benefitted from some injuries to the Knights, however still showed great composure to come back from 7 points down early in the 2nd half to win by 9 points, while the Eels survived a late scare from the Tigers and won by 14.

In team news, the Eels are unchanged in the backline, however Ryan Matterson has been named to make his return from a head knock in the second row. Papali'i drops back to the bench to accommodate, while Bryce Cartwright has been named to make his Eels debut from the interchange. Ray Stone and Keegan Hipgrave drop out of the side as a result.

For the Dragons, Jack Bird returns from a one-week suspension and takes his spot in the centres, forcing Brayden Wiliame back to the bench and Jackson Ford out of the side. Other than that, they are unchanged, with Ben Hunt still recovering from a leg injury and Adam Clune starting at halfback for the time being.

Who to watch: Flying under the radar for the Eels has been centre Tom Opacic. Originally signed as a depth player in the off season for Parramatta, Opacic has quietly gone about his business as a reliable defender and was finally rewarded with a double last week, including showing great strength to get over the top of a few Wests Tigers defenders while running a crash ball line. The change of scenery appears to be just what Opacic needed after spending the last few years in and out of first grade at the Cowboys, however he will need to be at his best come Sunday as he is marking up against Zac Lomax, who is renowned for outleaping defenders close to the line.

Prior to the season, it was almost a fait accompli that Corey Norman wouldn't be offered a new contract and would be out the door at the Dragons come seasons end. However, a strong start to the year has sparked a change in the attitude of the Dragons decision makers, who have reportedly considered a new one-year deal for the five-eighth. It is a welcome reward for Norman, who by his own admission hasn't played his best footy in recent years. So far in 2021, he has three try and line break assists, while his running game has also been sound with four tackle breaks. He will be keen for a big performance on Sunday, especially considering it is against the team that cut ties with him at the end of 2018.

Favourite: Despite both teams starting the year in a similar fashion, the Eels are still favoured by a hefty 9 and a half points over the Dragons.

My tip: he Dragons have certainly proven that they are worlds better than the wooden spoon side many had them pencilled in as in the pre-season, however a tough task is made even tougher with the absence of Ben Hunt against Parramatta, who themselves will be keen for improvement after playing poorly in parts against the Tigers. #### Rabbitohs crucify Bulldogs in Good Friday football



#### Life of Ryan: Papenhuyzen bags four as Storm smack Broncos

#### Old heads guide young Roosters to win over Warriors

The Morris twins and James Tedesco have led a much younger Roosters outfit to a 20-point win tonight, the home side 32-12 victors over the Warriors at the SCG.

### Doueihi kicking masterclass not enough as Eels win thriller

The Parramatta Eels have continued their undefeated start to the season with a hard-fought 36-22 win over the Wests Tigers at Stadium Australia.

Adam Doueihi terrorised Parramatta's outside backs with his kicking game and scored a try in defeat but the power game up front, orchestrated by Reed Mahoney was crucial for the away side. The Eels were helped by a dominant first 40 minutes from their forward pack, with Reagan Campbell-Gillard, Nathan Brown, Isaiah Papali'i and Junior Paulo all topping 70 metres by the break. The Tigers were guilty of sitting back and not playing with enough line speed to shut down the forward momentum which powered Parramatta to an early 16-0 lead.

Reed Mahoney's crash balls to big men close to the line proved one of their biggest assets, drawing in multiple defenders often and leaving the Tigers exposed out wide. The opening try though was all Mitchell Moses, who danced around near the Tigers' line before putting in a deft kick to set up Marata Niukore for the opening try.

A set restart five minutes later heaped more pressure on Michael Maguire's men and a late offload from Brown saw Mahoney put Papali'i crashing over. Mahoney again was involved shortly after when he put Tom Opacic through and the Tigers' line defence was once again left exposed.

The only real opportunities the Tigers had early was on the back of towering Adam Doueihi bombs and it was the five-eighth's kicking game that proved Paramatta's downfall late in the opening half. Clinton Gutherson was first to fumble a Doueihi kick,

handing the Tigers a full set on Parramatta's line. It would end with Luciano Leilua tapping the ball back to Daine Laurie for their first try of the afternoon.

Only four minutes later the Tigers had their second with Blake Ferguson the latest victim of a Doueihi special. It was the quick thinking of Moses Mbye though, who flicked it up for Luke Brooks, that saw Stefano Utoikamanu surge over for a try against his former side.

A late error from Asu Kepaoa off a Shaun Lane kick spoiled their late fightback though. The foundations for the try were set by a Mahoney short ball to Oregon Kaufusi, dragging defenders in and leaving the outside men exposed on the following play. Opacic was the beneficiary, scoring his second after Gutherson did well to get the kick through.

The first try in the second half would be crucial in determining whether this would go on to be a back-and-forth thriller or comfortable Parramatta victory. It looked like it would be the latter as Ferguson charged over in the corner to extend Parramatta's lead to 14 in the 45th minute. Doueihi though, who was the Tigers' best in defeat, had something to say about that.

Errors crept into both team's game and proved costly for Parramatta when Doueihi stepped through to score and reduce the deficit to eight heading into the final 15

A thrilling finish well and truly ensued when a Leilua offload saw Luke Brooks link with Jacob Liddle to make it a two-point contest. In the end it would be the boot of Ferguson that proved the difference, with the Eels winger toeing it ahead for Gutherson, who as always had made the effort to be there in support and he was rewarded.

Ferguson scored a try right before the siren as the Tigers tried a late crossfield kick, making the final score 36-22.
