Manly come back to snatch victory from fast starting Broncos

It couldn't have been a worse opening set for the Broncos after Brodie Croft kicked out on the full leaving fans of the struggling Brisbane side thinking "here we go again." But any thought of last week's horror show repeating itself was stamped out after young gun Xavier Coates plucked the ball out of the air - not for the last time in the game - and got it to Kotoni Staggs who grubbered for himself and scored in his first game back.

The Broncos waited 10 more minutes for their second 4 pointer and this time it was Coates doing it all himself, out-leaping debutant winger Tevita Funa to score his second try in the NRL, putting the Broncos out to an unlikely 12 point lead. Based on the first half alone, Funa will be having nightmares about Coates for weeks. Manly then had a golden opportunity to get back into it with 3 consecutive sets on the Broncos line, however the pressure was relieved when Sean Keppie knocked on with his first touch of the game, giving the Broncos some new found confidence in their defence.

Darius Boyd went over shortly after, completing a simple sweep play and opting not to pass to his outside man. Backing himself proved to be the right option as he ran over the top of rep fullback Trbojevic, sending the Broncos 18 points clear after 29 minutes and shocking the Rugby League world.

Manly were able to crucially get one back on Brisbane 4 minutes out from half time, with Funa making up for his poor showing under the high ball and strolling over off the back of a beautiful Trbjoevic ball. This got Manly within 14 after Reuben Garrick missed his conversion attempt from out wide, but the important thing was Manly were on the board after the first haf.

It took the Sea Eagles just 4 minutes in the second half to further the comeback, with Daly Cherry-Evans taking the line on off a Dylan Walker short ball and exposing a gap in the Broncos line, reducing the gap to 8 points. From this moment on, Manly began playing a more expansive brand of footy, however a pass in the first set after points to Brad Parker in space was ruled forward.

There's no doubt Manly were getting the rub of the green, the penalty count finishing 12-2 their way, however you can't blame that for the poor Broncos defence that let Moses Suli go over in the 56th minute. It was like a training run for the Sea Eagles, who created a 3-on-1 overlap that saw Suli stroll over for the easiest try he'll ever score. All of the sudden the Broncos were only up by 2 with 23 minutes to go.

Manly were given the opportunity to level up after Coates was ruled to have ran an escort on Joel Thompson, gifting the Sea Eagles two points and deadlocking the scores with just over 15 to go. Staggs looked to have swung momentum back Brisbane's way when he wrapped up Trbjoevic 5 metres out form his own line, however he ruined it by giving away a penalty for not being square at marker. Manly attempted to go one up in the resulting set but Cherry-Evans missed the shot, however his side retained possession due to a Bronco hand getting involved. A controversial decision to award Manly a penalty due to Patrick Carrigan having his hand in the ruck handed them the lead for the first time with 10 to go.

That was all she wrote but the Broncos were not without their chances, Coates looked destined for the line in the final minute but some Tom Trbojevic cover defence made sure that didn't happen.

The Warriors got back to winning ways with a 37-26 result against an inconsistent North Queensland Cowboys side tonight at Central Coast Stadium.

Gosford is starting to look like home for the Warriors. They have won both clashes at their temporary home and piled on 37 points which included a hattrick from Peta Hiku and a strong running game from Kodi Nikorima. Cowboys showed promise but couldn't find a consistent effort to get the points.

It was the perfect response from the Warriors after being held to nil against the Panthers. They stuck to their gameplan with a simpler style of play and it saw them pile on the points once the Cowboys tired at the back end of the contest. It has given the Warriors fans back home some added delight after earlier this week, the nation had eliminated the novel Corona Virus.

Central to the result for the Warriors was the work of their halves. Kodi

Nikorima lit up the contest with two try-assists and in the second half, Blake Green had the ball on a string and trapped the Cowboys behind their line for several repeat sets to break their spirit.

The first half was an exhibition of points. Both sides shared five tries between them but the Warriors took a five-point advantage into the break through Patrick Herbert, Peta Hiku and youngster Eliesa Katoa with Kodi Nikorima slotting a field goal at the hooter. For Cowboys, Valentine Holmes before he succumbed to an injury and Kyle Feldt touched down for their points.

Cowboys got the perfect start to the second half, Justin O'Neill was fed by debutant Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow to claw it back to 17-16. The game see-sawed again with Adam Pompey restoring the Warriors lead before young tyro Francis Molo crept the Cowboys closer again.

From there, the Warriors stamped their authority on the contest. Hiku scored back-to-back to complete his hat-trick and stretched their advantage to nine. Karl Lawton was on the spot to put the contest to bed, a kick rebounded off the chasing pack and the interchange man was there to pick up the scraps.

For the Cowboys, they have some issues with both Holmes and Jordan Maclean limping off the field before the end. Youngster Tabuai-fidow chimed in well at fullback once Holmes went off and there is something for the side to build on for next weekend.

Eels stun Panthers late in derby

Parramatta remain undefeated in 2020 after they laid on three successive tries in a matter of minutes to record a stunning come from behind win over the Panthers at Bankwest Stadium tonight.

With the Panthers leading 10-0 in the 64th minute, it was former Panther Waqa Blake who came back to haunt his former side, when he produced a devastating fend on opposite Stephen Crichton to score the Eels first try. Blake didn't stop there, stepping past Crichton minutes later and then finding his skipper Clint Gutherson who raced away to tie the game up late in the second half.

Parramatta then kicked clear when Eels half Mitch Moses kicked ahead with the Panthers on the backfoot. The kick produced a horror bounce for Panthers fullback Caleb Aekins and into the arms of Ryan Matterson who slid over to score and secure a superb win for Parramatta over their local rivals.

It was a disappointing loss for the Panthers who looked in control after the hour mark and then saw their 10-0 lead evaporate in a matter of minutes. The loss was further compounded by the loss of backrower Kurt Capewell who left the field in the first set of six with a suspected medial ligament injury.

With both sides looking to take the lead on the NRL ladder, the Battle of the West was a huge clash for both sides and as expected the game then turned into a see-sawing affair, with both number seven's in Nathan Cleary and Mitchell Moses launching some monstrous high kicks early which were keeping each sides respective back three on their toes.

After both sides were denied tries due to interference on defenders from attacking kicks, which saw both the Eels' Ryan Matterson and Panthers' Dean Whare denied early tries. It was the visitors who struck first, when newly resigned Panther winger Brian To'o collected a wayward Caleb Aekins pass off his bootlaces to step past his opposite Maika Sivo and carry three more Eels defenders over the line to score the first try of the match. Cleary missed his first conversion of the year from out wide and Penrith led 4-0.

Off the back of a penalty against Moses for a high shot on Panthers' rookie Crichton, Penrith scored on the left-hand side after Jerome Luai and Cleary combined to allow the rookie centre to exact some revenge by putting his muscle-bound winger Josh Mansour over to score. Cleary converted to give his side a 10-0 lead at halftime.

The arm wrestle continued after the break, as the Eels did their best to power their way through the Panthers middle. A penalty from Panthers prop James Fisher-Harris then sparked the Eels, when the firebrand prop took Eels lock Nathan Brown off the ball when chasing a kick. Off the ensuing play former Panther Blake, managed to produce a huge fend on his opposite Crichton to open the scoring. This sparked two more Eels tries, with both Blake and Nathan Brown featuring with some decisive runs and from seemingly out of nowhere the Eels were in control.

The Eels had a chance to ice the game when Moses had a golden opportunity missing a late field goal to give his side the win, however Parramatta defended a late Panthers onslaught to secure their best start to a season since they last won the competition in 1986.

Next week the Eels have the ultimate challenge when they face the defending premiers, the Roosters at Bankwest Stadium next Saturday night in what will no doubt be the game of the round. Penrith also face a tough match up when they play the Melbourne Storm at Campbelltown Sports Ground next Friday night.

The South Sydney Rabbitohs secured their first win since the restart with a comfortable 32-12 result against Gold Coast Titans this afternoon at Bankwest Stadium.

For the first time since his switch to Redfern, Latrell Mitchell looked comfortable as a custodian. Mitchell opened the scoring with a juggling effort and contributed a pair of try-assists as the Rabbitohs did enough to down the Titans. Much of the damage was done in the first half where Souths led 26-6 headed into the break.

Stinging from their defeat to the Storm and Roosters back-to-back, Souths looked energised with the return of five-eighth Cody Walker and crossed after three minutes through Mitchell before the Titans struck back from a slicing effort from Philip Sami making it 6-6.

It might've come against softer opposition but Souths looked more like the side

they promised to be in 2020. Cook was scheming, Walker kicked well and the points flowed quickly once they got the roll on.

Alex Johnston, Dane Gagai and Braidon Burns all crossed the stripe. Adam Reynolds, who looked a bit lost without Walker the previous two games, kicked six from six goals today with five of those in the first half and looked back to his composed self.

The Titans were gallant with their effort, briefly rumbling for a comeback when Bryce Cartwright, in the headlines for the wrong reasons during the lockdown, score dhis first four-pointer of the season to bring it back to 14. They probed and pushed but bar a no try to Cartwright Titans lacked enough punch to trouble the Rabbitohs defense in a low quality second half.

Mitchell put the cherry on top of his Man of the Match performance today as he left future Rabbitoh Jai Arrow clutching at air before he slung the ball to Gagai to complete his double in the dying stages of the contest to make it 32-12.

Getting back in the win column will please coach Wayne Bennett as the Rabbitohs eye the chance to put some form together with a much more favourable run in the next month while the Titans have a vital clash against fellow strugglers St George Illawarra next weekend.

Smith spearheads Storm win over Knights

Cameron Smith and Cameron Munster have combined to reignite the spark in the Melbourne Storm attack to secure a 26-12 win over the Newcastle Knights at Central Coast Stadium.

Melbourne got off to a quality start as they built up an 18-2 lead by half-time with tries to Ryley Jacks (3rd minute), Suliasi Vunivalu (24th minute) and Tino Faasuamaleaui (34th minute), of which two were assisted by Cameron Smith.

The Knights were able to reduce their errors at the start of the second half and scored tries through Bradman Best (53rd minute) and Edrick Lee (61st minute) to get themselves only six points behind in the final quarter of the match.

With Newcastle rallying in the final 10 minutes, the Storm were able to put the Knights away with a penalty goal and an inspirational solo Brandon Smith try.

Newcastle appeared to be hard done by late when trailing by six, as they received a penalty while defending on their tryline. However, the play was brought back a few seconds to penalise contact with David Klemmer on Dale Finuncane which was incidental.

Melbourne was then able to set up for a penalty goal which gave the away side an eight-point buffer with less than five minutes to go.

In the third minute Munster ran the ball on the last through the short side and once the ball got to Addo-Carr allowed the winger kicked in-field for replacement halfback Ryley Jacks to surprise everyone by beating the well positioned Herman Ese'ese to ground the ball.

Then Cameron Smith laid on two try-assists from dummy-half which made the Storm's attack look slick once more.

A 15-metre pass from the play-the-ball to Vunivalu's wing set the winger up to beat one defender and another sliding tackler at the corner for a four-pointer.

Next time Cameron Smith ran diagonally out of dummy-half to link up with Faasuamaleaui to crash over for his first NRL try.

Against his old team Kurt Mann used a grubber on a six-again penalty to set Best up for his fifth try, during his third game of the season, to mark the first points of the second half.

Six minutes later and the Knights were in again through a diving Edrick Lee that left him with noticeable pain in the ribs inflicted by the cover defence.

The last try through Brandon Smith was a man on a mission to drag defender after defender just far enough to plant the ball on the tryline.

Newcastle had stand out efforts from Daniel Saifiti (158 metres, 39 tackles) and Kalyn Ponga (10 tackle breaks) but they weren't able to run Melbourne down.

The win for the Storm sees them overtake the Knights into second spot on the ladder, with Newcastle dropping down to third. Cameron Smith was five-from-five on conversion kicks. Newcastle has not beaten Melbourne since 2015.



Canberra have taken advantage of some good fortune their way to take a 14-6 victory over a very gutsy Wests Tigers side at Campbelltown Stadium.

It was a very strong opening forty minutes for the Tigers, as the Raiders struggled to gain any ascendancy in attack and were pinned down in their own half for long periods of time. right pass which was shown by a ball that would've gone straight to touch judge Belinda Sharpe rather than any Raiders player.

They were able to get on the board in the 50th minute when Jack Wighton got over the line after back to back penalties against the Tigers for infringements in the ruck. The try didn't come without questioning, with Wighton not penalised in the prior play for a raised elbow that left Josh Reynolds down injured.

The momentum had well and truly swung and the Raiders were able to take advantage again when Russell Packer was sent to the sin bin by Chris Sutton for illegally stopping the Raiders from taking a quick tap off the back of a penalty. The reduced numbers for the Tigers came back to cost them almost instantly when George Williams took advantage with a kick behind the line and Nick Cotric had a free passage to the line to score the Raiders second try of the night. A pinpoint Jarrod Croker conversion pushed the margin out to 8 points.

The Tigers looked to close the gap and take time off the clock when they closed the margin to six following a Moses Mbye penalty goal. The Tigers fortunes didn't turn in their or in particular Russell Packer's favour when the veteran was placed on report for a high shot and the Raiders took the two points on offer to push it out to an 8-point margin.

The Tigers tried hard to get over the line to close the gap again but the Green Machine's defence stood tall and they held on for the 14-6 victory.

Dragons break through for first win of 2020

The St George Illawarra Dragons have recorded their first win of the season after downing the Cronulla Sharks 30-16 at Campbelltown Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

Scoring five tries to three in a game that was brought forward due to coronavirus concerns within the Bulldogs' camp, the Dragons responded in fine fashion following two dismal showings over the past fortnight, with reinstated fullback Matt Dufty providing a much-needed attacking spark for the joint venture.

Avoiding an early scare after Dufty was denied for an obstruction, the Sharks wasted little time in opening the scoring through former South Sydney winger Mawene Hiroti (6th minute) following a lovely offload from Josh Dugan.

Crossing for their first try since the 63rd minute of their Round 2 loss to Penrith back in March, Mikaele Ravalawa (14th minute) was on the spot to give the Dragons a 6-4 lead.

Responding through Sione Katoa (21st minute) following a nice right side shift from a scrum play, the Sharks looked to extend their lead minutes later through Will Kennedy only for Jack Williams to penalised for an obstruction.

Buoyed by their most competitive half of the season, Matt Dufty (30th minute) and Ben Hunt (39th minute) crossed just before halftime to give the Dragons an 18-10 lead.

With both sides exchanging sets after halftime, the Dragons were lucky to avoid a catastrophic four-pointer from within their own in-goal, only for Cronulla utility Connor Tracey to be deemed to have knocked on.

Building pressure on the Sharks' goal line thanks to good kicking from Corey Norman, the Dragons were rewarded through captain Cameron McInnes (62nd minute) who crashed over to push the home side out beyond two converted tries.

Threatening to pull off a comeback after Wade Graham (70th minute) crashed over from a Shaun Johnson short ball, a contentious call killed off the Sharks' hopes despite Katoa appearing to pull off a simultaneous grounding alongside Euan Aitken.

Capping the victory in style with Dufty firing a lovely cut-out pass to send Ravalawa (79th minute) over for his second of the afternoon, the Dragons finished as deserving 30-16 victors to post their first premiership points of the season.

In the only negative for the Dragons, five-eighth Corey Norman looks set to draw the ire of the match review committee after being placed on report for a trip late in the match.

Next week, the Dragons face the Titans on Saturday afternoon at Suncorp Stadium, while the Sharks will host the Bulldogs on Sunday evening at Bankwest Stadium.

Canterbury-Bankstown got off the mark for 2020, a 22-2 win leaving St George Illawarra winless after four rounds following tonight's match at Bankwest Stadium.

At times tonight, the Roosters SFX used by Fox Sports needed some relief. The Roosters blitzkreiged the Bulldogs early, Angus Crichton notched up an early double alongside James Tedesco touching down as they searched for another massive score.

Monday night is a happy hunting ground for Tedesco. The superstar fullback notched his second career hat-trick tonight, his first coming for Wests Tigers back in 2016, also on Monday night. The custodian was in supreme form as he broke tackles at will, amassed over 200m in a Man of the Match performance.

For a long portion, it looked like the Roosters were to become the third

side since 1980 to score 100 points unanswered alongside Norths and the Roosters themselves. It looked like clockwork at points for the Roosters, as they just cut through the Bulldogs at will. It will take a huge effort for a team to knock off the back-to-back Premiers this season.

Brett Morris, who deputised at fullback last weekend, got himself a late four-pointer but the evergreen winger has sparkled since his move to the tricolours. He provided a superb pass for one of Tedesco's tries and adds another layer of class to what is a galaxy of them at the Premiers.

It must feel like a dream for young halfback Kyle Flanagan. Since his move from the Sharks, Flanagan has enjoyed a golden run at the Roosters which included a four-pointer tonight and continued to stretch his lead at the top of the point-scorer's list.

For the Bulldogs, it was a night to forget after their Queens Birthday success. There was delight late when Kieran Foran started and finished an effort to make it 30-6. They were outmuscled early and never recovered against the machine-like Roosters line-up.

Now we look forward to a mouth-watering contest on Saturday night. The unbeaten Parramatta Eels take on the rampaging Sydney Roosters in a marquee contest at Bankwest Stadium. Canterbury take on fellow bottom-four side Cronulla on Sunday night at the same venue.

Vale Noel Kelly OAM

Australian Rugby League Commission (ARLC) Chairman Peter V'landys AM has tonight paid tribute to Kangaroo Noel Kelly OAM who passed away this afternoon aged 84. He played 28 tests for the Kangaroos.

Mr V'landys said Noel created Kangaroos history during the 1960s.

"He was the first front rower to tour with the Kangaroos three times on the 1959-60, 1963-64 and 1967-68 tours, a feat that will forever be etched in rugby league history," he said.

"A deserved member of the National Rugby League Hall of Fame, "Ned" as he was fondly known, was an uncompromising forward. As tough as they came, he was sent off 17 times playing for his beloved Wests. His send-off 90 seconds into the 1967 second test again New Zealand will always remain part of our folklore."



Noel played in three NSWRL Grand Finals for Western Suburbs and was named in the Kangaroos team of the 1960s. In all he played 111 games for the Magpies and was named captain-coach in 1966.

Noel also made the 'Team of the Century'; and named among the '100 Greatest Players over the first century of the game' by the ARL in 2008. He was also named captain and hooker of Wests Magpies Team of the Century in 2004.

Noel, although as tough as they came, was also a man with a big heart being a founding member of the Men of League Foundation

"Noel Kelly will forever be remembered as one of the game's all-time greats. His loss today will be felt throughout the rugby league community."

"On behalf of the game I send my condolences to Noel's family and friends."

NRL approves changes to Round 5 schedule

The Australian Rugby League Commission (ARLC) this morning approved changes to the Round 5 schedule to ensure the health and safety of the playing group and community after a remote risk to the **Bulldogs squad emerged last night.**

The Bulldogs last night informed the NRL that a teacher at a school attended by children of one Bulldogs player had tested positive to COVID-19.

As a result, the player has been placed into isolation and will be tested for COVID-19 today. To ensure no risk to the playing group and community, the Commission has delayed today's match between the Bulldogs and the Roosters to allow the test results to return.

The revised schedule will be:

4:05pm today (Sunday 14 June): St George Illawarra Dragons v Cronulla Sharks (brought forward from 6:30pm today)

7:00pm tomorrow (Monday 15 June): Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs v Sydney Roosters (moved from 4:05pm today).

ARLC Chairman Peter V'landys AM said while the risk the virus had spread to the Bulldogs playing group was remote the Commission wanted absolute certainty before allowing the team to play.

"There's a very remote risk of infection within the Bulldogs squad. To ensure there is no risk at all, the player will be tested today and the game delayed until tomorrow to ensure the test results have returned. I want to congratulate the Bulldogs for swiftly informing the NRL," he said.

"I want to thank our broadcast partners for their assistance, at very short notice, in changing the schedule. The changes will ensure our fans will still be able to watch a game on free to air television this afternoon," he said.

Millie Boyle's whirlwind year

From a premiership to bushfires and pandemic

s the world came to grips with the COVID-19 lockdowns earlier this year, injured Brisbane Broncos, Blues and Jillaroos prop Millie Boyle wanted to make most of a tough situation – and it may have helped fast track her return to the field.

It has been a whirlwind year and a half for Boyle. A few days after winning the 2019 NRLW grand final with Brisbane Broncos, she noticed she was unable to turn her head.

But she pressed on through the pain in the neck to represent the Jillaroos at the World Cup Nines and then in the Test match. Two days later she got an MRI which revealed she had a bulging disc.

Then, in early 2020, Boyle returned to her hometown of Cobargo to help her community as the New South Wales bushfire crisis took hold. She was desperate to help out and told tales of how her family bravely saved the family farm.

With so much going on in the world, 22-year-old Boyle was still staring the barrel of a long stint on the sidelines. Then it took yet another turn.

In March, she left her home in Queensland to attend a New South Wales Origin Camp for a few weeks in Sydney and the last thing she would ever have expected is to get stuck.

The original plan was to attend camp and work through her recovery aiming to play for the Blues again in 2020. Then came the border closures.

"It is crazy, you don't expect a global pandemic to happen," Boyle said. "We had an Origin camp in March, so I drove to Sydney to attend and catch up with some people. Then it all hit pretty badly.

"Our camp got cancelled and the restrictions came in. I ended up staying down in Sydney to work as a nanny for [BaiMed Physio] Michael Baines, our Origin physio, and his

wife's kids while they worked.

"I got well

looked after there and I am back on track to play pretty soon. Taking a positive out of a negative, it helped in the recovery."

Boyle admits the down time was focused on getting her body prepared for the 2020 NRLW season, State of Origin and keeping a hopeful eye on the 2021 Rugby League World Cup in Europe.

While she didn't miss any football – she did in fact worry about the status of the NRLW. With so much uncertainty around the timelines, Australian Rugby League Commission Chair Peter V'Landys finally delivered the good news. The NRLW would be back in 2020.

"It is unreal to have the support from the NRL to get our game back. It means there is a fair bit of loyalty there to us and they are committed – we want to show everyone how much that means to us," Boyle said.

"It was tough earlier this year with everything in the air.

NRLW has done so much for women's sports and for us
who grew up loving rugby league dreaming of a chance to
play, and the past players before us who have built so much
momentum.

"Now we are back. Our pathways can continue to develop, and we can keep building rugby league – hopefully to possible expansion of the NRLW soon. And we have a World Cup next year. We just wanted to keep building.

"I am just excited to get back out there."

Boyle will return to the field with the Burleigh Bears before the 2020 NRLW season gets underway.





Other side of the fence

McCullough focuses on bringing down former club

ITTING from the comfort of his new lounge room, Knights hooker Andrew McCullough couldn't help but feel for his former Brisbane teammates when they were on the end of a 59-0 hiding from the Roosters a fortnight ago.

McCullough played more than 250 first grade games for the Queenslanders before Knights coach Adam O'Brien made the shrewd signing a month ago that saw the 30-year-old sign with the Novocastrians.

"I'd be a gutless sort of bloke if I wasn't," McCullough said last week when asked if he felt any sympathy for his old club.

"They've got some good people there and they've got the young players who haven't faced that sort of adversity before.

"That's one way to have a reality check about the ups and downs of football and it's not all scoring tries and getting in the paper.

"There's certainly a bad side of footy which they've soon realised."

However, there will be no room for sentiment when he aims to bring his former team undone in Thursday night's clash at Central Coast Stadium.

"I feel it's my previous club and I'm not in the space or bubble

there, I'm in this team and I'm just enjoying the moment here with these boys," he said.

McCullough admitted the opportunity to chase more game time with a new club was one of the main reasons for his move.

He wasn't going to be content sitting behind young guns Jake Turpin and Cory Paix although that would have been the comfortable option.

"I could have sat there at Brissy and been content, but the challenge here to come down and play good footy under a new coach and in a new team is exciting," he said.

"I think you have to look at a few things – the coach, the roster, the area – and [Newcastle] ticked all those boxes."

As the Knights continue to build to a level of play that is consistent with that of a potential top four side, the former Queensland State of Origin hooker knows he has a role to play.

And that requires working with some of the Knights' young talent.

"The good thing is there is plenty of depth," he said.

"But you've got to maintain those performances throughout the year and it's about the young guys trying to limit the gap between their best and worst games.

"I've got no doubt Adam's going to try and touch on that."

For those who don't remember, 'Hughesy' was the underrated player every successful team needs. The guy a superstar like Andrew Johns could throw the ball wide to for an inspirational run and quick play the ball when the team needed it most.

On the field, he was simply courageous, brave and committed to the cause. As the Knights club motto goes, he was the player everyone wanted to play with.

It's those very qualities that have surely helped him amidst the fight of his life.

After being diagnosed and having the tumour removed, he went through an extensive amount of radiation and chemotherapy which he responded well to. So far there has been no regrowth and he considers himself lucky just to be around and having regular scans, the latest of which came back clear.

Bravely, it was in his darkest hours that Hughes and his wife Kirralee decided they needed to start a charity to help people now and into the

future suffering

from the same horrific battle he was going through.

The Mark Hughes Foundation's mission is to raise awareness for brain cancer while raising funds to research the disease and support brain cancer patients and their families.

This year he's doing an amazing job at the forefront of Beanie For Brain Cancer Round so make sure you do your bit to help the many sufferers out there doing it tough and help in the fight against this disease.



Player movement picks up

Releases and signings galore as June 30 deadline nears

With the deadline approaching, a range of clubs have made significant moves to ensure they are best prepared for the remainder of the 2020 season.

Last week, the Bulldogs fast-tracked their signing of Luke Thompson from St Helens, with the British prop making his way to hotel quarantine in Melbourne. It's anticipated he'll be available in Round 8 or after as the 'Dogs look to work their way off the bottom end of the ladder.

The Broncos have moved to secure Kiwi hooker Issac Luke after the departure of Andrew McCullough and injury to Jake Turpin. The move suits Luke's family circumstances, and with Ben Hunt seemingly shifting to relief rake for the Dragons, it increases Luke's chance of game time.

Other key moves in recent days saw the Rabbitohs release Bryson Goodwin - he returns to Cronulla after stints at the Bunnies, Warrington and Canterbury. The Sharks also picked up former Cowboys and Dragons winger Nene Macdonald during the week.

The Wests Tigers released Corey Thompson early in the week as well, with the former Bulldog now off to the Gold Coast - coach Justin Holbrook bringing him straight in as the Titans look to cover for various injury and form issues.

Re-signings and retirements were also on the agenda, with Jayson Bukuya from Cronulla retiring from the game after 12 seasons, while South Sydney have re-signed young pair Jaxson Paulo and Lachlan Ilias for two more seasons.

In weeks prior, Ben Te'o rejoined the Broncos after a stint in rugby, while the Warriors acquired Poasa Faumasili (Roosters) on a loan deal and also signed Jack Murchie from the Raiders.

Agent accreditation cancelled

Disciplinary proceedings have concluded against player agent Isaac Moses

On Tuesday, the NRL announced that following the conclusion of disciplinary proceedings, the accreditation of NRL player agent Isaac Moses has been cancelled.

It was found he was in breach of his obligations as an Accredited Agent in 2017 when he procured and assisted a client - former Eels prop TIm Mannah - to give false and misleading evidence to an NRL Integrity Unit investigation.

"Player agents have a very influential role in the game and with the players they represent. Where agents fail to adhere to the standards expected of them, we will intervene to take action under the NRL Rules," said NRL Interim CEO, Andrew Abdo.

"That is what we have done in this case after a thorough investigation by the League's Integrity & Compliance Unit."

Moses has the right to apply to appeal the decision to an indepedent Appeals Committee, and the cancellation of his accreditation will not apply pending such an appeal.

McCullough looks to heap further misery on former side

Anthony Seibold admitted during the week that he regrets letting Andrew McCullough leave. By Friday morning he may regret it even more as the former Broncos rake looks to continue his strong form at Newcastle.

The Knights were outclassed by the Storm early last week, falling to a 18-0 deficit. While a disappointing 26-12 defeat ensued, it is a credit to the coaching of Adam O'Brien that Newcastle were able to peg their way back to within one try of Melbourne.

The Knights of old would have collapsed under such pressure – you only have to look at their 54-10 thumping at the hands of Penrith last year.

They are bolstered up front by the returns of Alex Glenn and Tevita Pangai-Junior though, with the former adding some much needed experience alongside new recruit Ben Te'o. Issac Luke is also a chance of making his club debut after being named on the extended bench.

Who to watch: The match-up in the centres sees two players at the opposite ends of their careers battle it out. Bradman Best is the talk of the NRL. Five tries, nine tackle busts and three line breaks from just five games will do that to you. The best is yet to come from the 18-year old – a scary prospect for the rest of the competition and his opposite number this week.

Darius Boyd turned back the clock with one of his best performances of recent memory last week against Manly. Boyd, unlike Best, is nearing the end of his career having played 322 games, represented his country and state at the highest level. The ultimate professional, Boyd will have to make sure his contact is strong this week against the imposing Best. The 18-year old may give up plenty of games of experience but he more than makes up for it with his size and tackle-busting ability.

Favourite: Newcastle are well-backed to continue Brisbane's woes.

Tip: To be honest, I think the Broncos would have preferred it if the Knights had won last week. Instead, they were handed a reality check and will be even more switched on. **Knights by 20**.

Winning form clashes on Friday night as the South Sydney Rabbitohs look to kick into gear after their first win since the resumption of play, as they take on the New Zealand Warriors - who are looking to put inconsistencies behind them.

The Rabbitohs' 32-12 victory over the Gold Coast Titans last weekend at Bankwest Stadium saw them perform strongly through the first half, scoring 24 points within as many minutes to start the game.

Latrell Mitchell put in his best performance at fullback to date and was a massive part of the Bunnies' efforts during that opening 25 minutes and indeed throughout the contest. The concern though for Souths, was that they were able to score rapidly in the first 25 minutes but then didn't score again until shortly before half time.

Coach Wayne Bennett has made no changes to the 17 he named to take the field last weekend, although he has named James Roberts on the reserves bench. Roberts was originally named to take the field last weekend but was withdrawn through injury midweek.

The Warriors have again showed their quality and attacking prowess after a 37-26 victory over the Cowboys in Gosford on Friday night. The Warriors have mixed their form up significantly since the resumption of play with victories over the Dragons and Cowboys split by a poor effort against the Panthers. Last weekend, they were good in attack, putting up their highest score since the opening round of the 2019 season.

Concerningly though for the Warriors is that despite their high score, their defence has been questionable, having given up 52 points in the past two matches - something the Rabbitohs could seize upon.

The Warriors' attack was at their entertaining best running in seven tries to five which included a hat-trick for Peta Hiku who was a late inclusion into the Warriors side. The Warriors take an unchanged 17 into this week's match.

Who to watch: Rabbitohs fullback Latrell Mitchell is one of the most scrutinised players in the competition with expectations on his performance set extremely high. His move to fullback as been an interesting journey with a poor start to his season at fullback, then the adverse attention during the COVID-19 lockdown, followed by the improved performance last weekend. If Mitchell can find his spark at the back yet again this round, then it'll be the Warriors who will be under the microscope as to how they stop him.

Five-eighth Kodi Nikorima as always had big wraps on him and had a potential level set very high, but into his sixth season as an NRL player the expectations on the Warriors stand-off are still yet to be met. A strong performance against South Sydney could help his cause. One of the strongest assets that Nikorima possesses is his running game which doesn't get seen enough. Possessing speed and footwork, Nikorima can have defensive lines going every which way and if he turns on the running game, he could leave the Bunnies' big men struggling to get to him.

Favourite: Despite both being last start winners, the Rabbitohs have been installed as strong favourites given the nature of their last victory and the strengths of the respective lineups.

My tip: It's hard to look past South Sydney. The Rabbitohs were strong last weekend and will be looking to grow on that. The issues that the Warriors still have in defence could be a big downfall for them, particularly if the Bunnies' attack is strong. The Warriors could match with Souths early but there looks to be a difference in quality all over the park. Rabbitohs by 16.

Panthers on the prowl for big scalp as Storm roll into town.

A quality Friday night encounter awaits viewers in round 6 with the third placed Melbourne Storm rolling into town to do battle with the fifth placed Penrith Panthers at Campbelltown Stadium.

The Panthers have looked in nice touch since the competition reboot with a draw against the Knights and a commanding victory over the Warriors followed up last weekend with a strong showing against the top of the table Eels. Ivan Cleary's men looked well on top in the opening hour against their Western Sydney rivals last Friday night before letting in three tries down their left edge in a six minute window to cost themselves the competition points.

In a worrying sign for Cleary, that marked the second time in three weeks the mountain men have given up strong leads after giving up a 14 point lead to an injury hit Knights two weeks prior.

Its mixed news for the Panthers on the injury front this week.

Back-rower Kurt Capewell has been ruled out for ten weeks with a knee injury he picked up in the opening minutes against the Eels. The former Shark will be replaced on the right edge by promising youngster Liam Martin who enjoyed a breakout rookie season last year with Billy Burns coming onto the bench. The good news is first choice fullback Dylan Edwards returns from a hamstring injury in what will be his first appearance of the 2020 season.

Craig Bellamy's Storm outfit roll into town following back to back 14 point victories over the Rabbitohs and Knights in the last fortnight and will be shooting for three straight against a team they have dominated in recent years, winning 7 of their last 8 clashes.

Bellamy has made no changes to the team that accounted for the Knights last week. Christian Welch has been named in the front-row with Brandon Smith on the bench in the official teams named on Tuesday, but expect the two to switch places on the team sheet an hour before kick-off as has been the case the last two weeks.

Injured half Jahrome Hughes has been named in the reserves after breaking his hand two weeks ago but he's expected to be at least another week away with Ryley Jacks to feed the scrum again this week.

Who to watch: Returning to some of his best form since representing New South Wales four years ago, winger Josh Mansour has been a major reason the Panthers lead the league in both total metres gained and post contact metres. Averaging 204 metres per game, Mansour is a pro at taking valuable metres coming out of trouble early in sets. His strength often sees him hit the ground on his belly with an ensuing quick play the ball getting his team on an early roll. Scoring in his past two encounters, 'the Sauce' will be looking to add to his personal tally against the Storm having crossed for three tries in their past four games.

After being dominated through the middle against the Raiders three weeks ago, Coach Bellamy reacted swiftly in giving regular super-sub **Brandon Smith** an opportunity to start. The move was made in order to help gain some early ascendancy around the ruck amidst the new six again rule which many believed would halt the Storm's dominance. The move seems to have worked a treat with the Storm again looking strong through the middle third and the kiwi international's bullocking runs and quick play the balls a key factor.

Favourite: Melbourne are considered strong favourites to make it three wins on the trot.

Tip: This looks an intriguing Friday night contest and one which will shed further light on the Panthers premiership credentials. They will need to prove they can play out the 80 minutes, but if they can remain switched on for the duration they look a big chance of causing a boil over here. Look for the likes of Fisher-Harris and Kikau to bend the Melbourne defensive line, with Koroisau and Cleary playing nice and direct on the back of their big men. Panthers by 4.

Cellar dwellers face off in must-win encounter.

Managing just five wins combined over the past twelve months, the Gold Coast Titans and St George Illawarra Dragons will be desperate to come away with two premiership points on Saturday afternoon.

Unable to keep up with the Rabbitohs during the opening quarter of last Saturday's 32-12 loss at Bankwest Stadium, the Gold Coast Titans have shown moments of promise since the season resumption.

Going toe-to-toe with opposition teams for long stretches only to concede multiple tries in quick succession, new coach Justin Holbrook will be eager to gauge the reaction of his players as they face a Dragons team coming off their first win of the season.

Naming former Wests Tigers utility Corey Thompson at fullback for his club debut, the ensuing backline reshuffle will see Phillip Sami shift to the wing and Brian Kelly move to centre in place of Dale Copley (ankle).

Breaking through for a sorely needed 30-16 win against the Sharks last Sunday, the St George Illawarra Dragons will be hoping to continue a dominant record over the Titans in recent times.

Winning seven out of ten clashes during Paul McGregor's tenure as coach, the joint venture will need to overcome a poor record at Suncorp Stadium which has yielded just two wins from their past 13 visits.

Keeping the faith with the same squad that triumphed at Campbelltown Stadium six days earlier, Ben Hunt will wear the number 14 jersey following a confidence-building performance as an impact hooker against Cronulla.

Saturday afternoon will be the first time the two teams have met at Suncorp Stadium since the Titans hosted the Dragons in their first premiership match back in 2007.

Who to watch: Returning to the NRL following an 18-month stint as a Mormon missionary, former Melbourne outside back Young Tonumaipea has made an immediate impact for his new club. Averaging 120 metres and 14 runs per game over the past fortnight, the 27-year-old Samoan international has relished the stability of playing at right centre having deviated throughout the backline during his five seasons under Craig Bellamy. Hoping to secure his long-term future after penning a train-and-trial deal during the competition shutdown, Tonumaipea looms as an underrated player capable of paving the way for Justin Holbrook to lead the Titans out of the doldrums.

Providing the Dragons with a much-needed injection of attacking spark last Sunday, Matt Dufty will be looking to recapture the form that saw him light up the NRL two years ago. Enduring a difficult time over the past 18 months with various spine combinations and emerging youngsters blocking his path to the number one jersey, the 24-year-old speedster produced one of the best performances of his career against the Sharks with a try, two assists and 184 running metres. Attracting interest from the Titans for an immediate release, look for Dufty to build on last week's performance and affirm his place as the Dragons' first-choice fullback.

Favourite: Having broken through for their first win since the final round of last season, the Dragons are expected to account for their work-in-progress opponents.

Tip: If the Dragons can build on last week's performance they should get the job done. If the Titans can grind away for 80 minutes they are capable of pulling off an upset. **Dragons by 4** (with very little confidence).

Grand final foes look to bounce back.

After starting the season with promise of bigger things, the Wests Tigers and North Queensland Cowboys will be looking to respond from back-to-back losses at Campbelltown Stadium on Saturday evening.

Producing a much-improved performance against the Raiders only to fall short 14-6 last Saturday, the Wests Tigers will be hoping to build on a run of five wins from their past six clashes against their 2005 grand final opponents.

Sitting in ninth position with two wins over the first five rounds, coach Michael Maguire will be looking to avoid a third consecutive loss and improve upon the side's below par record at Campelltown Stadium that has generated three wins from their past 12 appearances.

Losing former New Zealand international Russell Packer for two weeks due to a careless high tackle, Robert Jennings, Matthew Eisenhuth and debutant Sam McIntyre have all been promoted into the top 17.

Suffering a high scoring 37-26 loss to the Warriors last Friday on the Central Coast, the North Queensland Cowboys will be chasing only their third win in Sydney since qualifying for the grand final three years ago.

Winning their past two appearances at Campbelltown Stadium by eight points, coach Paul Green will be demanding a much stronger defensive showing on Saturday evening after leaking 31.5 points per game over the past fortnight.

Losing marquee signing Valentine Holmes (ankle), stand-in captain Jordan McLean (calf) and rookie forward Tom Gilbert (suspension) in the aftermath of last week's loss, Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow will start at fullback, former Bulldogs lower grader Connelly Lemuelu will make his debut on the wing, while Ben Hampton, Corey Jenson and Peter Hola all come onto the bench.

Who to watch: Signing with the joint venture midway through 2018 in order to alleviate the Bulldogs' salary cap woes, Moses Mbye has struggled to recapture the form that saw him appointed as club captain. Ranking among the least involved representative-calibre players so far this season, the 26-year-old Queensland utility has averaged fewer than 60 metres per game since the season resumed. Initially joining the Tigers as a fullback having made his name in the halves, look for Mbye to go after the football on Saturday night as the Tigers strive to improve their 2020 win-loss record to 50 per cent.

Spending three years in the top grade with the Tigers between 2017-2019, Cowboys recruit Esan Marsters will be aiming to get one over his former teammates on Saturday evening. Playing 61 games for the joint venture while representing the Cook Islands and New Zealand along the way, the 23-year-old centre has yet to reach the height of his powers in Townsville, despite retaining the skills that rank him among the league's premier offloaders. Yet to score a try for his new club after five rounds, Marsters looms as a player capable of revitalising the Cowboys following two disappointing performances in consecutive weeks.

Favourite: Having led last year's grand finalists for much of last week's clash, the Tigers are favoured to prove too strong for the injury-hit Cowboys.

Tip: While neither side will be featuring beyond the regular season based on recent form, the Tigers should get the job done despite the best efforts of Jason Taumalolo. **Wests Tigers by 6**.

Back to back premiers clash with undefeated heavyweights in match of the round.

In a contender for the game of 2020 so far, it's Easts hosting Parramatta, however due to the NRL's strict biosecurity measures the game will be played at BankWest Stadium. The Roosters are coming off a convincing win over the Bulldogs while the Eels dug deep last week to finish well against a strong Penrith outfit.

Jared Waerea-Hargreaves has been named to make his return after being a late scratching due to injury against the Bulldogs. The move pushes Lindsay Collins back to the bench, which sees back rower Sitili Tupouniua drop out of the 17. Trent Robinson has also named Sam Verrills in the number 14 jumper; however he was swapped with veteran Mitchell Aubusson last week at the 11th hour and Robinson could do the same.

The Eels haven't made any unforced changes, but former Rooster Kane Evans will miss the clash with his former club after taking the early guilty plea during the week resulting in a one-week suspension. Oregon Kaufusi will replace him on the bench.

Parramatta have turned in inconsistent performances over the last 2 weeks, fading in and out of games much too regularly. Against Manly, they scored all their tries over a 10-minute period while the span narrowed to 6 minutes against the Panthers. Their performance this week is going to have to be one where they apply themselves over the 80 minutes and attempt to grind their way to victory, as the Roosters are unlikely to allow the Eels to run in short bursts of tries as they have become accustomed to doing.

The Tricolours have been simply flawless since the competition resumed. They have won their 3 games by a combined margin of 129-18 and with the exception of a short lapse to begin the second half last week have looked streets better than their opposition.

Having said that, Parramatta will be a different beast to the teams they have easily dispatched of in 2020. The Roosters have yet to beat a team currently sitting in the top 8, losing to both Penrith and Manly before the season went on hiatus. Many have pencilled the Roosters in as premiership favourites after their strong resumption, whether that is warranted or not will be revealed on Saturday night.

Who to watch: Roosters custodian James Tedesco turned in one of the great performances against the Bulldogs, scoring a hat-trick of tries and setting up 2 more as well as running for 231 metres and breaking 10 tackles. No disrespect to the Bulldogs but the Eels are much more staunch opposition, and if they can limit Teddy's impact like they did Tom Trbojevic a couple of weeks ago they'll go a long way to winning this game.

From one former Wests Tiger to another, Eels halfback Mitchell Moses has been in scintillating form that has seen him mentioned in the origin selection discussion. One of the common criticisms of him is that he is flying when his team is on the front foot but goes missing when his team is losing the battle of momentum. Last week, his side was down 10-0 with 20 to go. The Eels persisted and got it back to 10 apiece. Enter Mitch Moses, who put in a grubber that sat up perfectly for Ryan Matterson to score the try to put the Eels ahead and ultimately give them the win. Moses will need to be at his best and play a controlling role against the Roosters to give them the best chance of continuing their undefeated run.

Favourite: The Roosters are clear favourites to continue their strong run.

Tip: There's a reason this is being touted as the game of the season so far and come 7:30pm on Saturday you won't want to be anywhere else. The Eels turned in arguably their most impressive performance of 2020 last week and will have 3 extra days than their opposition to prepare. I think they've come a long way since last year and will be by far the toughest opposition for the Bondi boys, but I honestly cannot see anyone beating the Roosters at the moment. **Roosters by 4**.

Premiership threats test their credentials.

The Canberra Raiders and the Manly Sea Eagles are both coming off round 5 wins last week. Canberra managed to beat the Wests Tigers in what was a tight encounter, seeing the men from the nation's capital win 14-6. The loss to the Knights in round 4 and then a close game against a side they were expected to beat comfortably in round 5 could be the sign of a rough patch for the Raiders and they will be looking to get back to the form that we all know they can produce this weekend. Manly looked all but gone in their round 5 battle against the Brisbane Broncos. They were down 18-0 in the first half, before putting on 20 unanswered points to win 20-18. Playing against an understrength Brisbane, the game was a little closer than what the Sea Eagles would have liked. Similar to Canberra, Manly went down in their round 4 clash as well, despite the controversy surrounding a forward pass decision late in the game. Both of these sides are showing a few signs of being shaky recently and both will be looking to pick up their form a little this week against quality opposition.

Canberra come into this clash with a few changes in their team from the round 5 team who faced Wests Tigers. Corey Horsburgh comes back in as a welcome inclusion for Canberra at lock. This change pushed Iosia Soliola back to the front row. Despite starting the game against the Tigers last week, the change also pushes Dunamis Lui out of the 17 and back to the reserves at 18th man. Hudson Young comes onto the bench for the green machine, which means Bailey Simonsson is also pushed to the reserves.

Manly also come into this game with changes and an amount more significant than that of Canberra's. Moses Suli is out and will be replaced in the centres by Brendan Elliot who has proven a capable replacement in the backline on multiple occasions. Martin Taupau is out with a thumb injury which saw him leave the game early last round. Addin Fonua-Blake will be promoted off the bench and start in place of Taupau. Curtis Sironen is back and will replace Corey Waddell in the second row. Morgan Boyle will come onto the bench for this match.

Each team are fresh off a win in round 5 and will be looking to continue their winning ways in round 6. Despite some shaky form from both of the teams that will be lining up against each other on Sunday afternoon, expect this to be a terrific game with some quality play. Both sides came into the season as premiership threats and it will be great to see the two of them face off.

Who to watch: Josh Papalii has started 2020 exactly how he left 2019 - in great form. His runs are extremely damaging to opposition and, for a prop forward, he isn't a stranger to the try line. Look for Papalii to potentially have a large impact on the Raiders winning the middle battle. If Papalii can get on top, he may help open up the game for Canberra and the likes of Charnze Nicoll-Kolkstad and Jack Wighton.

This game will likely be first won in the middle of the park and after starting off the bench last week, look for **Addin Fonua-Blake** to be at his damaging best come Sunday afternoon. Fonua-Blake can be a real handful and will be a big part of Manly's success if they are to win over the middle in the game.

Favourite: The Raiders are better back to win this one.

Tip: This game is a tough one to pick and it should be a tight one as well. The loss of Martin Taupau is a big one for Manly and they may struggle to gain ascendency in the middle of the park without him. The Canberra pack should be too strong and their backs should be able to capitalise on it. The game will be tight, but Canberra should edge it here. **Raiders by 6**.

Sydney battlers look to build confidence.

Coming into Round 6 with one win respectively, the Cronulla Sharks and Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be looking to build confidence when they face off at Bankwest Stadium on Sunday evening.

Suffering a disappointing 30-16 defeat at the hands of the Dragons last Sunday, the Cronulla Sharks will be aiming to continue a strong record over the blue and whites having won five of their past six meetings.

Yet to produce a consistent performance across 80 minutes this season, coach John Morris will be stressing the importance of maintaining intensity after squandering leads shortly before halftime in three of their past four matches.

Retaining William Kennedy at fullback in place of Matt Moylan (hamstring tightness), Siosifa Talakai and club debutant Royce Hunt have been named on the bench. Journeyman Bryson Goodwin is in line to make his first appearance for the club since 2008 after being named as part of the extended squad.

Blown off the park in a one-sided 42-6 defeat at the hands of the Roosters on Monday night, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be desperate to atone against their southern Sydney opponents.

Averaging just over ten points per game - the worst attacking record of any team after five rounds - coach Dean Pay will have his team focussed on avoiding another slow start after conceding four tries in the first 25 minutes against last year's premiers.

Unable to call upon veteran prop Aiden Tolman due to COVID-19 protocols, try-scoring weapon Reimis Smith returns from a one-match ban at the expense of Nick Meaney, while Kerrod Holland comes onto the bench in a utility role.

Who to watch: Making an eye-catching return three years after his last appearance in the NRL, Cronulla forward Siosifa Talakai will be determined to make the most of his second chance in the top grade. Touted as a star of the future after representing the Junior Kiwis and debuting with South Sydney while still a teenage, the 23-year-old has spent several years in the rugby league wilderness before earning his way back as an impact forward with the Newtown squad that claimed the State Championship last season. Running for 75 metres in 19 minutes of game time in the Sharks lone win this season, look for Talakai to build on those numbers as he strives to establish himself as a permanent fixture in John Morris' squad.

Producing a number of slashing runs during the loss to the reigning premiers last Monday, rookie Jake Averillo served as a rare source of light for the struggling club. Named to start on the wing after coming off the bench as replacement playmaker earlier in the season, the 19-year-old speedster has been touted as a star of the future for the Bulldogs after progressing through the lower grades at the club. Making seven tackle breaks and over 140 metres with the ball last week, look for the Bulldogs to provide Averillo with plenty of ball as they fight to avoid the ignominy of finishing the round on the bottom of the ladder.

Favourite: While both sides have struggled before and after the competition shutdown, the Sharks are expected to have too much experience for the out-of-form Bulldogs.

Tip: Despite conceding seven tries in both of their losses since the season resumed, the Bulldogs have shown that when they are able to grind away and play on their terms, they are more than capable of causing an upset. **Bulldogs by 4**.
