

THE DOWNS FOX

HE HAD A BRAIN FOR RUGBY LEAGUE, CREATIVE, SPEEDY, SUCCESSFUL AND SPENT MOST OF HIS LIFE WITH A BULLET IN HIS CHEST. HE WAS **DUNCAN THOMPSON**.

Thompson was born in Warwick, Queensland on March 14, 1895. He joined the Australian Bank of Commerce in 1911. While at Ipswich he represented Combined Country in 1913 and Queensland in 1915.

In 1915 as War broke out, Thompson wanted to serve his country, but his mother prohibited it. In 1916, his job transferred him to Sydney, where he was immediately snapped up by the ailing Norths.

At the end of 1916, Duncan returned to Queensland where he enlisted with the Australian Imperial Forces. He was shot through the chest in the battle of Dernancourt in 1917, but miraculously survived.

He was informed by doctors that a bullet was still lodged in his chest and would no longer be able to play sport.

Thompson continued playing, lining up for Ipswich and Queensland in 1919. He earned a place in the first Australian Test team to tour New Zealand. On tour Thompson replaced Arthur Halloway in the Third Test, which Australia won 34-23. He was then selected at halfback for the fourth test, which Australia won 32-2.

He relocated to Newcastle in 1920 and played for Newcastle Wests before moving back to Norths. Thompson captained NSW in his first game against his beloved Queensland in 1921.

In 1921, Norths finished the season undefeated, claiming their first premiership. At the end of the 1921 season, Thompson was selected in the Australian squad to tour England.

In 1922 Norths were sporting the most impressive backline in the competition, with Harold Horder, Cec Blinkhorn, Duncan Thompson, Herman Peters, Frank Rule and Dallas Hodgins. Norths annihilated Glebe 35-3 in the 1922 Premiership Final.

In 1923, Norths struggled to dominate the competition, but it was their Round 14 clash with Glebe at the SCG that proved most damaging. Thompson was sent off for allegedly kicking Glebe forward Tom McGrath. The NSWRL judiciary found Thompson guilty and suspended him for the rest of the season.

Spectators claimed the incident was an accident. Thompson was held back illegally after passing the ball and was trying to free himself when he accidentally struck McGrath in the face.

Thompson appealed the suspension and it was reduced but not overturned. Thompson was so angered by the decision that he vowed never to play in Sydney again.

Thompson moved back to Toowoomba and opened a sports store. Despite Thompson's self-exile from the Sydney competition, he was still selected in the last two tests against England of 1924. Thompson played for Queensland again in 1924 and 1925.

Thompson's arrival to Toowoomba brought immediate success. In 1924 he played for Toowoomba on a contract worth 400 pounds a year. In his first two years there, Toowoomba were deemed the greatest team in Rugby League.

In 1924 Toowoomba beat England (23-20), Ipswich (21-10, 31-8 and 33-18), NSW (16-0) and Victoria (47-18). In 1925 the undefeated run continued with victories over Brisbane (30-7 and 22-3), Ipswich (18-13, 51-17 and 3 all) and New Zealand (16-14). The final match of the year was against the 1925 undefeated Sydney premiers Souths, to declare the greatest team in Australia.

Toowoomba won 12-5.

1925 saw Toowoomba claim the first Bulimba Cup, a competition played between representative sides from Brisbane, Ipswich and Toowoomba. They won every honour that was available to them. At the end of the 1925 season Thompson retired from Rugby League and took up tennis, lawn bowls and golf (where he had a handicap of 3).

He returned to national service in the Second World War serving as an amenities officer in Townsville and Papua New Guinea.

In 1951 Thompson accepted a role as Toowoomba coach, instantly leading Toowoomba to six consecutive Bulimba Cup titles from 1951-56.

Thompson gave away his coaching role to take on administrative duties with the QRL, before becoming a Test selector in the late 1950's.

In 1960 Duncan Thompson was awarded an MBE for services to Rugby League. He became a respected commentator on the Rugby League world for many years during and after his role as Test selector.

On May 17, 1980 Duncan Thompson passed away at a hospital in Auchenflower.

In his final years, he remained involved in the game, helping then rookie coach Wayne Bennett as he transitioned from being a player.

Every decade from the 1930's up to and including the 1990's he was regarded by journalists and past players alike as the games greatest ever halfback. It took the emergence of Immortal Andrew Johns to replace him as the best halfback.

In 2008, during the game's centenary celebrations, Thompson was named as one of the 100 greatest players in the games history.

Thompson is one of the few sportsmen to have two grandstands named after him, one at Toowoomba and the other at North Sydney Oval.

His sports store closed not long after he

NEWCASTLE'S PIONEER

REMEMBERING STANLEY CARPENTER AND HIS 1908 NEWCASTLE REBELS

Stanley Franzien Carpenter was born in 1879 and grew up in the Newcastle region with his brother Leslie (whom he would play football alongside) and sister Lily.

Stan started his Rugby Union career as a junior with the Carlton club based in central Newcastle where he became friends with Pat Walsh, who would go on to achieve success in three football codes across four different countries. Carpenter's size and strength for a hooker (he weighed 80kgs and was 178cms tall), from working in the coalmines in Newcastle and on the construction of the railway line near Dungog, saw him quickly become one of the premier forwards in Newcastle. After winning premierships at Carlton, Stan played for Central Newcastle, regularly earning representative honours.

In 1906 he married local girl Jean McDonald.

In early 1908, the New South Wales Rugby League was set to commence, but after talks to create a St. George side had broken down, League President Henry Hoyle decided to look outside Sydney for his competitions 8th side. After a failed attempt in February to form a Newcastle side, Hoyle returned in early April with greater success, thanks largely to a small group of players who were angry towards the Rugby Union after the treatment of local Test star Pat Walsh, who had been dropped from the state and test sides for seemingly political reasons. This group was led by Stan Carpenter.

The Newcastle club was formed and they agreed to adopt the red and white striped jumper of the Carlton club, as a tribute to Walsh who was arguably their best player. Walsh himself had left the country a long time prior, winning a premiership in Australian Rules football in an expatriate competition in South Africa before returning to Rugby Union in New Zealand.

Carpenter was elected as the club captain for its inaugural season, a testimony to the great respect he earned from the players in Newcastle who joined the League, most of whom he'd only ever played against.

Newcastle's first game was against Glebe, who were considered the best team in the competition based on their overwhelming success in the Union game prior to changing codes. Glebe had to work very hard for their 8-5 victory.

Two days later, Carpenter captained a Newcastle representative side who suffered a heavy loss to the New Zealand All Golds side who were returning home after their tour of Great Britain. Carpenter took on the All Golds again just 3 days later as he captained the Northern Districts team. His side was again on the receiving end of a heavy loss. He led Newcastle in two losses against the visiting New Zealand Maori team before earning selection in the New South Wales side for their second match against Queensland. Despite playing well in a convincing victory, Carpenter was not selected for the state side again in 1908.

With James Giltinan successfully luring Pat Walsh from New Zealand Rugby Union across to Rugby League, Walsh lined up alongside Carpenter for the first time in years for Newcastle's last two games of the year against the two competition leaders Eastern Suburbs and South Sydney. The impressive Eastern Suburbs side were unstoppable, with star recruit Dally Messenger scoring 18 of his sides 34 points to Newcastle's 17, which pushed Newcastle out of the top 4 and the finals. The next week saw South Sydney work very hard to come away with an 8-3 win.

Carpenter played in a Possibles v Probables match to determine which players would travel to Great Britain for the inaugural Kangaroo's tour. Carpenter was selected as the tours second hooker, however he suffered a broken leg and had to withdraw from the tour.

The 1909 season saw Newcastle get off to a slow start, winning 1 of their first 4 games, before they almost pulled off a miraculous victory over the visiting New Zealand side. The strong performance lifted the side, who went on to beat Glebe 26-8 and Western Suburbs 34-0 in successive weeks. Carpenter's form again earnt him state selection, in a game against the Kiwi's and in 3 more games against the returning New Zealand Maori side. But most importantly, he represented Australia in all 3 test matches against the Maori.

Upon returning to club football, Newcastle pulled off arguably their greatest victory when they beat the undefeated South Sydney 5-0 in the last game of the year before the finals. The win secured Newcastle's place in the finals, however they were trounced a week later against South Sydney 20-0.

Carpenter's last match of the year was for

Carpenter's last match of the year was for the Kangaroo's in a hastily organised fourth exhibition game against the Wallabies to be played straight after the 1909 final between Balmain and South Sydney.

The Newcastle side decided to leave the NSWRL and form its own local competition. Carpenter joined the South Newcastle side.

After such a stellar season, Carpenter was eagerly awaiting the new season with high hopes, however in March 1910, his young wife Jean passed away at their family home in Newcastle. Despite the tragic loss, Stanley changed clubs, turning out for the newly created Eastern Suburbs Newcastle side, earning representative honours for Newcastle and Northern Districts against the visiting Great Britain team.

From 1911 to 1914, he continued his stellar representative career, representing Newcastle, Northern Districts, Hunter & Northern Districts and NSW Country against touring nations, interstate sides and other local representative teams. Meanwhile at club level, he achieved premiership success with Eastern Suburbs in 1913.

Within two weeks after war broke about, the widowed Stanley Franzien Carpenter enlisted with the Australian Imperial Force in the 2nd Battalion Infantry before transferring to the Medical Corps as a stretcher bearer.

Carpenter was part of the infamous mass of Australian soldiers who landed at Gallipoli on April 25, 1915 with the third wave of troops. On the very next day, Carpenter and fellow stretcher bearer, Edward Roberts, travelled along the beach by foot under heavy fire, looking for wounded men. They came across a boat that had been beached since the landing some 30 odd hours earlier. All of the men inside had suffered gunshot wounds, with all

but five of them killed. Carpenter and Roberts waded and swam to the boat and rescued the survivors, carrying them ashore, one-by-one, to the aid station while constantly being fired upon by sniper fire. Carpenter's bravery was observed by well known Australian War Correspondent Charles Bean and Lieutenant Colonel Braund. Braund was one of only two serving Australian politicians who died while serving in World War I. The other was former NSWRL secretary Edward Larkin. This incident was reported back to the Australian media by several soldiers.

Braund and later Lieutenant Herrod nominated Carpenter and Roberts for the Distinguished Conduct Medal. Both were later recommended for a Military Cross for their heroic actions.

Carpenter then was transferred to the battle in Pozieres in mid-1916, the scene of one of the most horrific trench battles during the war. It was while serving here that Major General Walker recommended Carpenter for the Victoria Cross, the first Australian to receive such a recommendation in the Great War. Carpenter instead received the Distinguished Conduct Medal and a Military Cross:

"For conspicuous bravery during protracted operations under heavy shell fire. Time after time he went into 'No Man's Land' to collect and tend wounded and it was owing to his fine courage that so few of his Battalion's wounded were missing.

The Major General also added in his recommendation that "Officers and men are unanimous in their expression of admiration for him."

Despite his heroics and constantly seeing death and destruction around him, he still ensured that every year while he was on duty, he placed a family notice in the Sydney Morning Herald dedicated to the memory of his wife on the anniversary of her passing. Surprisingly enough, Carpenter met fellow serviceman Pat Walsh while they were both on active duty and spent some time convalescing near the end of the war.

In 1919, Stan's sister Lily passed away after a severe bout of influenza.

Carpenter remained on active duty for the duration of the war before finally returning home in 1920, where he immediately joined South Newcastle. Later in the year he married Olla Stokes and they moved into their own home in Kempsey, ending his career in the Newcastle competition. Two years later they had a baby boy, also named Stanley.

Stan Carpenter went back to playing Rugby League and despite his age and absence from the game, managed to gain representative honours for the Northern Districts before eventually retiring at the age of 43 and took up coaching junior teams before moving on to senior coaching roles.

Tragedy struck his life once again when in 1933, his son was riding his bike home from school and was hit by a vehicle, killing him instantly, just 2 days after his 11th birthday.

Carpenter slowly removed himself from all forms of sport and lived a quiet life with his wife Olla up until his death on May 31, 1962, aged 82.



Penrith would have learnt a lot from last week's 20-12 win over Brisbane.

Whether it was fatigue or complacency, the Panthers lacked their usually intensity up front and will be out for an improved performance against Newcastle.

The Panthers could be set for a double boost ahead of Thursday night's clash with fullback Dylan Edwards and hooker Apisai Koroisau both named in the extended squad.

The addition of Edwards in particular would be timely given Paul Momirovski failed to have his dangerous contact charge downgraded, seeing him suspended for three weeks.

If Edwards is fit it will see Stephen Crichton freed up to move back to the centres after a mixed three weeks deputising for the first-choice fullback.

Crichton warmed into the role in the later stages of all three games but at times was caught out of position or came up with the wrong options in attack.

Edwards, widely considered the fittest of all the Panthers, was in career-best form before suffering a broken hand.

Koroisau, on the other hand, was fulfilling his role perfectly prior to his wrist injury – chiming in and out of the attack when needed.

Mitch Kenny is a handy replacement and a workhorse in the middle but Koroisau's deception out of dummy-half is crucial if either Nathan Cleary or Jarome Luai have an off night.

The Panthers were widely tipped to take care of Newcastle the last time these two sides met, with an injury-ravaged Knights team falling to an early deficit.

However, the injection of youth off the bench in Brodie Jones, Tex Hoy and Chris Randall helped the Knights surge back and claim a 14-all draw.

Adam O'Brien will be hoping a similar resilience powers his team to an upset victory on Thursday.

Kalyn Ponga was simply outstanding last week, popping miraculous late passes which were simply undefendable to snatch a 26-22 win over Cronulla.

Ponga's individual brilliance shapes as Newcastle's best chance of breaking a Penrith team that just forgotten how to lose.

Who to watch: The battle between young centres Matt Burton and Bradman Best should be an interesting one, regardless of whether they line up against each other or not. Both are well-developed for their age, fast improving when it comes to dealing with the physicality of the league. Best in particular is well beyond his years in that capacity, with his size and strength allowing him to palm even the most experienced defenders off. Penrith are so strong at sticking to their systems in defence that it will require individual brilliance to crack the table toppers. Ponga, as mentioned earlier, is capable of doing just that but the tackle-busting Best will also prove a handful. Burton, on the other hand, has added motivation to perform with Momirovski sidelined. If he continues to lift Ivan Cleary may have no choice but to keep him in the starting team.

Favourite: You can't go past the undefeated Panthers.

My tip: Newcastle do have genuine game breakers capable of bursting the Panthers' bubble but last year's grand finalists are a class above, particularly in the halves. **Penrith by 16**.

Unlikely match-up looms as the dark horse clash of the round

The Gold Coast Titans will be looking to bounce back in a big way as they take on the high-flying South Sydney Rabbitohs on Friday evening at CBUS Super Stadium.

Gaining plenty of plaudits for their attacking prowess during the opening rounds of the season, the Gold Coast Titans will be determined to prove their premiership credentials against one of the heavyweights of the league.

Suffering a humbling 36-0 defeat at the hands of the Sea Eagles six days earlier in Mudgee, coach Justin Holbrook will be urging his players to move on from the disappointment of last week and focus on defeating a top eight team for the first time this season.

Sitting inside the top eight after six rounds for the first time since 2014, the Titans have been highly impressive with emphatic wins over the Broncos, Cowboys and Knights, while leaving a lot of room for improvement during losses against the Warriors, Raiders and Sea Eagles.

Gaining mixed news on the selection front with Anthony Don returning in place of Jonus Pearson on the wing, Queensland representative Tino Fa'asuamaleaui is set to miss the next fortnight after accepting an early guilty plea for a shoulder charge. Former Tigers forward Sam McIntyre is set to make his club debut off the bench.

Recording a memorable win in golden point last week, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be treating Friday night as a danger game.

Downing the Tigers 18-14 last Saturday after Tom Burgess powered his was to the try line in the 81st minute, coach Wayne Bennett will be wary of the Titans following the suspension of in-form fullback Latrell Mitchell until mid-May.

Holding a dominant record over their opponents with 10 wins from their past 12 clashes, as well as coming into the match with five consecutive victories at CBUS Super Stadium, the Rabbitohs have recovered from a poor opening night loss to the Storm before growing in confidence with five straight wins over the Sea Eagles, Roosters, Bulldogs, Broncos and Tigers.

Set to be without Mitchell (suspension) and Josh Mansour (hamstring), Alex Johnston will shift to fullback at fullback while emerging speedsters Jaxson Paulo and Steven Marsters will come into the backline. Keaon Koloamatangi returns from suspension in place of Jacob Host.

Who to watch: Embodying the improvements made at the Titans since the appointment of Justin Holbrook at the start of last year, outside back Corey Thompson has been one of the side's most consistent performers. Providing great service in the NRL and Super League since debuting in first grade back in 2014, the 30-year-old winger has averaged a try and 190 running metres per game this season. Approaching a century of games in the Australia after penning a deal on the Gold Coast until the end of 2022, look for Thompson to give the home side every chance of downing the Rabbitohs for the first time in five years.

Making a name for himself at the Titans as one of the hardest working players in the league, **Jai Arrow** will return to CBUS Super Stadium on Friday night determined to continue the Rabbitohs strong start to 2021. Currently biding his time off the bench after spending the past three seasons as a starting forward, the 25-year-old Queensland representative has provided plenty of impact since reuniting with Wayne Bennett with 130 metres and 25 tackles on average each week. Contracted to South Sydney until the end of 2024, Arrow will have no shortage of motivation on Friday night against his former teammates.

Favourite: Coming into the contest off the back of five consecutive wins and a dominant record over their opponents, the Rabbitohs are expected to have too much class for the Titans.

My tip: While the Titans have shown themselves capable of bullying weaker teams into submission, they have yet to assert their credentials against the elite teams of the premiership. The loss of Latrell Mitchell will be a challenge for the Rabbitohs to overcome, but the class remaining throughout the playing ranks should be able to get the job done regardless. South Sydney by 8.

The Northern Territory is the focus of the Rugby League world on Friday night as the Parramatta Eels play host to an improving Brisbane Broncos side at Darwin's TIO Stadium.

Parramatta had been one of the form teams across the competition for the first five rounds before the St George Illawarra Dragons comprehensively ended their winning streak. Last weekend showed that the loss was only a small blip, returning to form with a big win over Canberra.

The Eels started fast with two tries inside the first fifteen minutes in that win, but it was the second half where the Blue and Gold made the biggest impact running in four unanswered tries. The quality of Mitch Moses came to the fore as they began to run rampant through poor defensive efforts from the Raiders. The signs were good right across the park for Parramatta, particularly Moses - whose consistency will be key to his side maintaining a good run in 2021.

There's one change to the lineup for the 'home' team, with Dylan Brown returning to the number six jersey in place of Will Smith, the *Men in Black* namesake dropping back to the bench. Isaiah Papali'i has been named to start in the second row with Ryan Matterson expected to make his return from ongoing concussion issues through NSW Cup at Ringrose Park on Saturday.

Brisbane found themselves spending the first six weeks towards the bottom of the ladder this season, and it was expected that they would be wiped off the park against the undefeated Panthers last Thursday, but they were arguably the much better team despite a 20-12 defeat.

Coming up against the competition leaders, the Broncos more than matched the efforts of their opponents, and if anything dominated much of the contest. The efforts of Tevita Pangai Junior and Matt Lodge in the forwards set a framework for the Broncos which the Panthers struggled to deal with in the first half. Although Brisbane were kept scoreless during the second half - and with a few questionable attacking decisions - they were still only beaten by the late magic of Penrith and NSW half Nathan Cleary.

The visitors welcome back Herbie Farnworth back into their side, with Richie Kennar dropping out of the 17 entirely after playing in the centres last week. New recruit Danny Levi has been added straight to the bench by Broncos coach Kevin Walters

Who to watch: After playing one of his best career games, Mitch Moses will be key for the Eels to see if he can start to play at that level consistently. He no doubt has all the talent in the world, but we generally only get to see glimpses of it before a run of average form. Parramatta and their fans will be hoping that it will now be a more balanced Moses going forward.

Another player who impressed last week was **Matt Lodge**, with one of his best games in a very long time. He has come in for criticism for his efforts in the last 12 months, but was able to outplay the Penrith forward pack last weekend - something few players have managed lately. Coming up against another strong pack, Lodge will yet again need to deliver.

Favourite: The Eels are heavy favourites to win the contest in Darwin. It is important to note that since first taking games to Darwin in 2014, Parramatta have won five of the six contests they have played in the NT. It will also be the first time the Broncos have played a competitive match in the Northern Territory since their 1994 Tooheys Challenge Cup game in Alice Springs.

My tip. It's too hard to go past Parramatta for the contest. They were at their classy best last weekend against Canberra with Moses and Clint Gutherson starring. Brisbane will need to ensure that they can back up last weekend's efforts if they want to push the Eels. Parramatta by 12.

Cowboys riding winning form, Raiders out for redemption

The Cowboys and the Raiders will do battle on Saturday night at Queensland Country Bank Stadium in Townsville. The game could be a defining one for both of these teams' seasons, as the Cowboys look to prove they can beat a higher echelon side and the Raiders looking to return to the winner's circle following disappointing back-to-back losses.

The Cowboys will be looking to make it three straight wins after they were able to beat the Tigers and the Bulldogs in rounds five and six respectively. Still though, those teams are both sitting lower than the Todd Payten coached side themselves, so they are still largely unproven as any sort of force in the competition at this stage. They still will need to improve tremendously if they are to overcome a Raiders side with their backs against the wall after leaking 30 points in their match against the Tigers and 18 against the last-placed Bulldogs.

The Raiders are in a position not many saw them being in early in the season. They currently sit just outside the top 8 following two losses in a row to the Panthers and the Eels. Whilst both of those sides are sitting high up the NRL ladder, what is more concerning is how the Raiders have lost those games. They have conceded 30 or more points in both of those games, showing that they will really need to tighten up their defence if they are to afford themselves the opportunity to play their attacking brand of footy. That should be the focus for the men from the nation's capital this weekend and if they can defend well, they should put themselves in a position to win off the back of that.

Cowboys coach Todd Payten has named an unchanged line-up from the team that defeated the Bulldogs last weekend. The team should look to repay his faith with a good effort against Canberra.

Raiders coach Ricky Stuart has made mass changes to his side this weekend after labelling "individuals" as the problem following their loss to the Eels last round. Sebastian Kris comes onto the wing for Bailey Simonsson. Ryan James comes into the starting side at prop, with the star forward Josh Papalii dropping back to the bench following a lacklustre start to the 2021 season. Josh Hodgson is also out, with Tom Starling returning to start at hooker. Ryan Sutton moves to the starting lock role, with Emre Guler starting at the other front-row position this week. Joseph Tapine is out of the team this week but is still in the reserves. Corey Harawira-Naera makes a long-awaited return to the top grade via the bench, as does Corey Horsburgh. Iosia Soliola has moved back to the reserves.

Who to watch: Coen Hess has been well below his best for the past few years now. Starting at prop for the Cowboys, he has an opportunity to take it to the Raiders forward pack in what will be a huge game in the context of his team's season. If he can help his team win the battle in the middle, the Cowboys have a real shot at a fragile Canberra side.

Look for how **Josh Papali'i** responds to his benching this week. This could be just the push he needed to help him rediscover the 2020 form that saw him largely touted as the game's best prop. If he responds in a big way, he could almost single-handedly tear the Cowboys apart.

Favourite: The Raiders are favourites to win this one and rediscover some form.

My tip: The Raiders will have a lot of players who have been given an opportunity this week who want to keep their spots in first grade. There are also players like Josh Papalii who will be looking for a big response in this game. It is still a very strong side on paper despite multiple regular NRL players out for at least this round. Looking at the Cowboys side before their first win in round 5, they really didn't seem all that motivated to produce good form and it's hard to see how they match the intensity and talent of the Raiders. Sea Eagles eyeing three straight against luckless Tigers

Vision of Michael Maguire in the Tigers box recoiling like a victim of voodoo is among the cruelest in the competition.

If the listless effort at Leichhardt Oval two weeks ago against the Cowboys was a needle to the coach's heart, then the traumatic golden point defeat to bitter rivals South Sydney must have been the pin in each eye.

The only thing more painful must be the lack of premiership points for their best efforts. Either side of the Cowboys capitulation the Tigers have tested the Eels, and if not for a few plays would have had the Rabbitohs' measure. Now on a three game losing streak and sitting in 15th position with only one win, victory over Manly is almost a non-negotiable if Wests are to remain a serious finals contender.

And while knowing which of his sides has boarded the bus might be a lottery for Maguire, for Des Hasler it's chalk and cheese. While one impressive victory in Tom Trbojevic's return against the Titans doesn't make a season, it certainly shows the Sea Eagles are a class above with the Origin star on the park.

Just as impressive as the improved attack was the bullet proof defence. How a side can leak 156 points in the opening four rounds and then concede 12 in the next two is anyone's guess. But given the confidence Trbojevic instills seems irreplaceable, the big concern for Hasler is working out how to maintain his health.

Now with back-to-back wins after their biggest victory in three seasons, Manly will head to Bankwest Stadium with their heads held high. Although still in 12th position, the Sea Eagles are just one win shy of the eighth placed Warriors and with an unchanged 17 shouldn't be short of motivation.

For the Tigers, Michael Chee Kam comes in for injured centre Asu Kepaoa with Joey Leilua and Alex Seyfarth named to return from the bench. And while Bankwest isn't their spiritual home, with five victories from the past six contests, the Tigers have had the wood on Manly since 2017.

Who to watch: Back in 2004, Scott Sattler and Steve Menzies were skippers when the Tigers and Sea Eagles last met on Anzac Day. The names may have changed but the talent hasn't diminished.

The last time these sides met, a hat-trick to **David Nofoaluma** at Brookvale Oval proved the difference. That was last season, and while the 27-year-old's stats are down in 2021, his 143 metres per match still puts the Tigers on the front foot. And having already tormented the Sea Eagles with 10 tries in 11 appearances since 2013, don't be surprised if the bustling winger bounces back to his best.

Travelling Manly fans with a boot load of Mudgee produce left town with an even bigger smile thanks to **Tom Trbojevic**. Pushing himself into the Titans line from the opening set, the rangy fullback proved unstoppable in fashioning the majority of Manly's 26 first half points.

It made the drab efforts of the opening five rounds seem a world away. Footage from those performances won't bother the Tigers though. Instead, a healthy dose of Turbo vision will be Maguire's first step in preventing his troops from freezing in the tearaway's headlights.

Favourite: The bookies have tagged Manly favourites for the first time this year.

My tip: Tipping the Tigers can be fraught with danger at the best of times, but it's easy to be sucked in when the likes of Adam Doueihi and Daine Laurie shine on a regular basis. Unfortunately for the Tigers, timing counts for plenty and they can consider themselves unlucky that Manly are in the midst of a Turbo reunion. Manly by 8.

Traditional Anzac Day Clash Set to Be A Thriller

The Sydney Roosters will play the St George Illawarra Dragons on Anzac Day for the 19th time on Sunday in an event that in recent years has grown to be as much a part of the day as "The Last Post," playing two-up and eating Anzac biscuits. The fixture did not go ahead last year due to Covid-19, which will only add to the anticipation of the match, which is already a game of the round contender.

Since 2002, the Dragons have had the upper hand on the day, winning the Anzac Cup 11 times compared to the Roosters 7. The atmosphere created by the large crowd has a way of producing extremely exciting contests which often take the full 80 minutes to be decided, occasionally even longer.

Who could forget when Matt Cooper scored the levelling try with 3 minutes to play in 2004 and Matt Head nailed the side-line conversion to win the game for the Dragons? Or in 2012, when Michael Weyman got an offload away to Ben Creagh who scored to put the Dragons in front with literally 50 seconds on the clock?

In the more recent close finishes, it has been the Roosters who have come out on top, with Mitchell Pearce breaking a 5-year field goal drought in 2017 to ice the match-winner in golden point. In the most recent clash in 2019, fans were on the edge of their seat with 5 minutes to go when Sio Siua Taukeiaho capitalised on a Dufty error to score the sealing try.

With both sides keen to make up for disappointing performances last week after an otherwise strong start to the year and playing in front of what will be the biggest crowd of the season so far, there is every reason to believe that Sunday's game will be just as if not more exciting than the aforementioned spectacles.

In team news, Brett Morris will return on the wing from a calf strain, replacing Matt Ikuvalu, while Sam Verrills is due to play his first NRL game since rupturing his ACL in Round 7 last year, ironically against the Dragons. His inclusion pushes rookie Ben Marschke to the bench, while Adam Keighran drops out of the side due to a fractured eye socket.

For the Dragons, Trent Merrin has been dropped, with Blake Lawrie taking his place as starting prop, with Ben Hunt an outside chance of returning from a leg injury from the reserves in jersey number 21.

Who to watch: With the news breaking that Victor Radley successfully had his charge downgraded at the NRL judiciary on Tuesday night and will be free to play, it will be interesting to see whether or not his combination with Sam Verrills can pick up where it left off early last year and 2019. There is no question that in 2020 the Roosters missed the dynamic link provided by Radley in attack, however James Tedesco will be the only spine player from 2020 to take the field for the Roosters on Sunday. Radleys combination with inexperienced halves pairing Walker and Hutchison has progressed in the past couple of weeks and the fiery lock will be keen to make amends for his high shot which saw him sit down for 10 last week against Melbourne. When in sync, the Roosters can be one of the most exciting attacking teams to watch, and Radley at his best would go a long way to achieving a Roosters victory on Sunday.

Many were quick to question the logic of incoming coach Anthony Griffin recruiting veteran hooker **Andrew McCullough** on a three-year deal, however the move has proved to be an astute one so far, with McCullough's cool, experienced head often ensuring the Dragons attack doesn't become as frantic as it has in recent years, while he's also provided his usual reliability in defence, making 319 tackles so far in 2021, only 1 behind comp leader Jayden Brailey. Matt Dufty is also one to keep an eye on, who has proved he isn't just a speed merchant by developing one of the games better cut-out passes which regularly exposes opposition edge defence. The Roosters have previously been exposed by the strength of Will Kennedy close to the line and will need to ensure they are prepared for the skill of Dufty, who scored perhaps the most memorable try in the history of the Anzac Cup in 2019.

Favourite: The Roosters are favoured by 5 and a half points over the Dragons at the time of writing.

My tip: I was leaning towards the Dragons in this one due to the expected effect of injuries to the Roosters forward pack, however, Trent Robinson has named a stronger than expected team which I think will get the job done in another Anzac Day thriller. Sydney Roosters by 1.

ANZAC Round wraps with traditional Trans-Tasman face-off.

On paper Sunday's night's clash between Melbourne and the Warriors looks fairly open and shut. It's been fairly difficult to get a good read on the Warriors, a stoic win over the high-flying Dragons on Sunday was preceded by a nail-biting loss to Manly just a week earlier. Which Warriors side turns up week-to-week is often a mystery - the polar opposite of their opponents this round.

The Storm are nothing if not consistent. Even in their two losses thus far in 2021, they have given little away - as shown by the margins in those games. Add to that their stunning record against the men from Auckland - they are unbeaten in their last nine against them.

For the Warriors there's also the knowledge that player's families now have the opportunity for quarantine-free travel following this week's opening of the Australia-NZ travel bubble. Whether that psychological boost is a good or bad thing (or has any impact at all) could well play a role in this contest.

A quick squiz at the team sheets reveals some key changes for both sides. Ryan Papenhuyzen has a shoulder complaint which will see him sit out this ANZAC Day clash, his spot taken in the custodian role by Nicho Hynes. Importantly though, the vacancy left on the bench by Hynes' promotion is filled by captain Dale Finucane, who returns to the lineup after missing the opening six rounds.

Across the other side, there's a new centre pairing with Peta Hiku and Adam Pompey both out injured. Montoya moves in at #3 with Murchie shifting from the back row to pair him in the centres. That frees up a wing spot for David Fusitu'a to return after missing Sunday's win over St George Illawarra. Elsewhere in the lineup, Bayley Sironen rejoins the bench after also missing some game time - Paul Turner is the man to make way, the three-gamer also out injured.

Who to watch: With Papenhuyzen's omission, it almost feels like we've been robbed of a star fullback battle. Instead, **Nicho Hynes** jumps in for his 17th NRL appearance in his third season of NRL. Having already crossed the stripe once in his four games this season (one at fullback, three from the bench), Hynes is no stranger to the tryline. While the man he's deputising for has big boots to fill, Hynes will want to continue to impress and an occasion like ANZAC Day is a great way to show off his skillset.

By the other token, **Roger Tuivasa-Sheck**'s farewell tour is something special. Across the first six rounds 'RTS' has wowed crowds and viewers not just with his attacking involvements, but with some outstanding and even desperate defending at the back. While everyone expects something electric with ball from the union-bound number #1, his value in this game especially will be in containing a lethal Melbourne attacking outfit.

Favourite: Ladder position, home ground advantage, recent record - even without 'Paps', Melbourne are well supported to get the job done.

My tip: The last ANZAC Day clash between these sides in 2019 was decided by just a single point - and I'd like to think we'll see something similar happen again. If the Warriors can show the defensive steel they exhibited against the Dragons last week then they'll go a long way to making it a close contest, but even then, it's difficult to go past the might of the Storm. Melbourne by 4.

Trbojevic-inspired Sea Eagles spank hapless Titans in huge upset
