Panthers go top with bruising result against Rabbitohs

Penrith Panthers have moved to the top of the NRL Premiership with a bruising 20-12 win against the South Sydney Rabbitohs tonight at Kogarah.

The Panthers continue to pass each test, as the weeks go on in 2020. After they edged past the Storm, now they handled the Rabbitohs with ease, led by a powerhouse performance from their forward pack, some guile from the halves added up to their fifth win of the season.

Whilst Nathan Cleary sported a band-aid which hampered his goal-kicking, the halfback guided the Panthers around to their latest conquest. Cleary has looked a man-on-a-mission since his return from suspension, set up two tries and scored a late four-pointer himself to solidify the Panthers as a Premiership threat this season.

Much has been talked of the Panthers right-side this year with justification but tonight it was to the left, to the left as Beyonce sang for the Panthers. Replacement winger Brent Naden scored the opener and they terrorised the Rabbitohs defense all night. Naden almost had a double in the opening 20 minutes but it seems whoever comes in for the Panthers strikes gold for the Mountain Men.

There were times where the former 'chocolate soldiers' might have wilted under the pressure from Rabbitohs in the second half but the Panthers continued to show up every set in defense and combined with some stellar kicking from Cleary gave the Rabbitohs no chance tonight.

Dylan Edwards and Stephen Crichton added four-pointers either side of the break which kept the Rabbitohs at arms-length all night. Edwards has shown since his return from injury, he is the Panthers choice at fullback with his pinballed effort for a try and a safe night under the high ball.

On the Rabbitohs, they remain an enigma. When they were on against bottom feeders, the Rabbitohs piled on 72 points but failed their challenge against a contender tonight. They fumbled their way through the first half with Latrell Mitchell, a key culprit, but it was a tough night for the cardinal-and-myrtle who ended with 11-men on the field.

A superb line from Bayley Sironen brought it back to 8-6 just after the break, but the eight-point margin at full-time, flattered the Rabbitohs. A late Alex Johnston flying effort kept the streak of close margins between the sides but tonight, the gap between the contenders and the pretenders showed.

There is plenty for the Rabbitohs to work on, if they want to challenge this season. Jaydn Su'A gave them punch but there wasn't enough thrown at the Panthers defense alongside a litany of fumbling players that made it a forgettable night.

Next week the Bunnies are away to the Bulldogs, while the Panthers visit the Wests Tigers. Both matches in Round 8 are set for Bankwest Stadium.

Suliasi Vunivalu nabbed a hattrick while Ryan Papenhuyzen and Paul Momirovski also bagged doubles in the victory.

Patrick Herbert went over for the sole try for the visitors.

The Storm have a massive fortnight to come with the Roosters and Raiders to come but will have to play both games without Munster.

The Warriors have fellow strugglers Brisbane next week as they look to restore pride or risk further questions being asked about the timing of Kearney's departure.

Roosters defy injuries to down Dragons

A hat-trick from Brett Morris has seen the Sydney Roosters down the St George Illawarra Dragons 26-12 in a match marred by injuries.

Losing Victor Radley and Sam Verrills in the first 20 minutes with suspected ACL tears - set to rule the pair out for the remainder of the season - the Roosters showed their premiership-winning credentials to record their fifth straight win following the season resumption.

Coming out of the sheds full of energy, Morris (4th minute) - filling in for his twin brother at left centre - crossed for the opening try of the evening.

Losing Radley in the following set, the Roosters recovered to produce one of the tries of the season through Jared Waerea-Hargreaves (18th minute), after fullback Joseph Manu fielded his own bomb before flick passing to send his prop over for a 10-0 lead.

Starting the match ahead of Jake Friend after being limited to less than 80 minutes of game time this season, hooker Sam Verrills was taken from the field with the assistance of two trainers to leave the reigning premiers to play out the remainder of the match with 15 men.

Taking advantage of their opponent's misfortune, the Dragons levelled the scores at 10-all courtesy of two brilliant passes from Matt Dufty to send Mikaele Ravalawa (23rd minute) and Zac Lomax (26th minute) over for four-pointers.

Taking the lead momentarily after halftime with a penalty goal from Lomax, the Roosters responded through Morris (51st minute) following some lovely second phase play that saw the ball move from sideline to sideline.

With both sides trading sets for much of the second half, Luke Keary produced two moments of brilliance by taking on the line from close range (65th minute) before securing the win with a well-weighted chip to send Morris (76th minute) over for his hat-trick.

Temporarily moving into second position following the win, the Roosters have the option of recalling on-loan forward Poasa Fa'amusili from the Warriors to cover for the losses of Radley and Verrills.



Ruthless Cowboys bounce back to dispose of Knights

The North Queensland Cowboys have recorded their first win against a top 8 side in 2020, doing it in style by racing out to a 26 point half time lead before eventually winning the match 32-20.

The Knights were heavily favoured going into this one and after 2 minutes it was looking like Newcastle by how much. Rookie fullback Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow couldn't handle the first high ball that came his way, giving the men in red and blue a prime opportunity to put points on the board early and leaving their fans experiencing deja-vu from last weeks demolition at the hands of the Tigers.

The Cowboys had come to play though, and it became apparent when they repelled the Knights with ease, Gehamat Shibasaki dropping an easy pass cold. Their dominance didn't start until around the 9th minute, when Shibasaki again made a simple error and gifted the Cowboys a prime attacking opportunity. They wasted no time putting points on the board, with Justin O'Neill finishing off a perfectly executed backline shift.

From that point it appeared the Cowboys had wrestled all the momentum from the Knights. They were hitting harder and the Knights' play the balls were 10 times slower than their opposition. Kyle Feldt kicked a penalty goal to put his side up by 8 and the set from a kickoff was a clinic on how to play Rugby League. North Queensland made 70 odd metres off the kickoff and rolled the ball into touch, and when they received the ball on the last Reece Robson made a clean line break and linked up with Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow to score his maiden NRL try.

The one way traffic continued after that. Jake Clifford took the defence on close to the try-line and reaped the rewards, easily breaking through and showing

up former Cowboy Kalyn Ponga in the process. After Kyle Feldt nailed the easy conversion, the score was 20-0 in favour of the Cowboys after 25 minutes. The errors continued for Newcastle, they were completing at 65% after 37 minutes and were really struggling to keep pace with their superior opponents. Just as it appeared the Knights would survive to half time, Kyle Feldt took to the sky to pounce on a perfect cross-field kick by Jake Clifford. Feldt put on his kicking boots to nail the sideline conversion and make the half time scoreline 26-0.

If the Knights were to have any chance, they needed to score first and score quickly. That's exactly what they did, with rookie Tex Hoy scoring after Lachlan Fitzgibbon made a break upfield in a try very similar to Hamiso Tabuai-Fidow's in the first half. The resurgence was short lived though, with Jacob Saifiti knocking on off the first set after points. The Cowboys weren't about to let this one slip, and Tom Opacic produced one of the pickups of the season followed by one of the offloads of the season to put Coen Hess over untouched.

A string of 5 set restarts in 6 minutes preceded Newcastle's second try of the match. Kalyn Ponga showed his class by getting a brilliant quick cutout ball away to Hymel Hunt, who did well to only just stay in the field of play.

Where there's life, there's hope is what Newcastle fans were telling themselves 5 minutes later. They were handed a penalty late in the tackle count after Mitchell Pearce was hit late after passing, and they capitalised on their field position through Kurt Mann. Mann showed the form he has exhibited in recent weeks by taking the line on and getting through some soft Cowboys defence and planting the ball down, making the gap less than 3 converted tries with 20 minutes to go.

Time started ticking away on a Knights comeback and those errors from earlier started creeping back into their game. Esan Marsters strolled over the line but was ruled to have benefited from an obstruction play, giving the Knights a penalty and last roll of the dice. Shibasaki got his first try in the NRL after 17 games, giving his side a sliver of hope being down by 12 with 4 minutes to go.

There was a penalty try referred to the bunker with a minute to go, with the referee examining whether Ponga would've scored had it not been for the impact of Scott Drinkwater off the ball. He was ruled to not be in try scoring vicinity and that was all she wrote for the 80 minutes, the Cowboys winning 32 points to 20.

Titans continue to improve as Broncos sink further

A scintillating first half by the Gold Coast Titans saw them blow the Broncos off the park, setting up an impressive 30-12 win at Suncorp Stadium tonight.

The victory saw the Titans move off the bottom of the ladder and up into 13th place, while the Broncos slumped to second last place.

The Titans opened the scoring in the 7th minute when Ash Taylor darted over from dummy half to score wide on the left side. He was unable to convert.

In the 20th minute they crossed again, when Jamal Fogarty passed to Keegan Hipgrave, who half-attempted to catch it before weirdly batting it along to Anthony Don, who collected the ball on the bounce and then dived over in the right corner for a good try. Taylor's sideline conversion was brilliant.

9 minutes later the Titans put up a bomb was dropped by Tesi Niu. The ball was picked up by Tyrone Peachey who then passed to a barnstorming Sam Lisone,

who burrowed over the line and got the ball down, just, for a try under the posts. Taylor converted from right in front.

With just 3 minutes remaining in the half, Moeaki Fotuaika was sent to the sin bin, however it was the Titans who scored during his absence, when Don intercepted a pass from Niu and raced 70 metres to score right on halftime. Taylor added the extras and the Titans went into the sheds, up 22-0.

Brisbane needed to score first in the second half and they did just that in the 49th minute when some good late footwork by a barnstorming Ben Te'o saw him crash over for a strong try. Herbie Farnworth converted from right in front.

Ash Taylor kicked an easy penalty goal in the 53rd minute, but 5 minutes later the Broncos scored again, this time when Farnworth followed through a grubber and got the ball down for a four pointer. He then converted his own try to reduce the deficit to 2 converted tries.

Taylor again added another penalty goal, in the 62nd minute to take the Titans lead out to 14.


The last ten minutes saw Matt Lodge leave the field with an injury and oddly, wasn't replaced. Then with 6 minutes remaining and while the Broncos had the ball, Corey Oates was sin binned for dissent, leaving the Broncos with 11 men on the field. This allowed the Titans to bag one more try to Philip Sami in the left corner, despite the attention of two defenders. Taylor failed to convert.



Golden Gutho gets Parra back to the top

The Parramatta Eels have needed golden point to regain the top spot on the NRL ladder following their 25-24 victory over the Canberra Raiders at Bankwest Stadium.

The first half was something that could only be described as bizarre with something in the air that saw players fire up, the set restart bell go off on multiple occasions without referee Ashley Klein calling for one. The Eels opened the scoring after just five minutes when some ill-discipline from the Raiders put themselves under pressure and it was Ryan Matterson who scored the opening try after Mitch Moses was able to bring defenders in and give Matterson a solid run to the line to score. The bunker then knocked back two more scoring efforts from the Eels with knock on calls going against Mitch Moses and Dylan Brown respectively to keep the score at 6-0. The Raiders then hit back shortly after when Josh Papali'i got a free passage to the try line after the Parramatta defence over-compensated for the outside men.

Controversy reigned supreme on the Eels next try after a clear forward pass was missed by the officials into the lead up when Elliott Whitehead threw the ball forward to Nick Cotric who kicked back inside for Jack Wighton who gave it to Whitehead who scored for the Raiders to put them in front.

Injury concerns mounted up for both team with Corey Horsburgh injuring his foot which could've saved Canberra from a meltdown by the forward who was baiting for a fight whilst Moses left the field with a suspected torn calf muscle. A penalty goal on the stroke of half time brought the Eels back to within 4 with Gutherson taking over the kicking duties.

The second half was set up to be another strange 40 minutes and it lived up to being very strange indeed. The Raiders got to the line first but were called back for a forward pass by the officials on a pass that looked to be flat. Parramatta retook the lead soon after when Ray Stone was given a free passage to the line after just like the Eels did in the first half, the Raiders were expecting play to go wide but instead Mahoney went short and gave it to Stone for his first NRL try.

The Eels then extended their lead just after the hour mark when Shaun Lane was able to run a good line and get a great offload away to Michael Jennings to score. Gutherson's conversion pushed the Eels out to an eight-point lead. The victory looked to have been assured for the Blue and Gold when Maika Sivo was able to get on the outside of the Raiders defence to score. The missed conversion from Gutherson gave Canberra a rough outside chance of trying to get back into it.

A two-minute double for Charnze Nicoll-Klokstad did just that for the Raiders with the first coming off the boot of George Williams who chipped into open space behind the Eels line and CNK was able to score. The second of the double for CNK came straight off the kick off when the Raiders looked to switch play down the left and Elliot Whitehead found space to get through before finding CNK to score. Croker converted both to force the game to go into extra time.

Golden Point ensued and it was the Raiders who had the first chance for field goal but George Williams couldn't get a strike away and handed the ball over in good position. The Eels then themselves couldn't get a field goal away with Gutherson rushed into a bomb that almost paid off when he chased through and luck both favoured and went against Gutherson with a bounce perfect for the Eels fullback only for him to slip before being able to get to it. The second half of Golden Point saw Parramatta being the only team to get a chance and it was some scrappy play from the Eels that actually saw them get into perfect position. The Eels were desperate to get into field position to take a shot and some scrappy offloads saw a Raiders hand knock one down and a scrum put them into good position. The ensuing set was too much for the Raiders to hold out and Gutherson was able to get a clean shot about 25m out from the posts and it went through to give the Eels a 25-24 victory.

Tommy Talau got his first four-pointer followed winger's putdown right after the break as the joint venture side were breaking the line at will. Nofoaluma was handed the Tigers fifth on a platter from a Foran intercept then Adam Doueihi closed out the scoring with a strong effort as the Tigers flew past the 40-point mark.

It was a night for the youngsters, Grant again injected energy at dummy-half and gives the Tigers an extra demension that they'll be hoping the youngster remains at the joint venture next season. Talau not a natural winger produced two good efforts for his tries and the enthusiasm is flowing through this Tigers side and if they can continue to build, it might be a repeat of 2005.

Where to next for Canterbury? The loss of Will Hopoate early wasn't ideal but it was another outing where they looked lost in attack and unable to compete against the Tigers pack which will be galling after their brave effort against the Sharks last Sunday night.

Reality is though, they sit rock bottom of the Premiership, their sole win against St George Illawarra, and more questions than answers for a proud club. Chopping and changing might provide a quick fix but there needs to be a root-and-branch review at Belmore.



Looking forward

Son of a gun ready to take the next step

OE Stimson arrived at Belmore full of excitement and ready to earn his spot in the famous blue-and-white. 2020 was going to be his year.

Given an opportunity to play in the season opener against the traditional rivals Parramatta Eels, the Temora Dragons junior was focused on playing good football – recapturing the same form that saw him play in the 2018 NRL Grand Final with Storm.

During his debut for his new club, Stimson said he felt a 'stinger' in his shoulder - just as COVID-19 began to pick up steam.

"It went a little bit numb. I didn't think too much more than it was a stinger. So I kept playing and was right to go again in the second match against the Cowboys," he told The Front Row.

"I just wanted to get through the second game. I tried to push through. The pain stayed and then got a bit worse.

"This was my year before It started. But then the injury happened in my first game. It was always going

to be a tough. It hit me pretty hard and I am pretty disappointed. But it is part of rugby league – you get injured."

This story is all too familiar for Stimson.

Stimson was informed he required shoulder surgery – but he would have to wait. The government introduced elective surgery bans.

"I was booked to have surgery on the Thursday after the game. Then the Coronavirus stopped all non-essential surgery on the Tuesday. So I had to wait a while," he said.

"It only put me a month behind... but it was quite weird during the lockdown. It didn't quite hit me that I would miss the whole year until we were back training.

"The injury itself is coming along really nicely. I am getting my range back quickly and hopefully I will be back to running soon. Get outside of the gym and get back out there with the boys."

While his injury will put the breaks on his NRL career for now, he has already eclipsed a goal he set for himself before coming into first grade.

"I just wanted to play more [NRL] games than Dad," he said


His father, Peter, played nine games in the front row for the South Sydney Rabbitohs in 1997. Joe has played 53 games so far.

Despite the friendly rivalry, young Stimson said his father will be one of the greatest influences on his career.

"Dad had a huge impact on my footy. He took me to training when I was younger when he was captain-coach of a few sides. Then he coached me all through the younger grades in Temora," he said.

"I loved the way he played. He used to just do all the little things right and now I pride myself on that as well."





Back in-form Cowboys face huge Parramatta test on brand new Bankwest turf

The Cowboys played the reverse card last week, bouncing back from being down 34-0 at half time two weeks ago to carry a 26-point lead against the Knights at the break last round, and went on with the job against the odds to score a 32-20 victory over Newcastle.

The Eels looked to have the 2 points signed, sealed and delivered, leading the Raiders by 12 points with 5 minutes to go before going to sleep and finding themselves in a golden point shootout. They showed character that has lacked in Parramatta sides of recent years to somehow come away with the win courtesy of a King Gutho field goal.

Brad Arthur had a selection headache regarding the replacement of injured halfback Mitchell Moses, who is expected to miss around 3 weeks with a calf complaint. He's gone with former Dragons utility Jai Field, a rookie who showed a lot of promise in his limited outings with the Red V. David Gower replaces Daniel Alvaro on the interchange bench in what will be his first NRL match since Round 24 last year.

The pressure on Cowboys coach Paul Green was somewhat alleviated following their victory last week and he has re-payed his players by keeping the same 17, albeit with a slight reshuffle to the backline with Tom Opacic moving to the centres and O'Neill to the wing. Valentine Holmes is also a chance to return from injury after being named in the reserves.

Both sides are coming off good attacking performances and appeared to be strolling to victory before late lapses saw their respective matches become closer than they should've. The Cowboys will be very lucky to start as well as they did last week against the Eels and can't afford to let in a similar influx of tries.

Parramatta will be confident after beating their second top 4-quality opponent in 3 weeks and supporters would've been happy with a rare golden point victory. They'll have to avoid complacency because the Cowboys have shown what they can do to opponents who don't take them seriously.

Who to watch: The silver lining for the Blue and Gold that's arisen from Mitchell Moses' injury is that it gives rookie half Jai Field a chance to prove himself at his new club. Field played 11 first grade games over 3 years for the Dragons but was let go over the off season and landed in Parramatta. Friday night will be his 5th time starting and will likely look to bring some attacking spark to solidify his position as first-string backup should Brown or Moses spend any more time on the sidelines.

North Queensland halfback Jake Clifford enjoyed arguably his best match in first grade last week, racking up a try assist, 7 tackle breaks and a try of his own to be rewarded with 3 Dally M points for his efforts. He had big shoes to fill last season replacing the great Johnathan Thurston and started this year outside the top 17. More performances like last week will give Paul Green a serious headache as to what to do when captain Michael Morgan recovers from injury.

Favourite: Unsurprisingly, the Eels are clear favourites to continue their strong form of 2020 with a win over the Cowboys on Friday night.

My tip: The Cowboys were overwhelmingly poor after the resumption of the NRL but showed good signs to respond with their best game of the year against quality opposition last week. Expect their strong form to continue and for this match to be close over the first 40 or 50 minutes, however Parramatta simply have too much strike and quality around the park to let this one get away from them. **Eels by 14**.

After a historic win over the big brother Brisbane Broncos, the Gold Coast Titans return to their home ground for a clash with the fit and firing Cronulla Sharks.

It was a rare 80-minute performance from the Titans to beat the Broncos in Brisbane, with the 30-12 margin going down as the biggest victory for the Gold Coast over their south-east Queensland rival.

Moeaki Fotuaika matched it with Payne Haas, Ash Taylor took the Titans to an early lead, Anthony Don scored two tries to remind everyone he's a quality winger and Jai Arrow was yet again one of their best.

We'll find out if the Titans are content with that effort or if consistently performing to that standard is what they're passionate about.

The Sharks are in some hot point-scoring form of their own after putting 40 on the Manly Sea Eagles, and this Saturday afternoon fixture promises an emphasis on expansive attacking footy.

Holding an 18-6 advantage against the depleted Sea Eagles at halftime, Cronulla mentally committed to go on with the job in the second half by taking the game out to a 34-6 advantage by the 55th minute.

Shaun Johnson and Sione Katoa are in some serious form. Johnson has shown maturity to be able to mess with a defence without the explosiveness he had with the Warriors. He leads the NRL in try assists and is running the football a lot to also be first in the NRL for line engagements. Katoa's scored five tries in his last two games.

This might finally be the week Gold Coast coach Justin Holbrook is able to play Tyrone Roberts for the first time since round two. Roberts played an 11 v 11 game against Broncos fringe players on Saturday before the main game.

It would be hard to change a winning side though, and playing as a utility might be Roberts' best role for now to regain match fitness and allow Corey Thompson to build chemistry with his new team.

In the only change to the Sharks' team list from their 40-22 win over Manly, Braden Hamlin-Uele is relegated to the bench with Andrew Fifita to start. However, in the last two weeks Cronulla coach John Morris has flipped these two an hour before kickoff. The Sharks are on track to play the same 17 for the third consecutive round.

Who to watch: The steadying influence of Jamal Fogarty might have been the final piece to free up Ash Taylor to focus on his own attack. Against the Broncos Fogarty looked after a lot of the general play duties as a half, and once the Titans got within good attacking field position it was Taylor that took the line on and generated goal-line dropouts. While Fogarty hasn't come up with much individual brilliance, there's no doubt Holbrook would be pleased with how this inexperienced NRL halfback has helped the team.

Matt Moylan is once again starting to warm to the task of being a quality fullback for the Sharks. In the three games he's played 68 minutes or more this season (the last two from fullback), Cronulla has won all three games. He recorded two try assists last week and another solid performance against the Titans would have him primed for the round nine clash with his old team, the Penrith Panthers.

Favourite: The Sharks come in as the clear favourite. Despite Cronulla on the season scoring 50 more points and conceding 45 less points than the Titans, they're only separated by one win on the ladder.

Tip: There appears to be some fool's gold in the form of these two teams because of the opposition they've faced. While some credit goes to the Gold Coast for their lopsided win over the Broncos, there's no denying Brisbane is very beatable by any NRL team at present and a week prior the Titans lost 20-8 to the Dragons. Likewise, the Sharks beat a battered Sea Eagles side and two weeks ago they squeaked out a 20-18 win over the Canterbury Bulldogs. Cronulla having their side intact for three straight weeks could be the difference in what should be a high scoring match. Sharks by 14.

New Zealand host Brisbane - at Gosford - in must-win encounter.

In a contest pitting the 14th-placed New Zealand Warriors against the 15th-placed Brisbane Broncos, both teams will be desperate to emerge from Central Coast Stadium with two points on Saturday evening.

Copping a 50-6 hiding against Melbourne last Friday, the New Zealand Warriors will be hoping to continue their surprisingly strong form in Gosford.

Holding an 80 per cent record at Central Coast Stadium, including wins in both their appearances this season against St George Illawarra and North Queensland, interim coach Todd Payten will be hoping his team can maintain a slight advantage over the Broncos following nine wins and a draw from 18 clashes during the past decade.

Set to be without Roger Tuivasa-Sheck after the New Zealand fullback was found guilty of a should charge at the judiciary, former Brisbane utility Gerard Beale is expected to come into the backline, while Jack Hetherington will make his club debut after being loaned from Penrith in place of recalled Sydney prop Poasa Fa'amusili.

After being a late scratching from the team that went down to the Storm last Friday, prolific try-scorer David Fusitua will belatedly become the 24th player to bring up 100 games for the club.

Humiliated by the Gold Coast Titans 30-12 last Saturday, the Brisbane Broncos will be hoping to record their first win since the season resumed six weeks ago.

Boasting the worst defence in the league having been outscored 42-170 during their run of losses, under pressure coach Anthony Seibold will be aiming to orchestrate the Broncos first win on the Central Coast since 2011.

Offsetting the loss of representative forward Joe Ofahengaue (suspension) with the return of young duo Thomas Flegler and Patrick Carrigan, former Dally M Rookie of the Year Jamayne Isaako has been granted a reprieve at the expense of Corey Oates - who will have to wait to play his 150th game for the club.

Who to watch: Bursting onto the NRL scene two years ago as a feisty second rower eager to tussle with the game's toughest players, Jack Hetherington will be raring to get back on the field for his first match since the opening round. Penning a short-term loan to join the Warriors' ranks for the next four weeks, the 2018 Penrith Rookie of the Year will provide the NRL nomads with an injection of sorely needed aggression. Managing just three games in the top grade since his rookie campaign, look for the 25-year-old forward to rip in on Saturday evening as the Warriors look to continue their unbeaten record at Gosford this season.

Retaining the number one jersey despite finishing on the bench seven days earlier, **Tesi Niu** will be looking to bounce back from the disappointment of last week. Coming up with a costly error in the opening minutes against the Titans, the former Australian Schoolboys representative will be eager to amend by showcasing the talents that saw him debut for Tonga just months after turning 18 last October. Likely to receive plenty of attention under the high ball on Saturday evening, Niu shapes as a player capable of helping the Broncos breakthrough for their first win since the COVID-19 lockdown.

Favourite: Despite staring down the prospect of six straight losses for only the fifth time in the club's history, the Broncos are expected to down the wounded Warriors.

Tip: Having led at halftime in both their victories this season, the experience of Blake Green and Adam Blair should get the Warriors home if they can get away to a strong start. **Warriors by 6**.

Tigers tackle Panthers in the battle for Sydney's west.

Last Sunday's win over the hapless Bulldogs saw the Tigers register back-to-back victories for the first time this season and leapfrog the more fancied Sea Eagles and Raiders into sixth place.

Since last month's costly fade out against the Titans, Michael Maguire's men have shown glimpses of perfection either side of the ball highlighted by their 13 tries in the past fortnight.

Ironically, it was the now vanquished Benji Marshall who put the Panthers to the sword when the sides last met. That was in the Magic Round last season, now young Storm recruit Harry Grant is pulling the strings, exceeding the expectations of many with last week's classy effort propelling him to outright second on the Dally M leader board.

Averaging 25 points a game, attack hasn't been a problem for Wests and with Josh Reynolds buoyed by selection security, Maguire will be hoping the wily playmaker's energy inspires a repeat of last week's unity in defence.

At the selection table, there was doubt over Thomas Mikaele's recovery from a knee injury suffered against Canterbury, but he's been named in an unchanged line-up. Russell Packer joins an extended bench following a two-game suspension.

After consecutive victories Ivan Cleary will be mindful of getting too far ahead of himself, but with the Sharks and Cowboys to follow, victory over the Tigers could set the Panthers on a season defining streak where they head the competition at the season midpoint.

Despite only one loss, the Panthers are far from the finished product. If not for numerous squandered opportunities, they would have put the Rabbitohs away much earlier than they did last week. But with a mobile pack and the steadying hand of Nathan Cleary, Penrith are capable of blasting clear with flair or knuckling down in an 80-minute grind.

Penrith will be strengthened by the return of Kangaroo winger Josh Mansour from a knee injury, his selection comes at the expense of last week's try scorer Brent Naden.

The battle of the ruck in this one promises to be belter and could decide the result. In a head to head contest of the NRL's form hookers, the crafty Apisai Koroisau's astute timing against the power of Grant shouldn't be missed.

As games shift back to home venues where possible, the Tigers will seek comfort in the move from Campbelltown to Bankwest where they are unbeaten in 2020. For Penrith, they're unbeaten in three starts at Campbelltown while their only loss to date was at Bankwest - against the Eels back in round 5.

Who to watch: Just over a year ago David Nofoaluma was battling form and confidence in the NSW Cup before rounding out the season nearing his best in the top grade. Now after seven rounds in 2020, the Samoan rep's eight tries are second from the top and his 46 tackle breaks make him the NRL's most difficult to pin down. And with an uncanny nous of finding the stripe even from defence, the Panthers will need to be on high alert all night.

On the other side of the ground, Panther **Brian To'o** will patrol the right touchline as he continues to defy the second season blues. Despite only crossing the line just twice in 2020, Ivan Cleary has seen enough to extend the St Marys junior's contract until the end of 2023. With a bustling 177m per game, the 102kg powerhouse has made an art form of rolling the Panthers out of trouble. Now among the top five for post contact metres, his Tigers opposite Tommy Talau can expect a torrid evening.

Favourite: Having only suffered one defeat this season, the high-flying Panthers deserve warm favouritism.

Tip: Despite finding themselves sixth on the ladder the Tigers are yet to claim a top-eight scalp, while the second placed Panthers are flying under the radar despite having knocked over the premiers and outmuscling the Storm. Michael Maguire's team changes and stern words seem to be having the desired effect, but Penrith are a legitimate top four outfit and should prove too strong. **Penrith by 14**.

Both the Sea Eagles and Knights poured doubt over their premiership credentials last week with disappointing performances against lowly opposition.

While Manly rallied to take down Canberra after losing Tom Trbojevic a fortnight ago, it was a different story last week against the Sharks.

The Sea Eagles conceded 40 points for the first time since 2018 as they slumped to a 18-point loss which has them vulnerable on the edge of the top eight.

For Des Hasler's men, they simply need to get a win on the board to restore confidence and quell concerns they are hamstrung without Trbojevic.

Who to watch: Both teams will be looking for someone to stand up and take ownership after poor results and the halfbacks for each side look the most capable. Daly Cherry-Evans is arguably the most well-rounded playmaker in the game. His controlled kicking game and calming presence will be crucial in helping his teammates not become frazzled if the Knights strike early and doubts creep in.

Meanwhile, Mitchell Pearce has also been the natural leader Newcastle were crying out for as they spent years grounded to the bottom of the ladder. But he went missing when they needed him most last weekend. Kurt Mann is quickly improving and forming a strong combination with Pearce but the latter is the one this group will turn to when they need the big plays.

Favourite: Newcastle are slight favourites for this game.

Tip: It is more likely Newcastle's slip-up was a one-off. Manly's, on the other hand, threatens to derail their finals hopes if confidence continues to drop without Trbojevic. Des will have a plan up his sleeve but it doesn't help that they are playing a Knights team equally desperate to prove themselves.

Historic rivals meet in Sunday evening showdown

Coming off poor performances respectively last week, the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs and the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be looking to change their fortunes on Sunday evening.

Showing plenty of effort - but lacking the class to convert into points - the Canterbury-Bankstown Bulldogs will be determined to get off the bottom of the premiership ladder with a win.

Unable to keep up with the Wests Tigers during last Sunday's 34-6 defeat at Bankwest Stadium, coach Dean Pay will be hoping to avoid the club's worst start to a season in 24 years after managing a single win over the first seven rounds.

Losing experienced fullback William Hopoate for up to eight weeks with an ankle injury, the ensuing backline reshuffle sees Dallin Watene-Zelezniak revert to the number one jersey, with Nick Meaney and Christian Crichton coming onto the wings.

Representative prop Dylan Napa will make his 150th appearance in the NRL, while English forward Luke Thompson has been named on an extended bench after expediting his move from St Helens.

Producing one of their worst performances in years during last Thursday's 20-12 loss to Penrith, the South Sydney Rabbitohs will be eager to amend against the competition cellar dwellers.

Winning their past two matches at Bankwest Stadium by big margins, coach Wayne Bennett will be hoping his side can continue a strong run over the blue and whites that has yielded six wins from ten clashes in the years since the 2014 grand final.

Promoting former New South Wales representative James Roberts into the starting side in spite of an underwhelming 21-minute return last week, highly-rated centre Braidon Burns will come off the bench for the third time in his career.

Who to watch: Enduring a turbulent run of injuries and off-field dramas over the past five years, Kieran Foran has shown moments of class since making his way back onto the field. Suffering a serious shoulder injury while representing New Zealand during last year's Lions tour, the 29-year-old playmaker has strengthened the Bulldogs' struggling attack over the past four rounds with two tries and an assist - while serving as an experienced hand to complement Fijian youngster Brandon Wakeham. Earning rave reviews for his performance against the Rabbitohs last season, look for the veteran half to be a prominent figure in the outcome of Sunday's match.

Following in the footsteps of his older brother by transitioning from the halves into the forward pack, Bayley Sironen will be aiming to increase his game time on Sunday evening. Crossing for his first try in the top grade during last Thursday's loss to the Panthers, the 23-year-old utility has shown glimpses of promise since shifting to Redfern from the Tigers last season. Playing alongside current teammates Latrell Mitchell, Tom Amone and Hame Sele in the 2014 Australian Schoolboys team, look for Sironen to showcase his skills with the ball as the Rabbitohs aim to bounce back against their former grand final foes.

Favourite: Averaging 28 points in their three appearances at Bankwest Stadium post-lockdown, the Rabbitohs are expected to have too much strike power for the Bulldogs to contend with.

Tip: While the Bulldogs will try their hardest - as they do every week - the harsh reality confronting the proud club is they simply lack the talent to compete against the likes of Latrell Mitchell, Cody Walker and Damien Cook. Rabbitohs by 18.
