

TRACKING DOWN WHERE SO MUCH OF OUR GREAT GAME WAS BORN

ith this year marking 113 years since rugby league's birth in Australia, this article looks at the most prominent of early locations around Sydney which gave rise to the game we know and love today.

These tour locations are in chronological order, as best as is possible.

The journey, just like rugby league's in Australia, would begin at 108 Market Street, the location of Australian Test cricket legend Victor Trumper's Sportstore, which is where many meetings were held between Trumper, Henry Hoyle, James Giltinan and disgruntled rugby union players, including Alec Burdon, Bob Graves, Arthur Hennessy, Jim Moir, Peter Moir and Jack Feneley.

Moving on to 432-434 George Street, the location of what used to be Bateman's Crystal Hotel, where the New South Wales Rugby League was officially born. It was here that the new game had its first meeting, where Hoyle was elected as President, Giltinan as Secretary and Trumper as Treasurer.



The journey then heads out of the CBD and to 160 St. Johns Road, Glebe, the location of the Glebe Town Hall. It was here that the Glebe club was formed on January 9, 1908, making them the first official team in the game's history. Glebe's formation also brought the Wentworth Park venue across to rugby league. That inaugural meeting saw future Australian Prime Minister Billy Hughes in attendance. He was elected as club patron.

The **Newtown Town Hall** at 1 Bedford Street, Newtown is the next stop. This was where the Newtown club held its first official meeting on January 14, 1908.

There is still plenty of conjecture surrounding the club's actual birth, as many claim that they held their maiden official meeting the day before Glebe.



January 17, 1908 saw the birth of the third club, South Sydney, at the Redfern Town Hall, located at 73 Pitt St, Redfern. The Rabbitohs would go on to become the most successful club in the code's history, winning 21 first grade premierships.

On January 23, 1908, Balmain became the first team to have their entire rugby union club completely switch codes to join rugby league, at a meeting held at the Balmain Town Hall at 370 Darling St, Balmain. The club had been involved in a long running spat with the rugby union, hence their wholehearted commitment to rugby league.



Just 500 metres away from the Sydney Roosters' current home ground, Allianz Stadium, is the **Paddington Town Hall** at 249 Oxford St, Paddington. It was here on January 24, 1908 that the Eastern Suburbs Rugby League

club was formed. They are the only team to have competed in every season of competition, and also boasted the biggest drawcard for the game itself during those pioneering years, Dally Messenger.



On February 4, 1908, Rugby League expanded westward. It was at the **Ashfield Town Hall** on 260 Liverpool Rd, Ashfield that the Western Suburbs Rugby League Club was formed. The building itself now has been modernised entirely, much like the club, which is now represented by the merged entity with Balmain known as Wests Tigers.



Just a few days later on February 7, North Sydney formed a side at the **School Of Arts Hall** on Mount St, North Sydney. The building, just like the club, sadly, has since been demolished.







Their time in the game lasted less than one season. They played their first game on May 9, almost three weeks after the competition had begun and by their eighth and final game of the season, they had to borrow players from opponents North Sydney. Needless to say, Cumberland folded before the end of the year and it would not be until 1947 when Parramatta joined the competition that area was again represented.

In 1910, a team from Annandale was formed at *The Colannade Hall* on 101 Johnston St, Annandale. The club effectively replaced the discontinued Newcastle club, which set off to create their own local

competition. Annandale lasted 11 uneventful seasons before petering out after a winless 1920 campaign.

On February 7, 1921 at the **Kogarah School Of Arts**, on the corner of Queens Ave and Bowns Rd, the iconic St George club formed its first grade side. They had very nearly been admitted as early as 1908. The club holds the record for 11 consecutive premierships (1956-66), a streak unlikely to ever be surpassed.



There were two venues used for the first round of games played on April 20, 1908. The first was the picturesque *Birchgrove Oval*. It was here that South Sydney defeated North Sydney 11-7, followed by Balmain's 24-0 win over Western Suburbs.

The other venue was the previously-mentioned **Wentworth Park**. On April 20, 1908, it saw Eastern Suburbs defeat Newtown 32-16 and local outfit Glebe beat Newcastle 8-5.





The tour then takes a commemorative turn and heads to some cemeteries to pay homage to its four most vital men in its formative years. At the Eastern Suburbs Memorial Park is the final resting place of Dally Meesenger, whose feats on the field wowed crowds around the world.

At Rookwood Cemetery, founder James Giltinan was cremated, while at South Head cemetery lies the great

politician, orator and the League's first boss, Henry Hoyle. Legendary Test cricketer and rugby league's first treasurer Victor Trumper, who passed away tragically aged 37 from Bright's Disease. He lies in Waverley Cemetry.

At the Parliament of New South Wales, located at 6 Macquarie St, Sydney is **a memorial that pays respect to Edward Larkin**, Rugby League's first full time secretary, who was killed at Gallipoli while serving in parliament.



The tour would then make its way to the NRL Museum, at Rugby League Central in Moore Park, where esteemed and brilliant historian Terry Williams could walk you through some of the game's artefacts and many more great stories from the game's history.

# **Match Preview**

### with Lachy MacCorquodale

A depleted South Sydney Rabbitons side hosts the firing Melbourne Storm to open the round on Thursday night.

The South Sydney Rabbitohs will be without Adam Reynolds, Cameron Murray, Campbell Graham and Jaxson Paulo who will all miss a few weeks with their respective injuries. It's hardly a good time for this to occur as the Rabbitohs take on Melbourne, Penrith and Parramatta over the course of the next four weeks.

The Rabbitohs, having just knocked off the Raiders by 14-points, will be looking to bring some of their recent form into this fixture which has seen them win every match since they lost to Melbourne in the opening game of the season. Although, it's worrying for the Rabbitohs that they've conceded 50 points over the past two weekends and that's something that can't continue this weekend. They have managed to outscore their two previous opponents but that'll be a hard task to accomplish against Melbourne, especially if they cough up 20+points as they did in Round one this year. The Rabbitohs still boast Cody Walker, Benji Marshall and Damien Cook, so there is still the chance that they're able to score points, but it's going to be difficult against this Melbourne side.

The aforementioned injuries have forced a backline restructure which sees Alex Johnston move into the fullback role, with Walker shifting back into the halves with Marshall. Braidon Burns returns from injury in Graham's place and Steven Marsters and Taane Milne will start on the wing. Jai Arrow starts at lock for Murray and Tevita Tatola reclaims his spot in the front row.

The Melbourne Storm have been on fire as of late, scoring at least 40 or more points in three of their past four matches. It was a convincing second half display against the Cronulla-Sutherland Sharks on Friday evening which saw the defending premiers pile on 34 points in the final 40 minutes. Harry Grant's inclusion to the side has been immense and the 23-year-old hooker has been dominant in his performances this year especially with star fullback Ryan Papenhuyzen's absence over the past two weeks.

Craig Bellamy's side have once again asserted themselves as premiership contenders despite it being the club's first season since 2002 without future immortal Cameron Smith in the side each week. Players such as Cameron Munster, Papenhuyzen, Grant and Jahrome Hughes have all stepped up to the plate in Smith's absence and they have continued to grow over the start of the season.

Hughes in particular has been in immense form as of late, having score three tries and assisting a further five in his last four appearances. The New Zealand international was immense in Melbourne's 22-point victory over the Warriors on ANZAC Day with four try assists. Hughes will suit up in jersey number seven once again and the Storm will be graced with the return of Nelson Asofa-Solomona and George Jennings, who replace Chris Smith and Dean Ieremia from last week's side.

Who to watch: Thursday night's matchup to watch is the battle between the incumbent State of Origin number nine's. New South Wales' Damien Cook lines up against Queensland's Harry Grant in what is set to be an exciting matchup. Cook's 2021 season has been off to a slow start by his standards, running for only 69 run metres per game, his lowest metres per game average since 2017 and has only recorded two try assists in his eight appearances. Meanwhile, his opposite number has been on fire this season and in his four appearances has assisted four tries whilst running for 88 metres per game, also in limited game time. Grant will start in only his second game of the season this Thursday night after missing the first few weeks with a knee injury, but it's hardly hampered one of the game's top players. 21 NRL matches, is all Grant has to his name but he's playing much like a player who's played upwards of 100. Grant's been very impressive this season and this is the perfect opportunity for Damien Cook to respond to his critics with a superb performance right when his side needs it.

Favourite: Melbourne are the favourites heading into this clash with the injury ravaged Rabbitohs. History is also on Melbourne's side having won the past five matches between the two sides and winning 10 of the past 11 matches between the two. Souths' have only managed to beat the Storm in five of the 35 matches the two clubs have played against each other.

My tip: Melbourne are very hard to go past given the form they're in and the state of the injured Rabbitohs side that has been named. Souths' haven't lost since Round one but I think this will change after this Thursday night. Melbourne just too good. Melbourne by 14.

# **Match Preview**

When he took over as caretaker coach at Cronulla, Josh Hannay said he would not truly know how the playing group would react to the exit of John Morris until after their game against Newcastle.

While there is no saying for sure that the coaching drama has directly led to the group's sudden decline, there is little doubting the team has gone backwards since the news was confirmed.

A lot of it has come down to execution – the final pass in a sweeping backline play being called forward or a finger scraping the touchline in a diving attempt to get the ball down.

Cronulla should have won at least two of their past three games if their execution was slightly better.

Instead, they dropped three-straight matches and find themselves in the bottom four

Cronulla are boosted by the return of Jesse Ramien from a glute injury this week though they will be without Braden Hamlin-Uele who is sidelined with a syndesmosis injury.

Former Panther Matt Moylan is on the extended bench and a chance of overcoming a quad issue.

Moylan has often lifted against his ex-teammates but this is a different Penrith unit to the one he left.

There have been periods in the past three weeks that the Panthers, like Cronulla, have lacked their usual polish in attack.

The only difference is that Penrith have still been able to get the job done and in most cases it has still been relatively comfortable.

Their on-goal defence continues to be the greatest strength though, averaging a league-low 7.5 points against per game.

Last week Penrith leaked the most points they had all year (16) and even still one of those tries came off a wayward pass while another was the product of a fortunate bounce.

Put simply, it will take something special for Cronulla to pull off the upset this week.

Who to watch: Liam Martin came up with the miracle bat back last week to set up the match-sealing try for Penrith against Manly and would have fond memories of his last meeting against Cronulla. Martin terrorised former teammate Moylan, manhandling the Cronulla five-eighth in a standout performance. Starting in the second row, Martin ran for 159 metres, scored a try, set up one and broke the line twice. Viliame Kikau has shown glimpses of fatigue in recent weeks with errors and poor tackle attempts an issue. If Ivan Cleary opts to play Kikau on reduced minutes it will only increase the importance of Martin's work off the bench. The Temora product has provided plenty of impact to put himself in contention as an Origin bolter.

The Panthers looked most troubled last week against Manly when their big men were offloading close to the defensive line, giving the likes of Tom Trbojevic more space and time to roam. While **Jesse Ramien** may not be playing in the forward pack, he could prove a handful for the Penrith defence given his size and strength alone. Add the fact he is averaging the second-most offloads in the league and he shapes as Cronulla's best chance of breaking the relentless Penrith line.

Favourite: The Panthers are heavily backed to continue their streak.

My tip: Once again, complacency is all that stands in the way of Penrith this week. Cronulla do boast a handy backline but the Panthers do too and have an advantage everywhere else. **Penrith by 30**.

# **Match Preview**

An all-top 4 battle takes place on Friday night as the second-placed Parramatta Eels take on the fourth-placed Sydney Roosters side at Bankwest Stadium in Parramatta.

The Eels sit second on the NRL ladder with just the solitary defeat this season which came a few weeks back against the Dragons. The Eels have racked up the points and margins across the past three games with 25, 40 and 22 point victories across the past three games.

Last weekend, the Eels were far from their best as they were big 32-10 winners over the Canterbury Bulldogs at Stadium Australia. The Blue and Gold put the game beyond doubt early in the contest opening up a 16-0 just after the 20-minute mark. The Eels struggled with errors and ill-discipline through the remainder of the first half. The second half for Parramatta was also error riddled but they were able to put on three more tries to take a comfortable victory despite the Bulldogs scoring two quick tries.

Parramatta coach Brad Arthur has named the same 17 as last week despite an injury to Nathan Brown that looked as if it was going to keep him out. Junior Paulo has been named to start after swapping with Oregon Kaufusi last weekend.

Sitting fourth on the NRL ladder, the Sydney Roosters are still managing a mounting injury crisis which took an emotional toll last week following their 38-4 victory over Newcastle which saw a potentially career ending ACL injury to Brett Morris.

The Roosters were impressive during their 38-4 victory where rookie Sam Walker stood up for the Eastern Suburbs side yet again as they dominated a poor Newcastle side. The Roosters dominance showed off early as they ran out to a 22-0 lead within in as many minutes before being kept scoreless until half-time but the damage had been done as they lead 22-4 at the break. The Roosters continued their dominance in the second half and it was the latter stages that broke the Rugby League world's hearts with the injury to Brett Morris.

The Roosters are boosted by the return of James Tedesco from his head knock with Joey Manu replacing Brett Morris in the centres. Lindsay Collins who also suffered an ACL is replaced by Sio Siua Taukeiaho. Sam Verrills has suffered a semi-detached retina with Ben Marschke coming into the starting side.

Who to watch: Ryan Matterson will be a key player for the Eels in his second game back from concussion related issues. Matterson's ball playing will be important as well as his strength and go forward. His attack will be strong and the Roosters need to be on the watch for it.

Angus Crichton has taken on the veteran role in the Roosters forward pack given the injuries that have impacted the tricolours this season. Crichton has been dangerous and needs to keep the level that he showed last weekend against the Knights.

Favourite: The Eels are comfortable favourites on paper but no doubt the game will be closer than what the markets have it on paper.

My tip: I'm tipping the Roosters to win the game; the Eels have been good but there is just something about the Roosters spirit and tenacity that makes me think they can win it. # **Match Preview**

The National Rugby League roadshow heads to a town so nice they named it twice – Wagga Wagga – where two out-of-form sides Canberra Raiders and Newcastle Knights look to get back into the top eight.

Coming into the season, Canberra Raiders were touted as a contender but a combination of form, injuries and results has seen the Green Machine go winless since Round 4. They have had some hard-fought defeats against Rabbitohs and Panthers but also wilted in the North Queensland heat which has seen coach Ricky Stuart lose his cool slightly and embrace the "whinger" tag.

It can't all fall to the coach though. Some of the Raiders side which saw them make the Grand Final in 2019 has fallen out form alongside injuries to key players including Charnze Nicholl-Klokstad hasn't helped their form. The return of George Williams after his late withdrawal and Josh Papali'i from his break is a huge boost for the side.

A huge factor for the Raiders slide has been their second half performances. Canberra look like the Globetrotters in the first half then turn into the Generals after half-time. Stuart might have to keep the side out on the field at the break to keep their mind on the prize and turn around their season starting in Wagga.

Newcastle haven't got started in 2021 – through their results and some horrible injury luck – has the side languishing in 11th spot and the hopes of back-to-back finals appearances slipping away. Having Blake Green added to their injury toll doesn't help with youngster Phoenix Crossland taking the halfback spot alongside Kurt Mann in the musical chairs backline.

The Knights still boast a fearsome forward pack which has kept them in contests but need to match up against another huge pack in the Raiders. David Klemmer, Daniel Saifiti and Tyson Frizell are all experienced heads which will relish the challenge and move themselves into the top eight.

One x-factor for the Knights side is Bradman Best. He has exploded onto the scene since his debut last season and has shown already in 2021 he can turn a game. If he and Kalyn combine, it will help them score more than the one four-pointer they have mustered in the last fortnight.

Who to watch: Josh Papali'i is back into the side after taking a mental health break. The front rower is the leader of the Raiders formidable pack. Against the Knights pack which boosts some heavy artillery so have to push through against them. Sebastian Kriss has done well deputising in the centres or back row this season and the master of the sea with another strong performance might make waves and take the centre spot for himself.

It hasn't been the best last month for the Knights. Injuries and form have them in 11th position. With the injury to Blake Green, much more of the onus falls to star fullback **Kalyn Ponga** to get them out of the mire. Ponga has shown flashes of his brillance thus far in 2021 and against a tough Raiders side needs to turn the spotlight bright.

Favourite: Two sides that are in terrible form but the Raiders brought back some big names so they will take the slight favourite tag to Wagga.

2015 feels like a lifetime ago for Queensland rivals

The North Queensland Cowboys and the Brisbane Broncos will face off on Saturday evening in an all Queensland affair at Queensland Country Bank Stadium.

Showing tremendous improvement over the past month after beginning the year with four dispiriting losses, the North Queensland Cowboys will be determined to make amends for a costly opening last Sunday.

Trailing by 20 points at halftime before rallying in the second half to ultimately go down 24-20 to the Warriors on the Central Coast, coach Todd Payten will be stressing the importance of starting strongly and maintaining intensity throughout the course of 80 minutes.

Holding a strong record against the Broncos in Townsville with eight wins from their previous 12 fixtures over the past decade, the match will serve as the first time the Queensland rivals have faced off on a Saturday night during the homeand-away season since 2006.

Recalling Newcastle-bound halfback Jake Clifford in place of Ben Hampton (pectoral), Javid Bowen will make his comeback for the club in place of Justin O'Neill in the centres.

Producing the biggest comeback in the club's history to record a much-needed win last week, the Brisbane Broncos will be hoping to post back-to-back wins for the first time since the season shutdown 12 months ago.

Trailing the Titans 22-0 after 15 minutes only to run away with a 36-28 victory at home last Friday, coach Kevin Walters will be hoping his team's newfound confidence inspires further victories.

Playing spoilers at the opening of Queensland Country Bank Stadium last year with a 28-21 victory, the Broncos hold a slender lead winning six of their past 11 clashes against the Cowboys in the years following the 2015 Grand Final.

Keeping the faith with the squad that got the job done last week, the match will see halfback Tyson Gamble play consecutive matches in first grade for the first time in his career.

Who to watch: Enjoying a resurgence in the latter stages of his career, premiership-winning hooker Jake Granville has thrived under the coaching of Todd Payten this season. Transitioning out of the starting side to play an impact role similar to the one that started his career in Brisbane almost a decade ago, the 32-year-old Rockhampton junior has averaged 30 minutes of game time but made his presence felt. Providing bursts of energy against tiring defences and a knack for exposing opponents close to the try line, look for Granville to cause plenty of headaches for the Broncos on Saturday evening.

Enjoying a breakout season in a team that had little to celebrate last year, Broncos forward Patrick Carrigan has had a lesser, but nonetheless important, impact during the opening third of 2021. Averaging 126 metres and 35 tackles in just under an hour of game time each week, the 23-year-old stand-in captain has benefitted from the reduced workload under coach Kevin Walters after bearing the brunt of an underperforming side last year. Set to oppose Jason Taumalolo in the battle of the lock-forwards, Carrigan will be determined to get the better of his opposite number as the Broncos push to move within striking distance of the top eight.

Favourite: While a poor opening half left a lot to be desired last week, the form shown by the Cowboys over the past month has the home side favoured to come away with two points on Saturday evening.

My tip: With both teams starting poorly before finishing with a surge last week, the side that plays with the greatest consistency over the course of 80 minutes should claim bragging rights in the Queensland derby. North Queensland by 2.

Resurgent Manly look to fix blip on the radar against Warriors

After putting up a good fight last week, the Manly Sea Eagles were ultimately outclassed by the Panthers, while the Warriors started fast but only just held on against the Cowboys.

Despite the loss, Manly fans will be pleased by their side showing that they currently have the ability to at least hang with the best teams in the competition. With Tom Trbojevic in the side, it is clear that Manly are capable of making the finals, something which was considered a pipe dream just 4 weeks ago.

The Warriors, on the other hand, have been true to historical form and not shown any consistency whatsoever throughout the season. The week after a resilient win against the Dragons, they got smashed by the Storm in a game where coach Nathan Brown bizarrely appeared to concede that he didn't think they were capable of winning. They will be looking to move on from their poor second half last week, which nearly saw them give up a 24-point lead to the Cowboys.

In team news, Josh Aloiai has unfortunately been ruled out for 3 months due to a wrist injury. Sean Keppie has been named to start in the front row for Manly, with Olakau'tau also moving to start in jersey number 11. Moses Suli is set to make his return via the interchange, while Zac Saddler comes into the 17 for Martin Taupau, who is out with a concussion.

For the Warriors, Eliesa Katoa will make his first appearance since Round 5, replacing Ben Murdoch-Masila who also suffered a head knock last week. Other than that, they are unchanged, although Chanel Harris-Tavita has been named in the reserves and is a chance of returning from injury.

Despite the close score-line, the game was a dour affair, with both sides struggling to form any attacking shape and looking extremely fatigued after about 60 minutes. Who to watch: It goes without saying, but the key difference to the Manly side this week and the Manly side in Round 5 is **Tom Trbojevic**. Sunday will be his first game back at LottoLand since Round 19 last year, where he unfortunately reinjured himself against the Titans. Walsh ran for 103 metres off 10 runs and assisted one try while making 2 tackle breaks. The Warriors struggled for points in Round 5, however if Walsh maintains his strong form that shouldn't be an issue this week or in the future.

Favourite: Manly are favoured by exactly 6 points over the Warriors for this one.

My tip: All signs point to a Manly win in this one, so with that in mind I'm going to say the Warriors will win. **Warriors by 10**.

# **Match Preview**

Canterbury-Bankstown travel to Netstrata Jubilee Stadium for the second time in three weeks, this time for a Sunday afternoon showdown with the St George Illawarra Dragons.

The Dragons come into this clash on the back of three straight losses, the latest one making the Wests Tigers look like absolute world beaters. They haven't looked likely since beating Parramatta in Round 5, and being crowned April Premiers by the usual suspects in the microwave media.

The Bulldogs come into this fresh off a loss to Parramatta, where the Eels barely needed to break a sweat to win comfortably. So after finally winning a game two weeks ago, the Canterbury fans suddenly changing their tune to "we love Barrett", "trust the process", "the future is bright"... all it took was a loss in a game that they were always going to lose to bring it right back to "sack everyone", "no direction", "we're never going to win another game ever again".

Everyone involved with both these teams need to discover a sense of perspective. Rome wasn't built in a day, these are two new coaches who need to rebuild their teams after years of failure and poor management.

OK I'll get off my high horse now.

In team news, Tyrell Fuimaono comes in for the Dragons to replace the injured Zac Lomax at centre. Poasa Faamausili has been named on the interchange. Cody Ramsey has been named and will be given every chance to play, however Mathew Feagai is waiting in the wings as a reserve to come in if needed.

## **Broncos stunning fightback downs the Titans**

Brisbane have registered their second win of the season after at one stage being down by 22 points in an extraordinary game of rugby league at Suncorp Stadium tonight to win 36-28 over the Titans.

The Broncos were simply blown off the park by their neighbours early conceding four Titans tries before running riot from the back end of the first half to score 6 tries in the definition of a see-sawing affair. Brisbane fullback Jamayne Isaako was the standout for the visitors, amassing 24 points which included 2 tries and 2 assists in a career best performance. Big name forwards Payne Hass and Tevita Pangai were also outstanding for the home side and laid the platform for a potentially season defining win.

Alarm bells will now be ringing for the Titans coaching staff, with the side now having leaked 112 points in the past 3 weeks. # Walker's stock rises as Roosters ravage Knights

It was then that the Roosters' injury crisis deepened - already missing a swathe of key players, both Collins and Brett Morris hobbled off in the last ten. The medical department at Bondi will no doubt have their work cut out for them ahead of their side's visit to Bankwest Stadium next Friday.

Newcastle on the other hand will need to regroup before heading out west - south-west in fact, as they visit the Raiders' home-away-from-home in Wagga Wagga next Saturday afternoon. While another loss isn't ideal, they're certainly still within reach of the eight and will want to take advantage of a Raiders side who are also struggling for form.

# OUR REPORT with LACHY MACCORQUODALE **Doueihi masterclass as the Tigers knock off the Dragons**

Adam Doueihi was at the centre of it all as the Wests Tigers recorded their first win since Round 3 today, downing the Dragons 16-8 at WIN Stadium.

The Tigers proved to be too good in the end for St George Illawarra on Sunday afternoon in Wollongong. It was a game in which the Dragons would've been expecting to come away with the two points, especially given the Tigers performance last week against the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles. The loss extends the Dragons' current losing streak to three games now and they'll view it as a missed opportunity to establish themselves in sixth place and now are on the same points as the seventh placed Warriors.

It was the perfect start for the home team, with rookie winger Cody Ramsey scoring in the eighth minute. The try would've had Tigers' fans moaning all over the country and preparing for what looked like it was going to be another tough afternoon for the joint venture. The Tigers looked non-threatening in the opening half. An earlier penalty goal allowed the Dragons to lead by six for the first twenty-odd minutes of the clash until the

Tigers struck back thanks to a nice bit of work from David Nofoaluma, who batted back a Luke Brooks bomb to Tommy Talau, who strolled over untouched to level the scores. It only took the Dragons five minutes after that to take back the lead, after the ill-disciplined Tigers gave another penalty away in front of their goals which Corey Norman converted with ease. The remainder of the half was quite underwhelming and to be honest. wasn't the greatest half of football we've seen this year nonetheless the Dragons entered break with a two point lead. It did feel like they'd missed an opportunity to pile more points on the Tigers who coughed the ball up five times and gave away a further six combined penalties and set restarts. St George Illawarra also failed to capitalise on the wind that they were playing with behind their back and it felt like they've left the door open for the visitors to come back in the second half.

The second half began in empathic fashion for the Tigers, who thought they'd scored earlier on in the half through debutant Zac Cini but it was ruled a knock-on in the aerial contest. The Red V did

well to hang on at stages during the second half, but the away team were too strong through the middle, thanks to their outside backs and an extremely good 20-minute stint from Thomas Miakele who ran for 68 metres - half of those post-contact - and was able to offload twice whilst also breaking two tackles. The Dragons had no answers for the Tigers once they'd taken the lead, and where the visiting side were able to clean up their act in the second half, the Dragons failed to do so - making eight errors and giving away five penalties in the second half.

It wasn't until the 65th minute when Joey Leilua scored for the Tigers that it felt like the game was out of reach for the home side. Daine Laurie did a brilliant job to isolate Leilua one-on-one with Jack Bird in their own 10 metres and Leilua shrugged Bird's attempted tackle as he cruised over to extend the Tigers lead. The successful conversion made it a two score lead which seemed to be enough to put the Dragons to bed. Ahead by eight, they managed the game well in the closing stages, Luke Brooks able to come up with a repeat set late in the game and Doueihi was excellent kicking into the corners. In context, it's big win for the Tigers which will get them excited for their clash with the Gold Coast next weekend. Meanwhile the Dragons host the Bulldogs on Sunday afternoon at Kogarah as they hope to end their current three game losina streak.
